# FAST FUN!

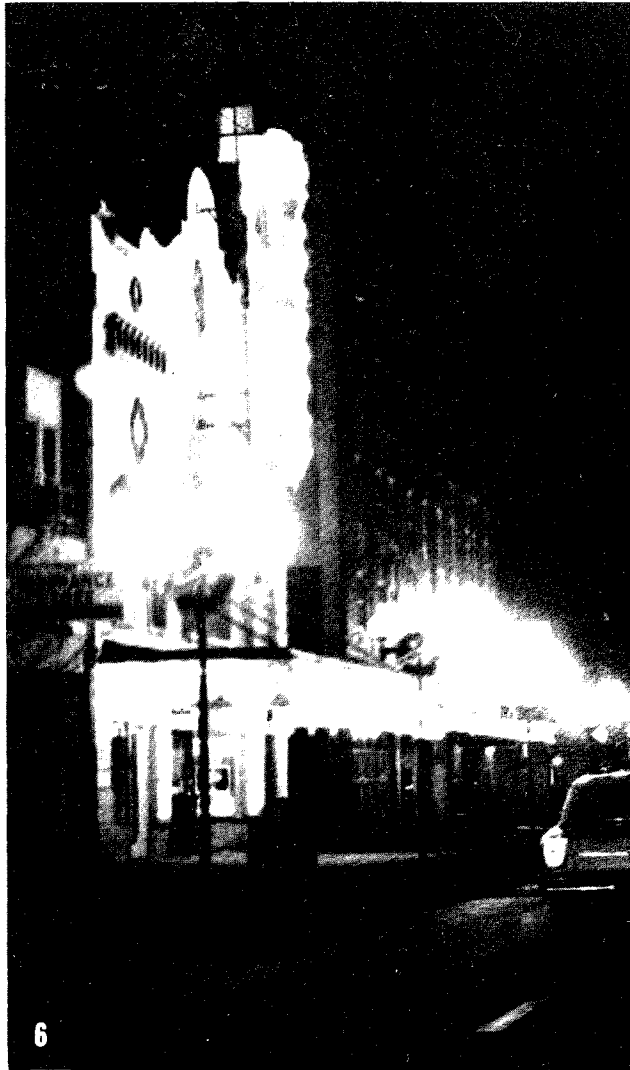

# Students gain experience from jobs

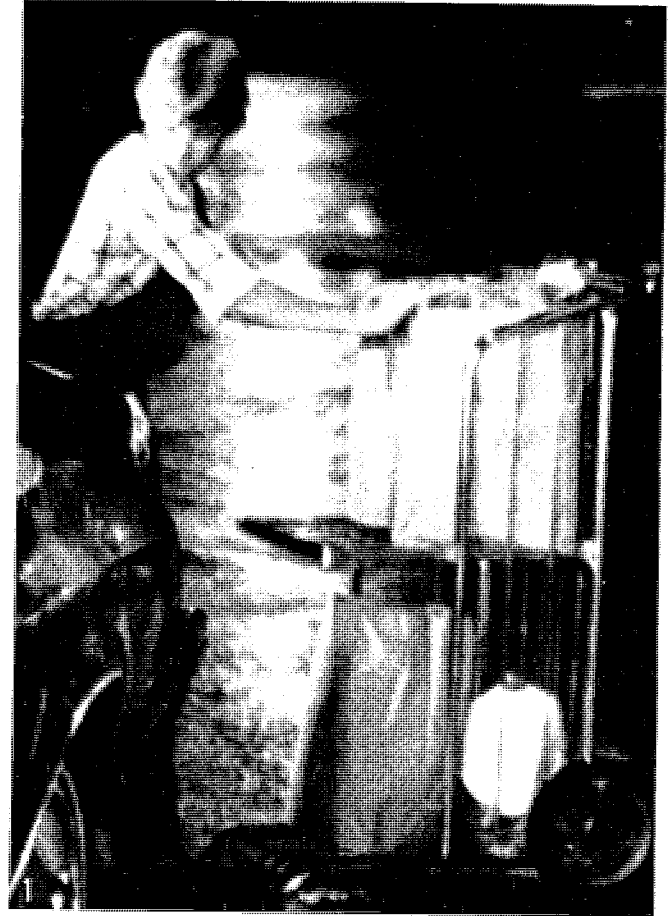

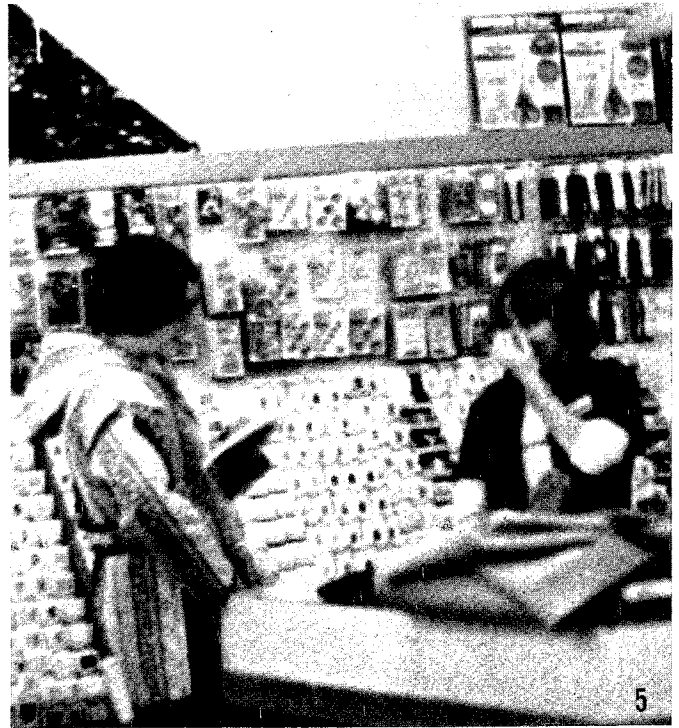

The FKHS trades classes, taught by instructors Jim Templeton and Ernie Harkins, got a taste of the construction life this year as they learned the techniques of building a house.

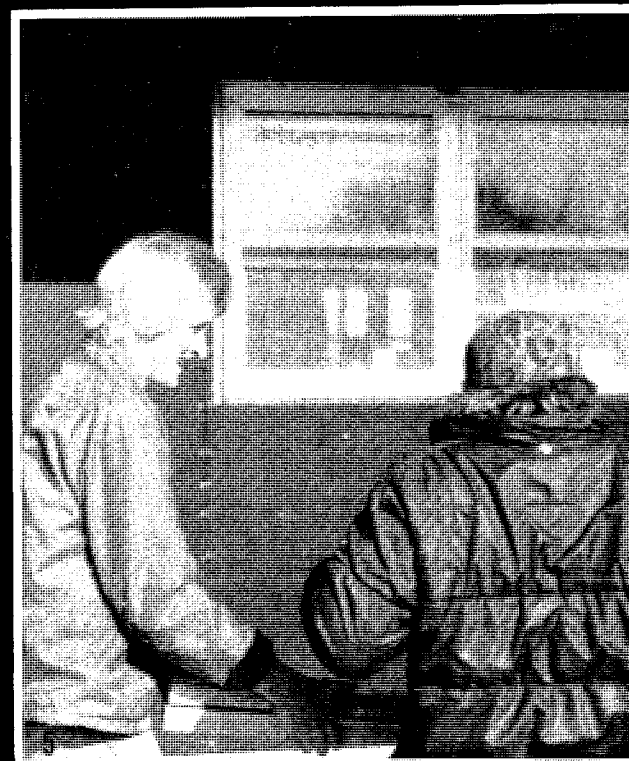
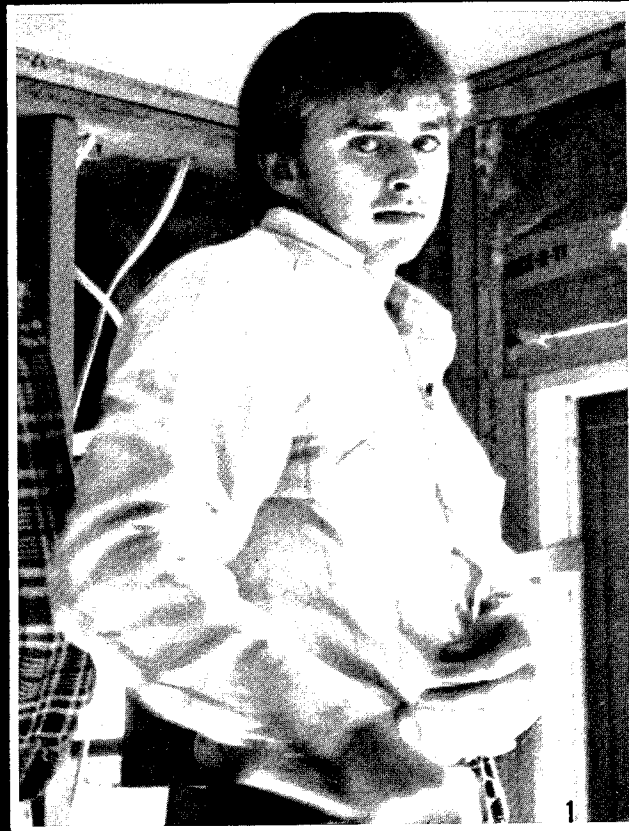

