



Marshall, and Jeff Singer.







Coach, Advisor, and Teacher, Sappenfield Retires



The 1971 Twister is dedicated with pride to a man who has devoted his life to young people. Harold Sappenfield, debate coach and yearbook sponser, is a man who has given many hours, both in and out of class, to his students. And yet he has remained essentially out of the limelight, prefering to let his kids take the full credit, modestly attributing his successes not to himself, but to his pupils.

Mr. Sappenfield's outstanding teaching career began with his graduation from Kansas State University at Manhattan with a degree in Journalism, and graduate work done at the University of Southern California. He has taught in Kansas for 36 years, 32 of which have been spent in Coffeyville. For 24 years he has sponsored the editing of the Tornado Times, and for 22 he has been yearbook mentor. Since becoming debate coach his teams have won countless trophies and carried home the State Championship in 1964. In 1962, '63, and '64 his toungsters won the Sweepstakes trophy, giving them perman-




Small Orchestra Makes Big Music






Robed Choir Sings Out




The mixed choir did an excellent job performing at assemblies this year. Led by Mr. Finney they also engaged in a tour of out of town schools in which they were very successful.

in the season, Pile and Adrian Morgan brought home the second place trophy from the Winfield Invitational.




Baseball's Beginnings


Swimmers Break Even






NADO Wrestlers Place High In First League Season


