


Foreword

Class History

Also in sports, four sophomores were on the Tornado football squad. They were: Otha Fields, Bill Hader, John Beeson, and Charlie Thurston. Judy LeClere was the only sophomore cheerleader.

As "Juvenile Juniors", we elected Phil Logan President with Sharon Bonham and Jolayne Kraft as his helpers. David Seaton was also our

candidate for King Kay VII, along with being Vice-President of the Student Council. The Junior Play, "Father Knows Best" will be remembered as one of the best. The Junior-Senior Reception and Prom furnished the Seniors with the mystic theme of Candyland. 


TRACK






TRADITION






The Golden Breeze team consisting largely of Sophomores also racked up an impressive season with 14 games won - 3





The TORNADO-S.E.K. CO-CHAMPIONS

The 1956-1957 cagers might have been termed "the surprise team of the year." Winning 16 and losing 3 in regular season play.

With the loss of five of last year's S.E.K. co-champions including the high scoring Al Tate-Coach Cliff Currier and local fans felt that Coffeyville was in for just a so-so season especially after the Tornado dropped its second game, this, to the Indy Bulldogs 63-61. From here on the round-ball men went on to post a 14 win 2 loss record sharing the league crown with the Parson's Vikings.

Along the route the C.H.S. five dropped three strong teams from larger cities-Wichita East, Joplin, and Hutchinson. For the second straight year Parson's edged the Tornado on their home court for the

right to represent this area in the state tournament,
The Viking margin for these two games was a

total of four points.

Vencent Knight broke the school scoring record twice, dunking in 41 points against Parsons and 45 counters in the second Indy game. He and Charlie Thurston were named co-captains for this past year's very successful basketball teams. They also made the AII-S.E.K. team with Otha Fields receiving honorable mention.





Pansy Football Squad







DEBATE