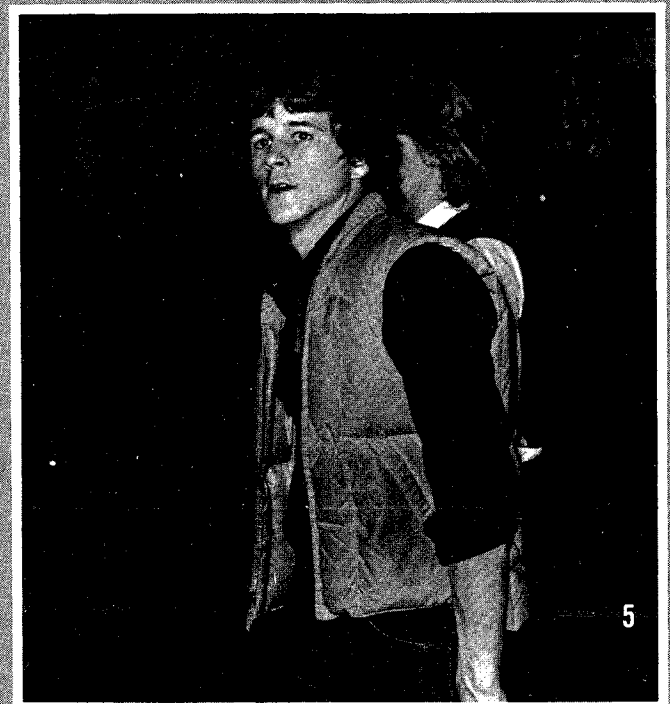
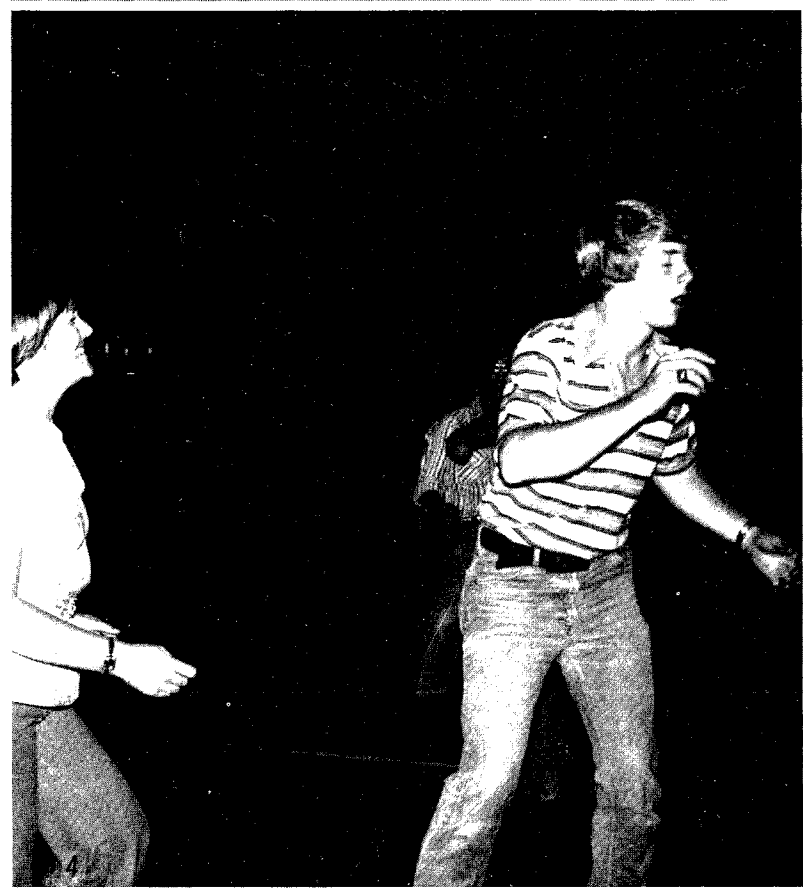
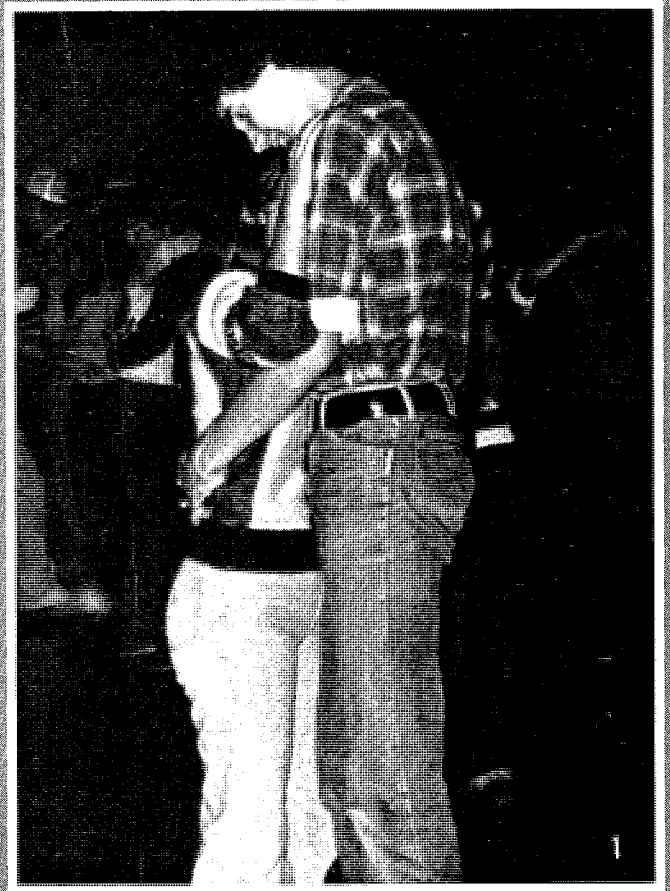
# I love the night life, I've got to boogie!

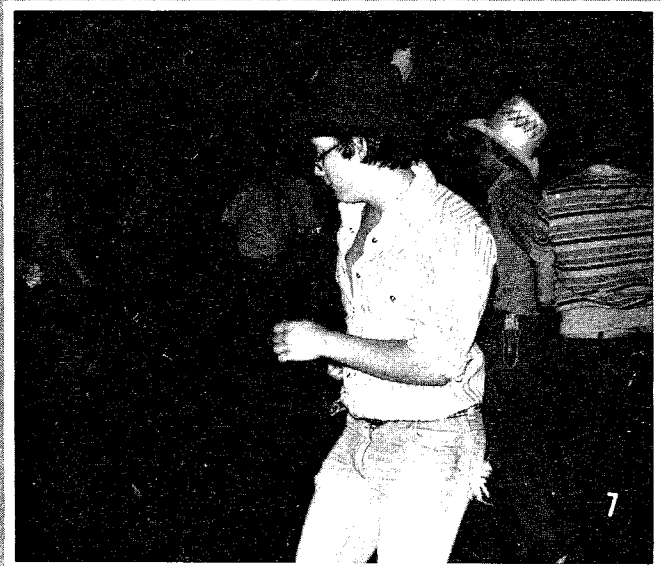
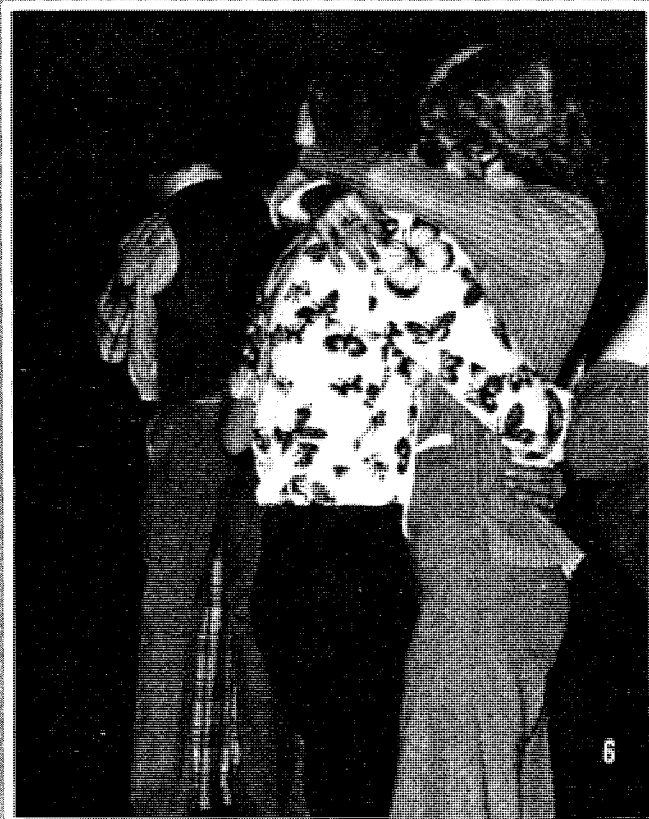
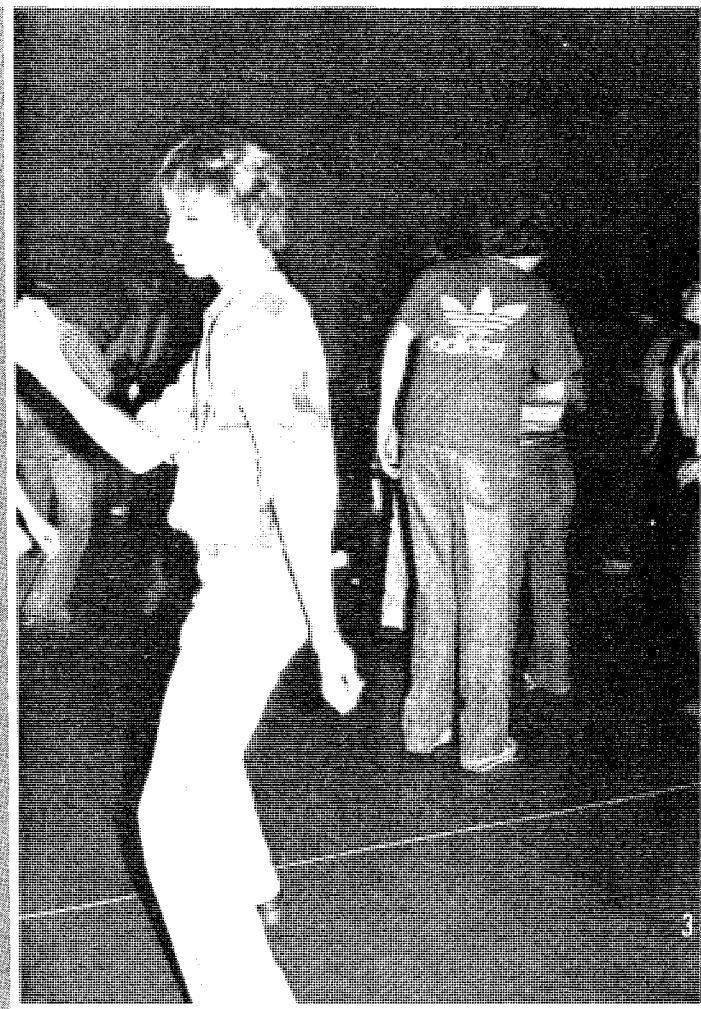
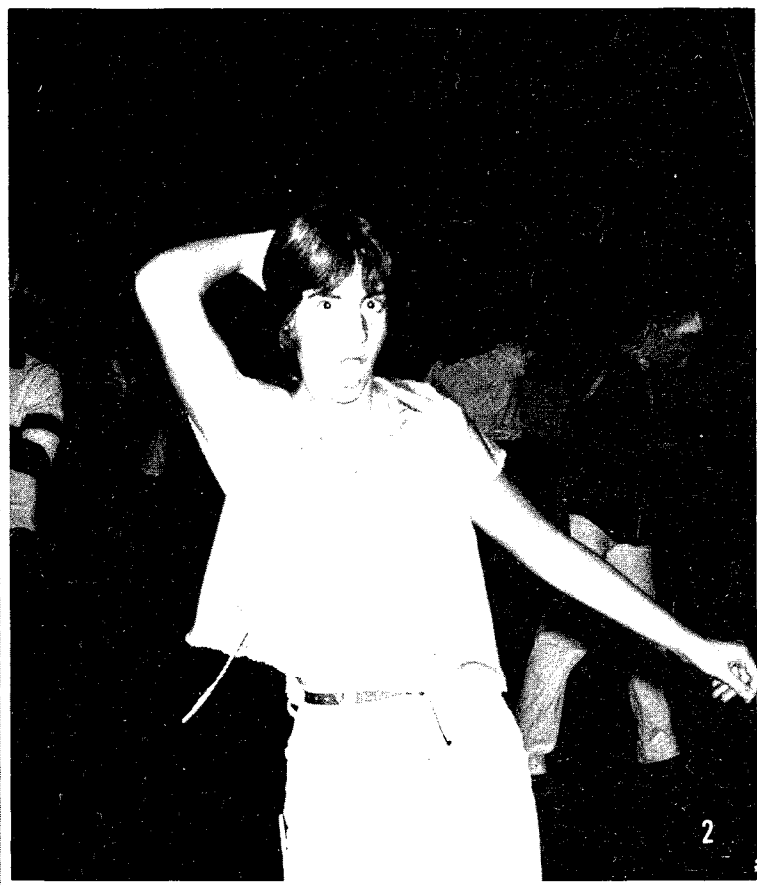

