






This year the staff of the 1963 Twister set out to put together a yearbook of which students, faculty and patrons could be proud.

Mr. Neis has taught Government both in summer school and the regular term. He has also been Field Kindley's athletic director since the early 1930's.


With his classes, "Mose" has instilled a spirit of eagerness to learn more about our treasured republic and how our government sustains it. The perserverence with which he has taught






In clothing classes, the girls learn to make their wearing apparel at an inexpensive cost.






Field Kindley's physical education program shows the concern of the educators and leaders of our community and nation in the well-being of our youth.


Looks To Busy Year




Looks To Show Business
