Definition of community service: an unpaid service for the benefit of the public

What constitutes Community Service for the purpose of this application?

We will not count:

- Babysitting younger siblings
- Yard work for parents
- Being a confirmation sponsor
- Visiting grandparent in a nursing home
- Going on a vacation with a family as the babysitter
- Fundraisers for your sports team (or dance, band, chorus, etc.)
- Working at parents' business (even if unpaid)
- Dance or karate assistant if done in exchange for reduced tuition or other monetary benefit
- Participation in a school club/extra-curricular activity (unless it is an activity that is benefiting others, see the first point below.)

Yes, we will count:

- Service you gave as part of another group (ex: youth group service projects, eagle scout or silver/gold award or other scout project hours, team service projects, PIG hours, etc.)
- Helping with fundraisers for a non-profit group or benefit for someone who is ill
- Walk or run for a cause, both the time getting pledges and the time spent walking or running

Some examples of the community service given by NHS members in previous years:

- Church involvement: helper at Vacation Bible School, church nursery, church festivals, as an altar server, hospitality committee, teaching religious education, mission work, office help, singing in the choir, playing in the band.
- Scouting projects: assisting younger troop, aide at summer camp (unpaid)
- Reading to children in the elementary or intermediate school
- Coaching a youth sports team or a summer sports camp (unpaid)
- Highway clean up
- Peer tutoring
- Work as volunteer swim instructor
- Volunteer (unpaid) at the American Red Cross, Special Olympics, a fire dept., Meals on Wheels, American Heart Association, NYS School for the Blind, LPGA, Food Link, Ronald McDonald House, Matthew's Closet, Camp Good Days, FIRST Lego League mentor, United Way, a library, a nursing home or senior center, NYSSMA festival, Lollypop Farms, YMCA, ARC, Relay for Life, Guiding Eyes for the Blind, Rochester Museum and Science Center, Salvation Army, a hospital, Toys for Tots, a preschool or daycare center, Habitat for Humanity, Flower City Work Camp, the school bookstore, track meets, and many others.