Activities director Doug Lee handled much of the tournament arrangements and was assisted by vice-principal Harold Thomas and other faculty members.





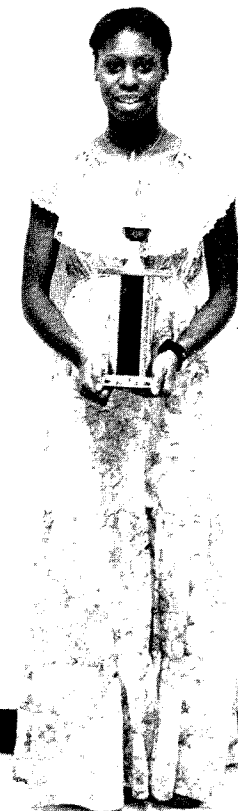

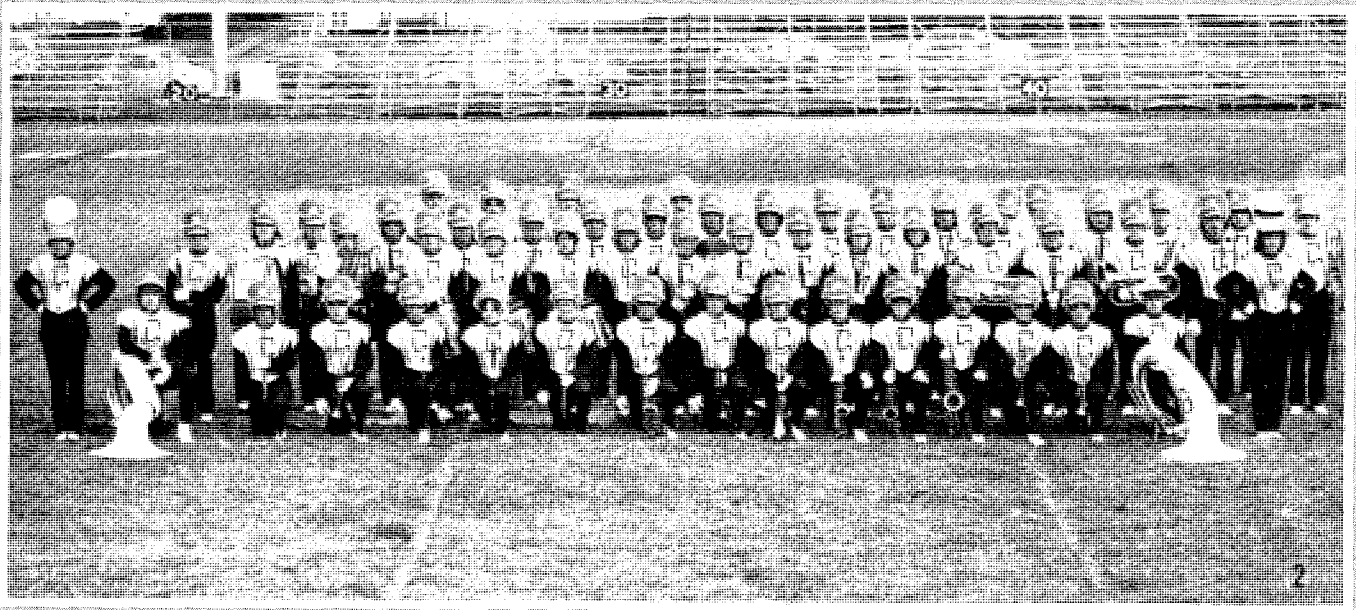
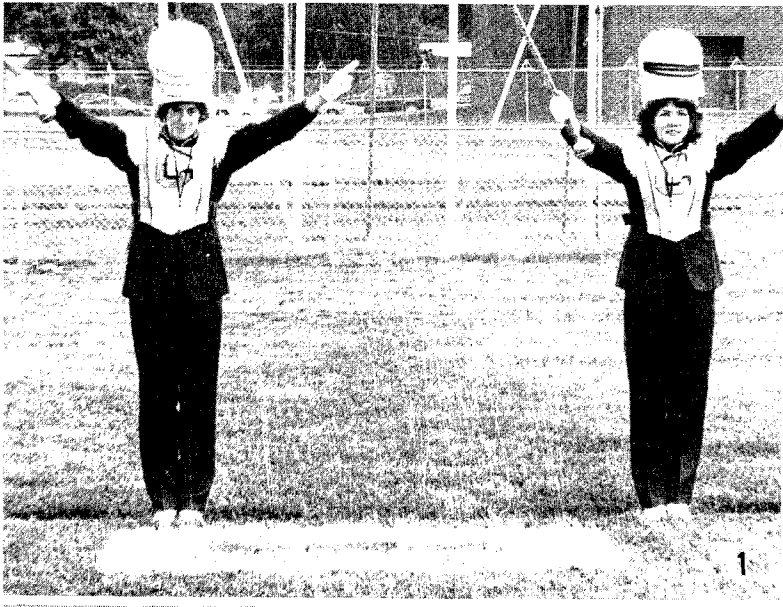
# Band has great season

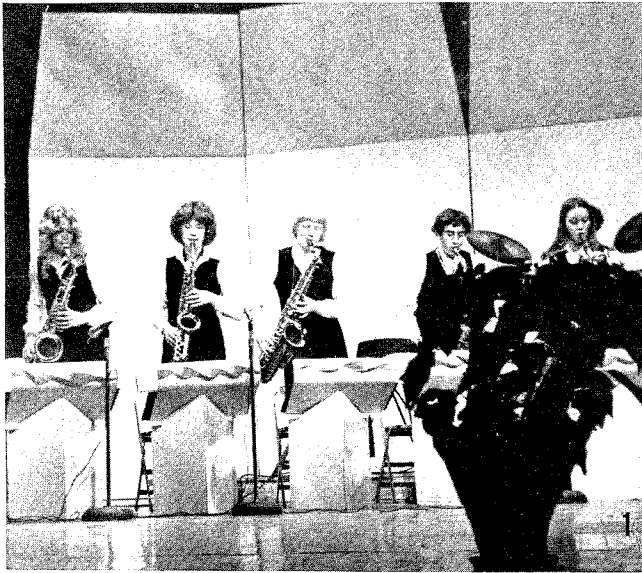
This spring, the band was involved in contest at Pittsburg, and they presented many concerts throughout the term.

