
A newly organized club for boys was created at Field Kindley this year. Many enthusiastic sponsors are always ready to help create spirit for our teams and other organizations.



The club ordered new gold jackets with purple tornado's on them. These jackets make it easy for every boy to be pointed out as a member.






halls and by having short skits at pep assemblies before each big game.

It was a very good year, one that will last in their hearts forever.






With Music My Uplift




Kindness Works Simply















If the SKY Is Your LIMIT,