The group performed at an insurance convention earlier in the year, the "Annual Christmas Show" on December 12, and attended various jazz festivals in Wichita and Oklahoma.

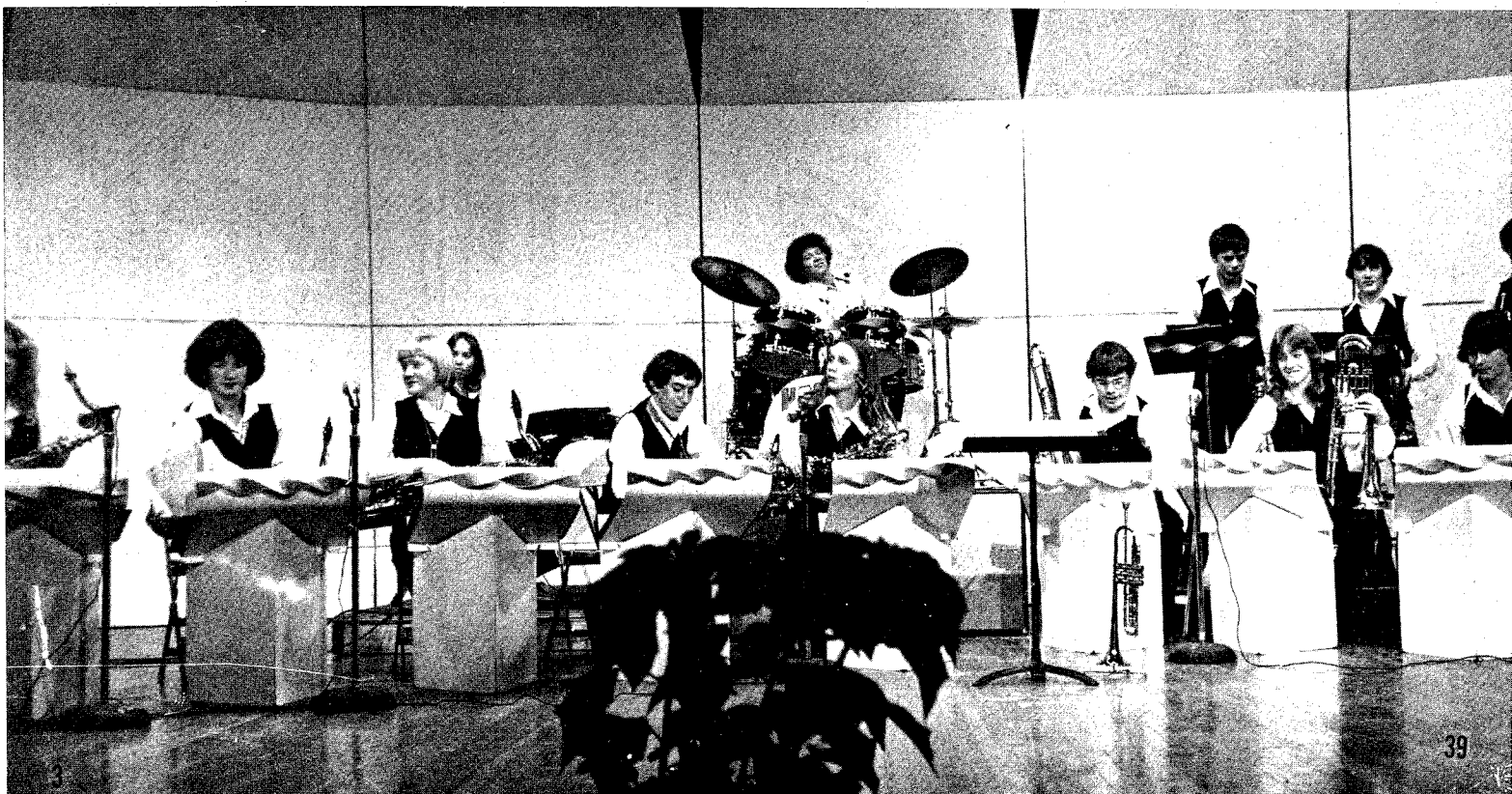
"Jazz work is hard," stated Lori Little, lead tenor sax, "but when you love something that much, it's really hard to give it up!"

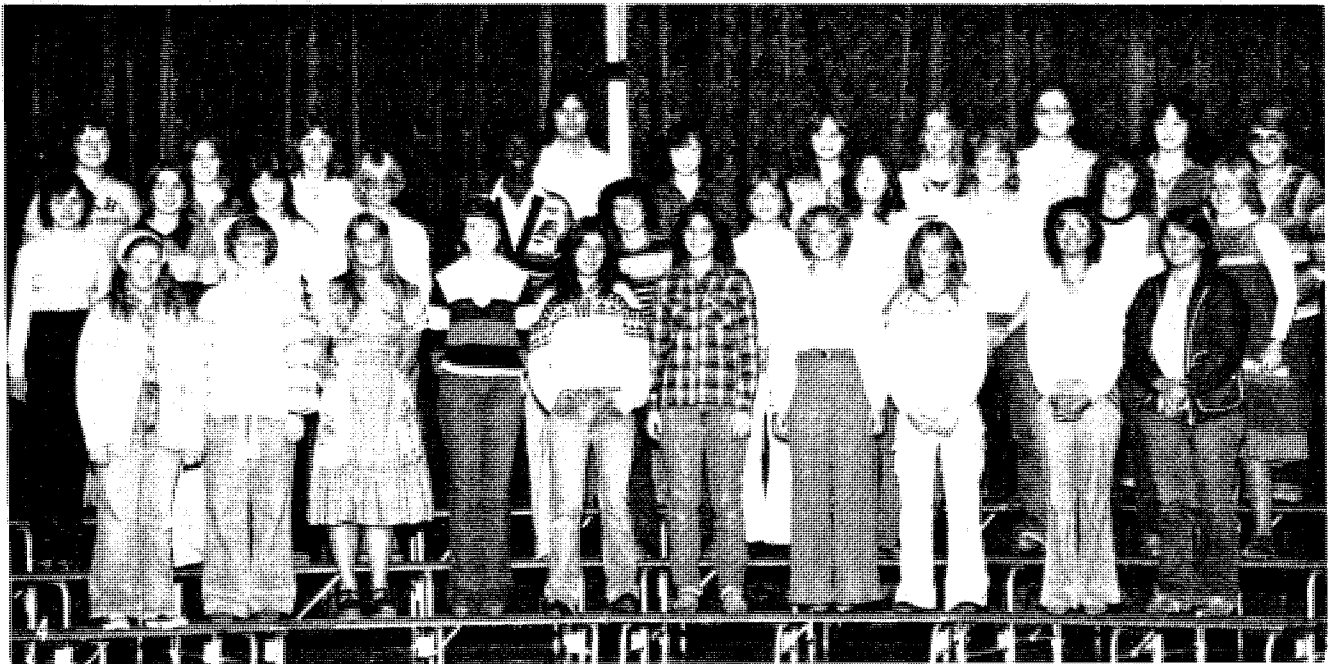
# Choral Club vocalizes.

# Kayettes have fun-filled year.

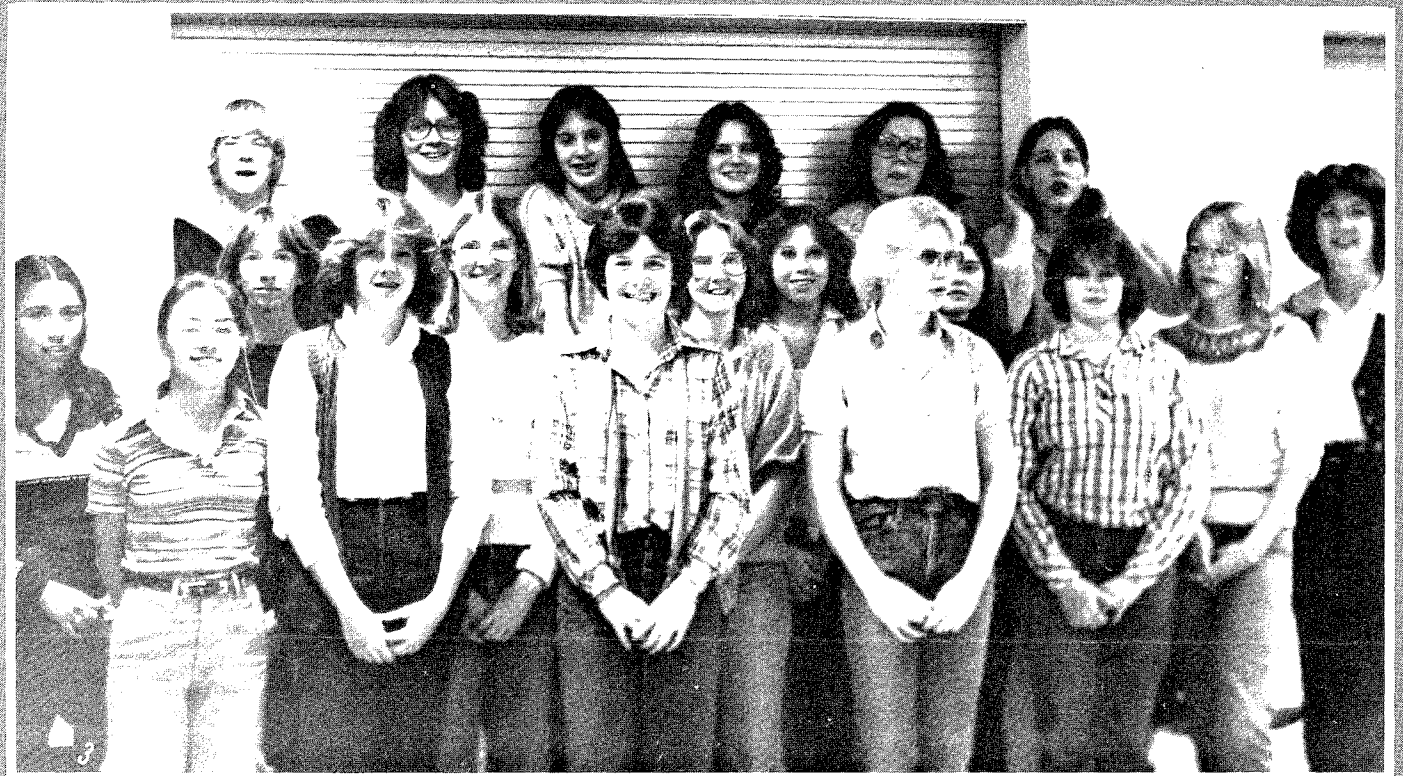
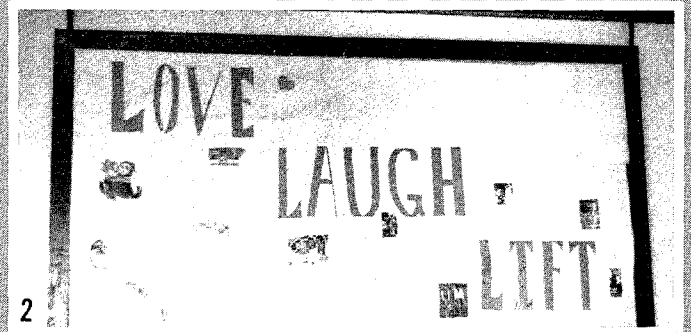

"Love, Laugh and Lift" was the theme for the organization. Senior president Ann Augustine said, "I thought this year was a good year for involvement within the club."

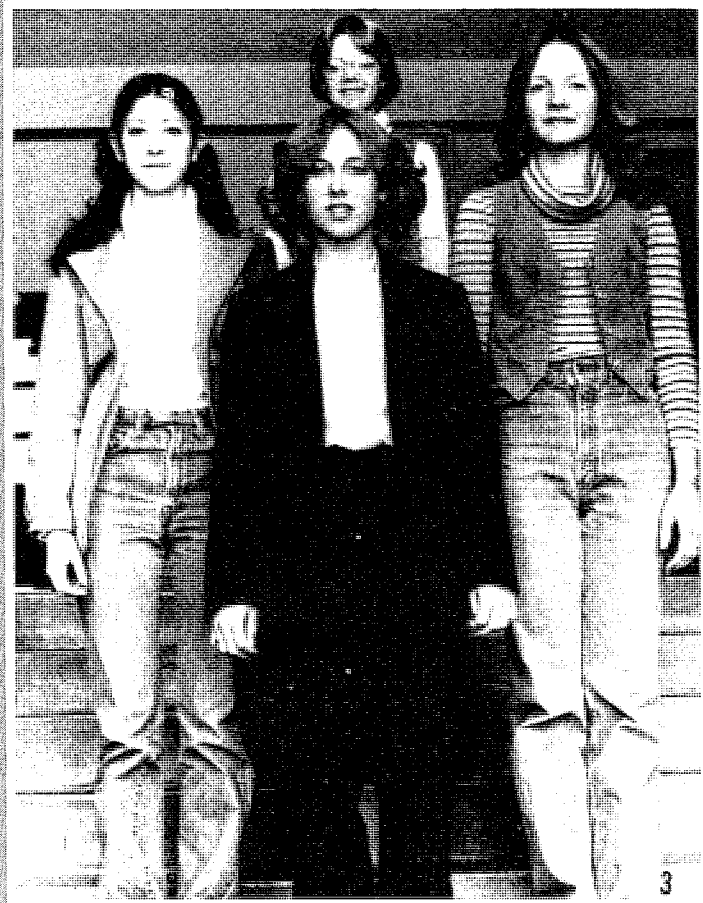

NHS had many good speakers such as Lee Ann Hunt, Community Ambassador, and a representa-

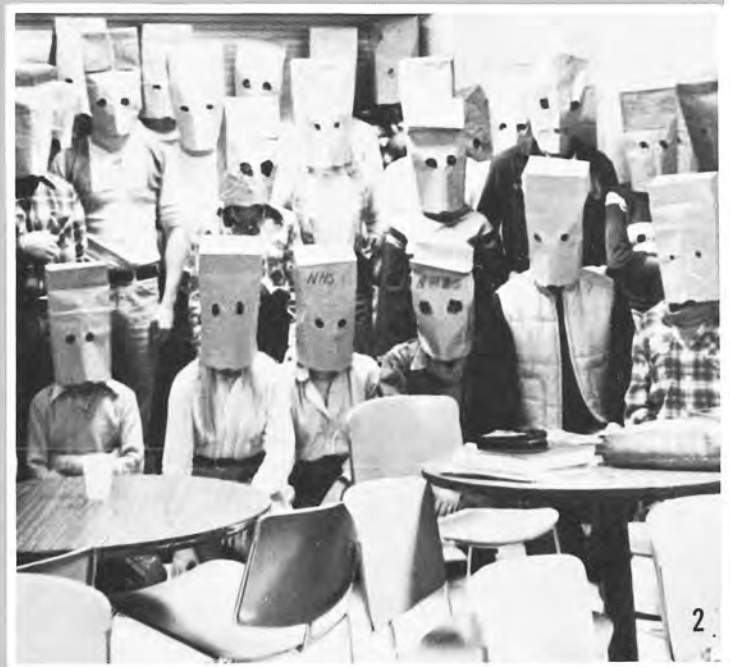
tive from the Brown Mackie College, present educational programs during their meetings. College and career films were also viewed during the meetings.

During the summer, the pom-pom girls worked hard to earn money that was later used to buy new uniforms. They had numerous bake sales, doughnut sales and one car wash.

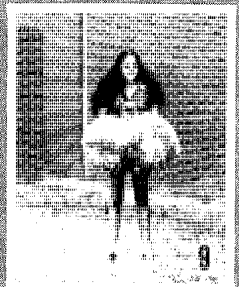
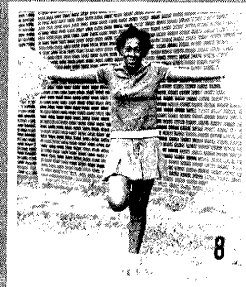
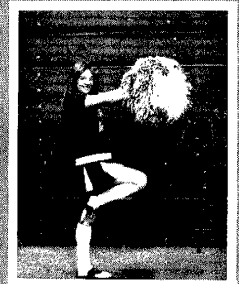
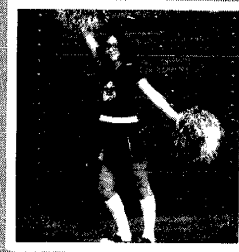

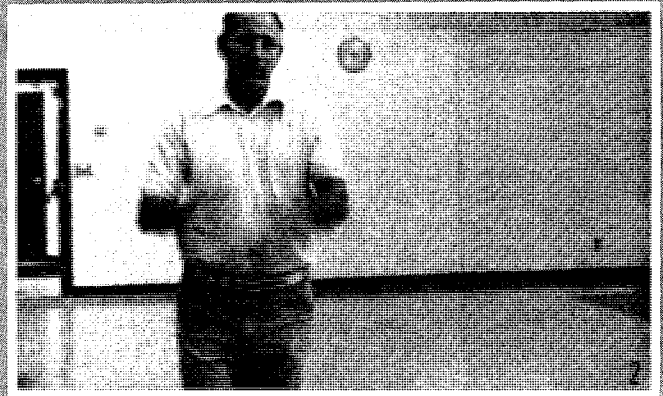


# FCA has fun-filled year!

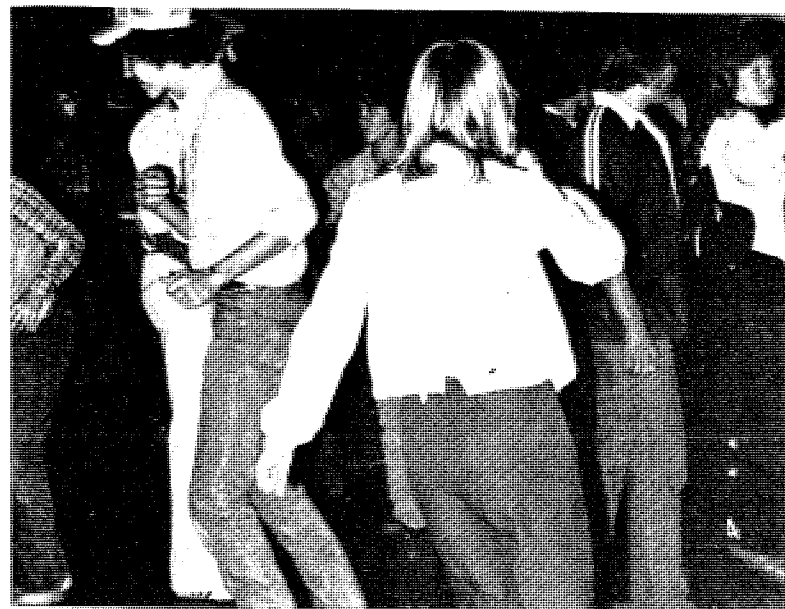


## Stuco sells spirited pompons!

# Speech masters impress first-year instructor.

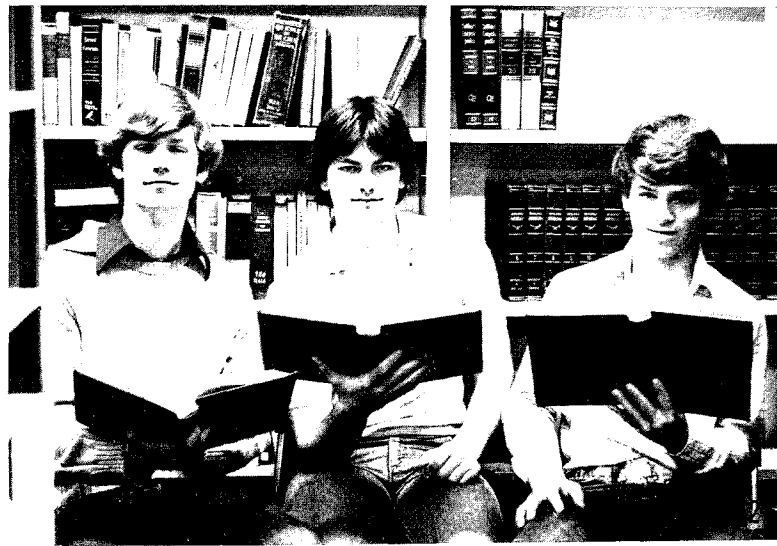

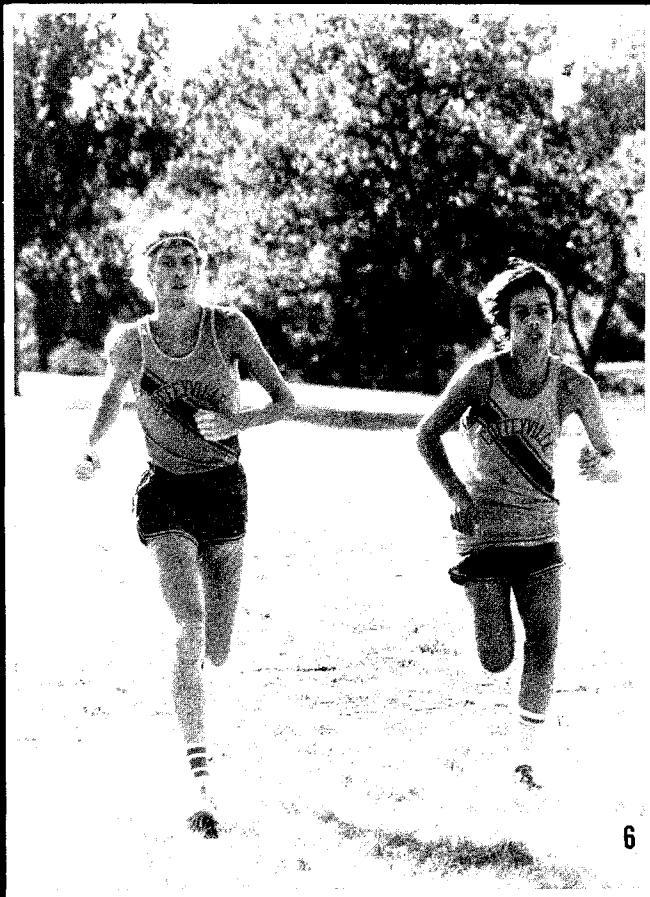

Coffeyville's Golden Tornado football squad traveled a "prevailing trail" to the State play-offs, but took a wrong turn and missed its goal by one controversial play.

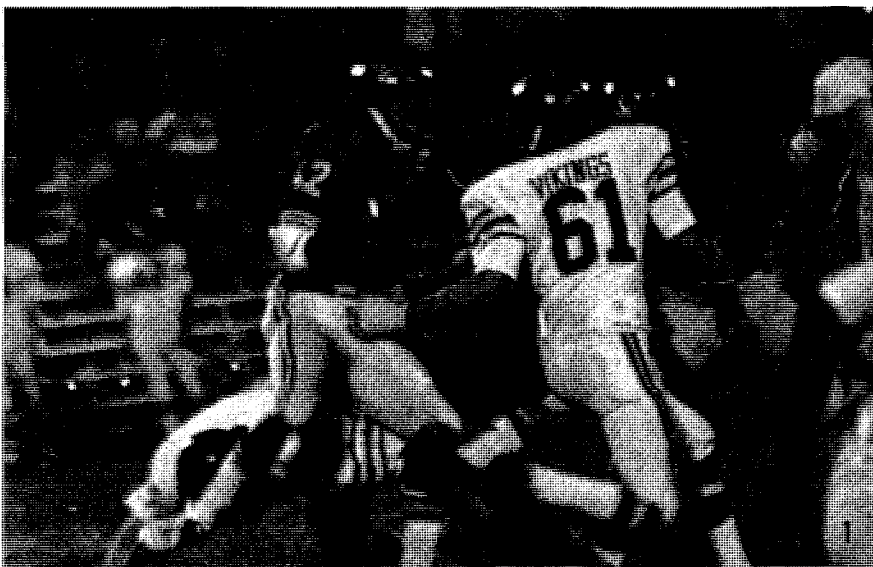

At the Parsons Triangular, the team won all the singles matches. The girls beat Parsons, 6-3, and Fort Scott, 5-1.

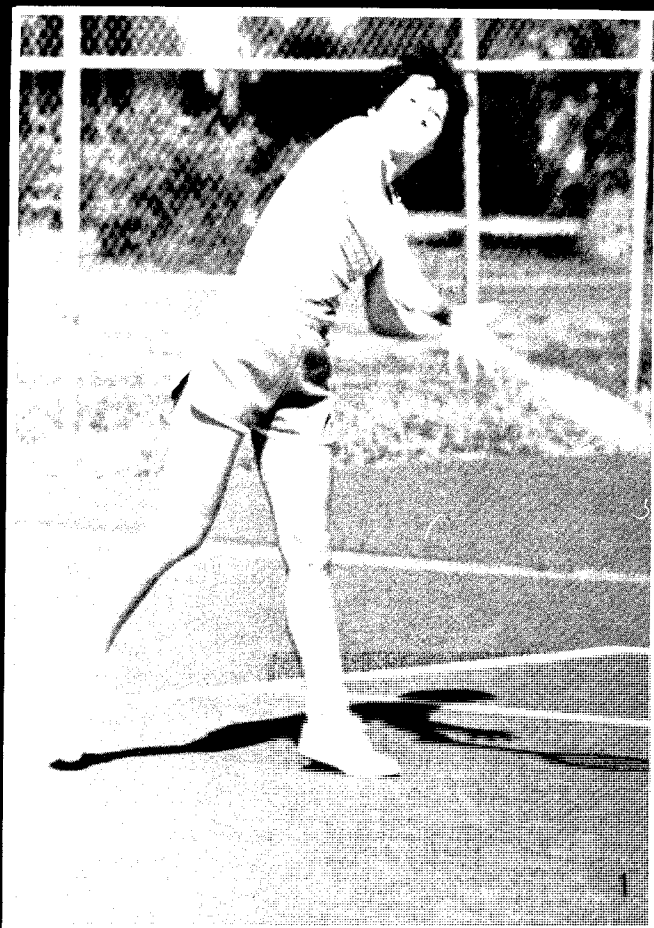
At the Winfield meet, the team defeated Wellington but lost to Winfield.

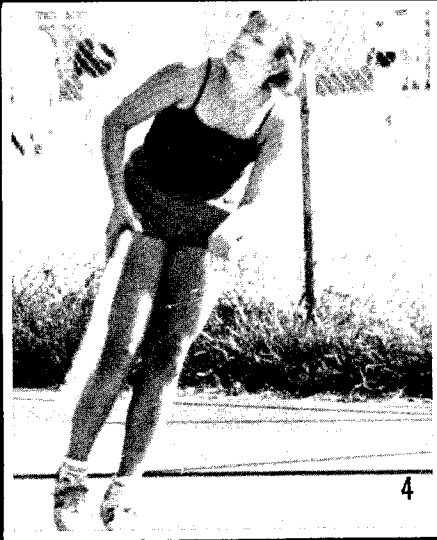

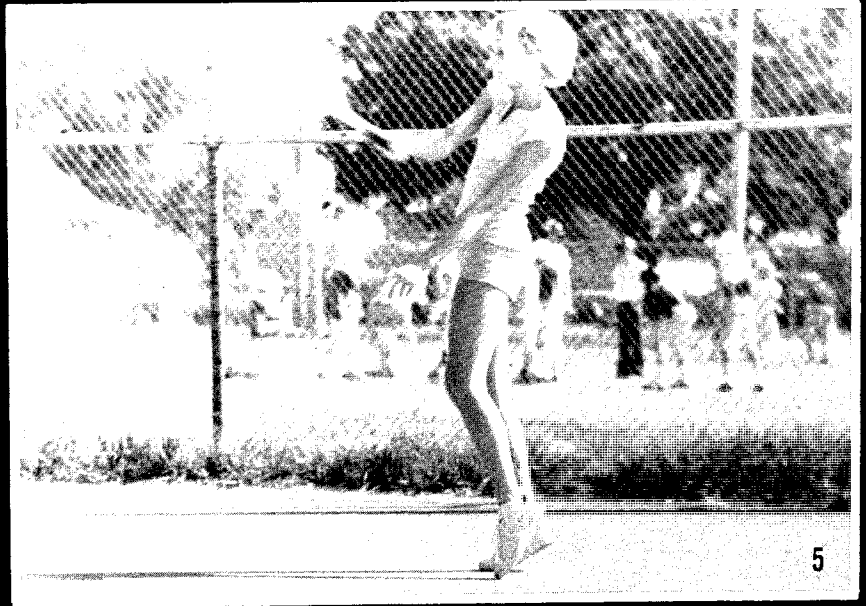




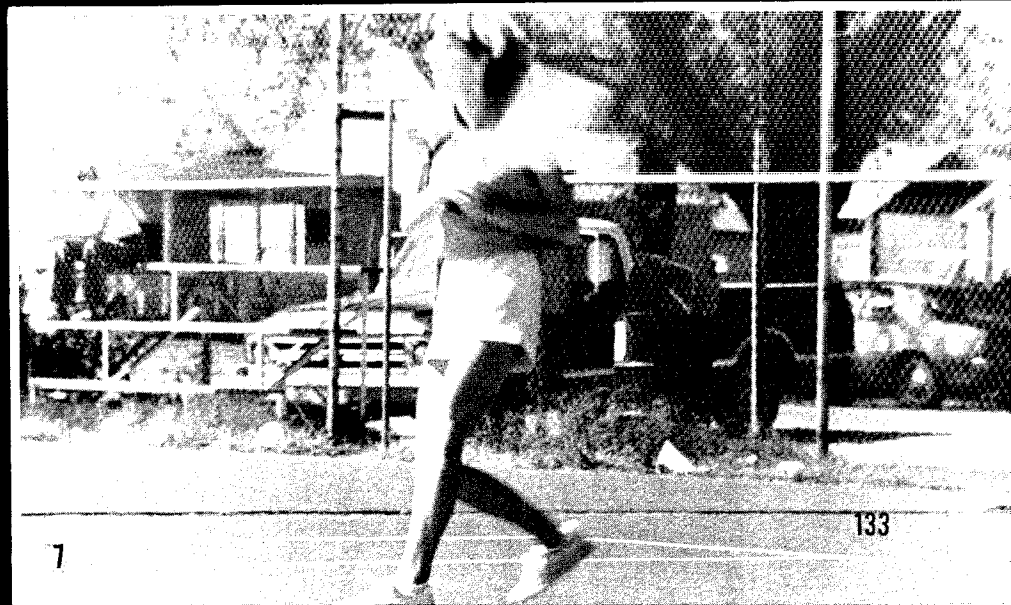

Arch-rival Parsons was slapped in the face as the cagers beat them, 62-56. Mike Shobe lead all scorers, canning 26.

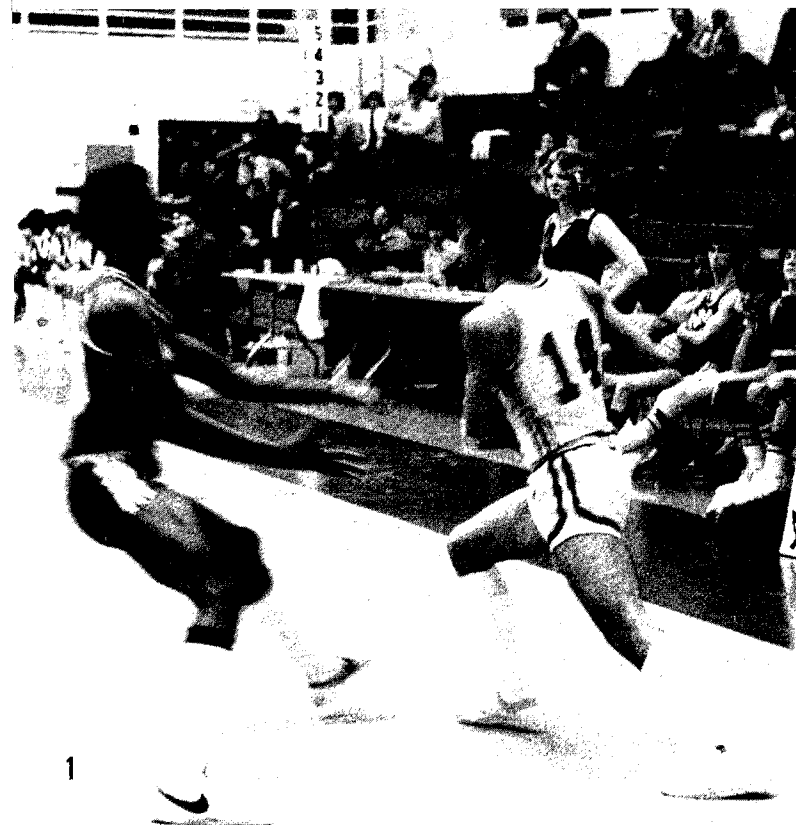
After a loss to Indy, the 'Nado defeated FortScottin a squeaker, 51-50. Steve Locke fired in 20 points.

Coach Charles Bloomcamp said of the Gale season, "Well we just tried to teach them the fundamentals of basketball and give them playing experience."

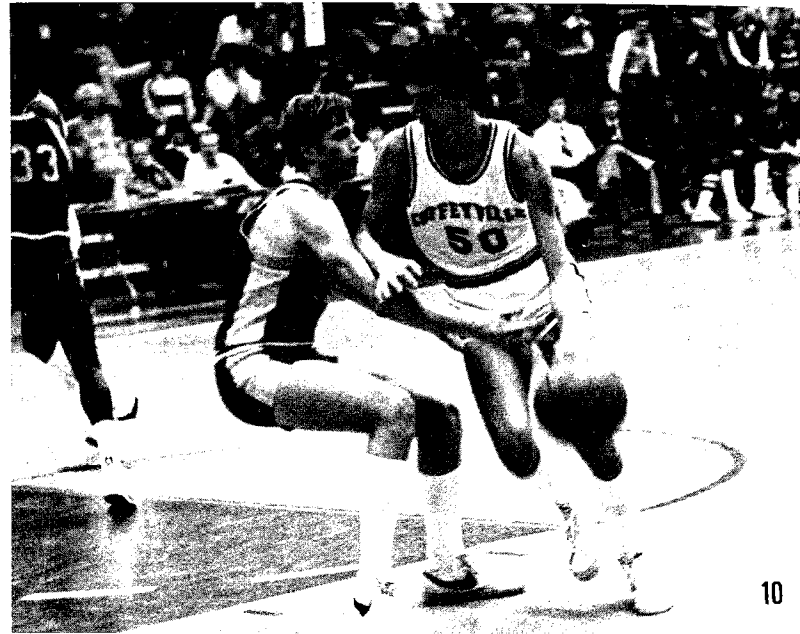
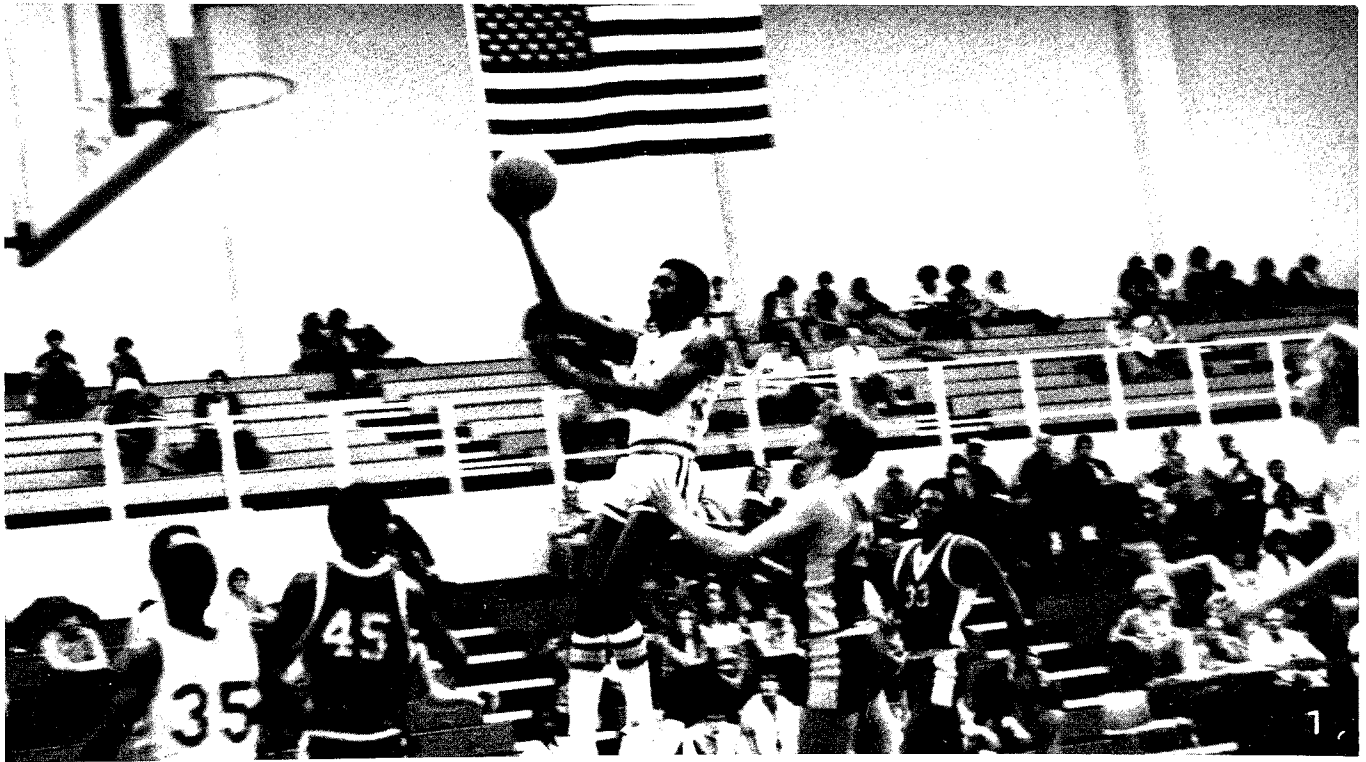

## Girls dribble through season.

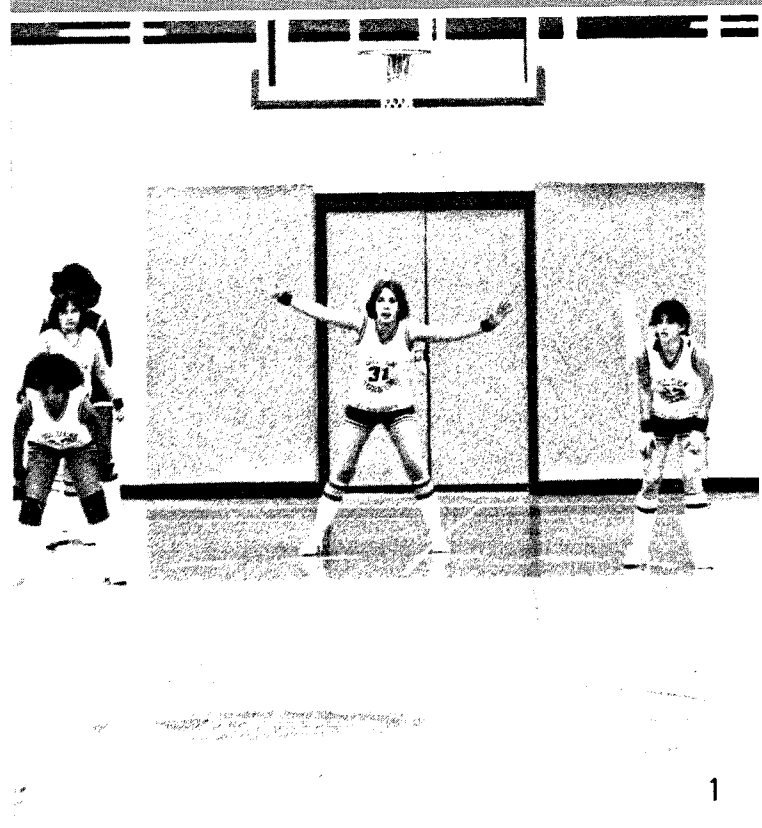

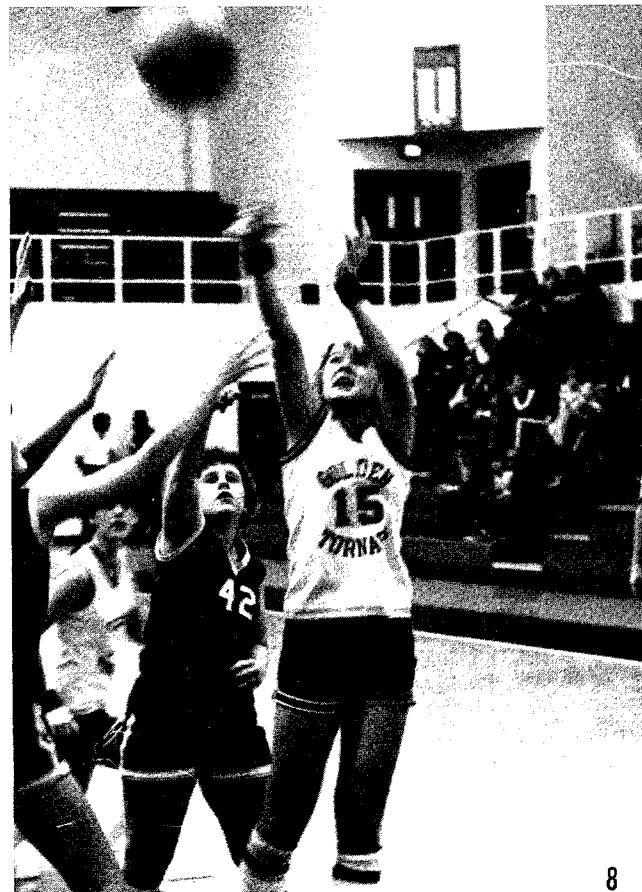

# Seven wrestlers grab State Championship

Golden Tornado wrestlers exploded to take first place in the 5A State Tournament. All seven who qualified for the tourney placed to give Coffeyville its first state championship in 24 years.

Their class state performance was a reflection of the entire season. The matmen lost only one dual match, sent 11 wrestlers to sub-state, sent seven of those to state and won every tournament in which they competed.

Tod Roberts and Joey Vacca, junior David Hughes and freshman Eddie Battifori.

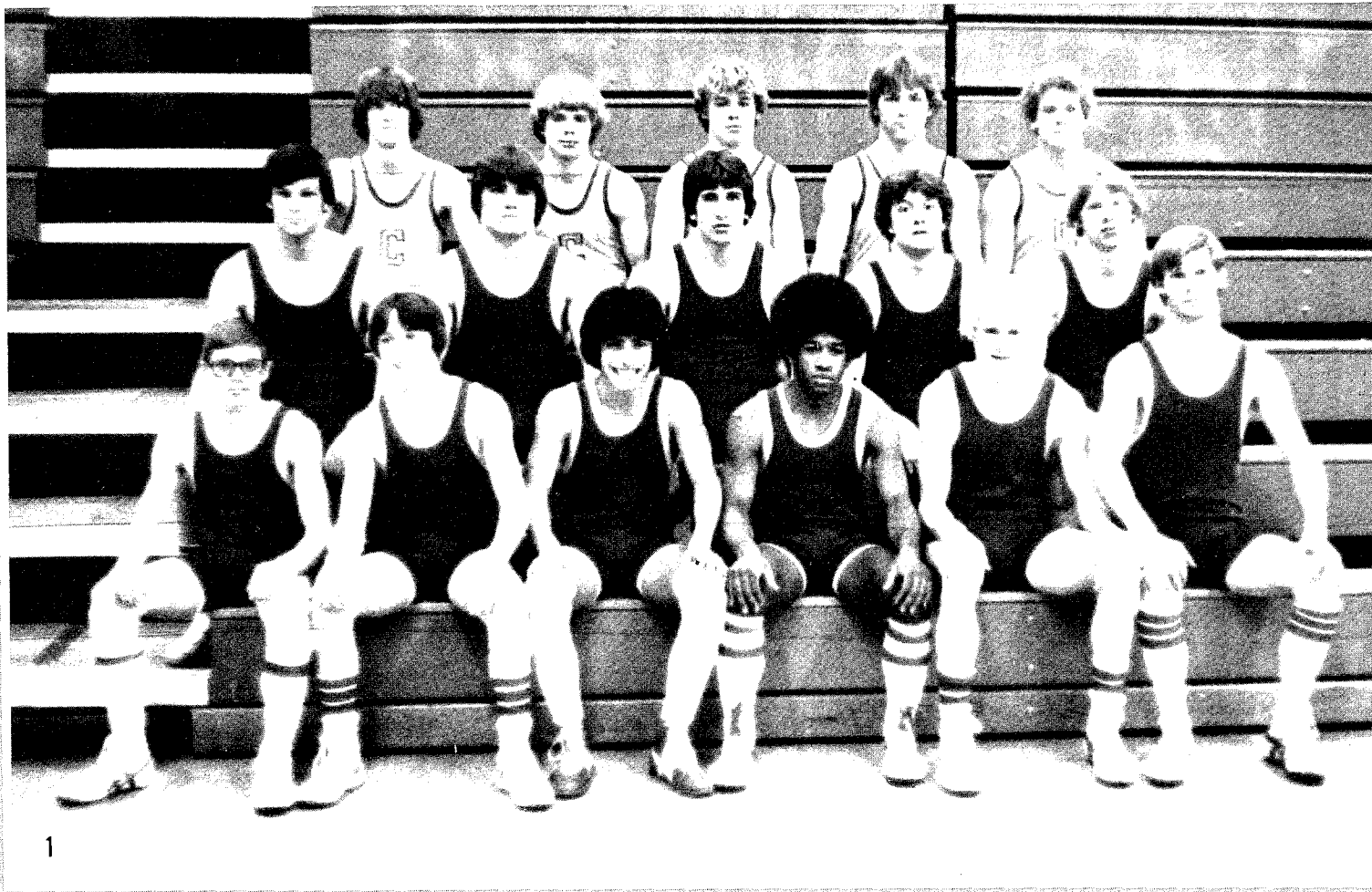

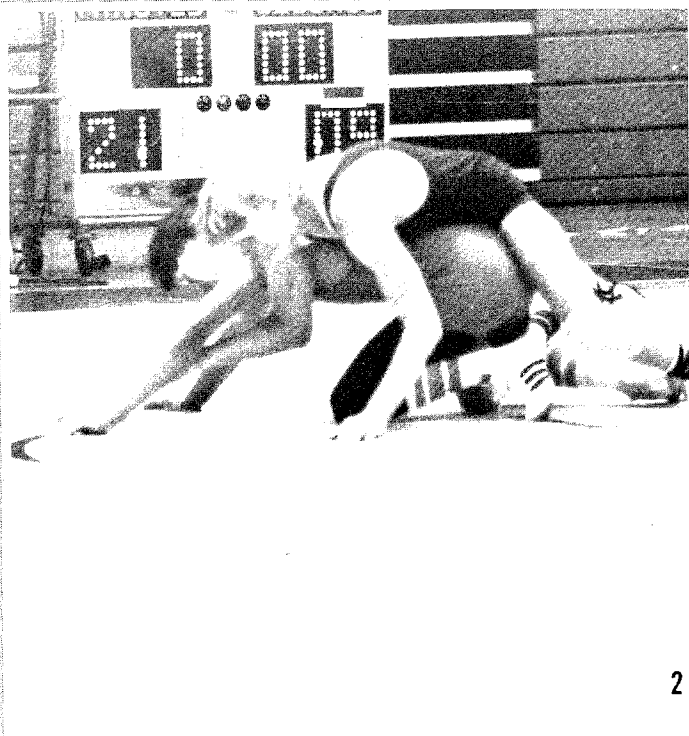

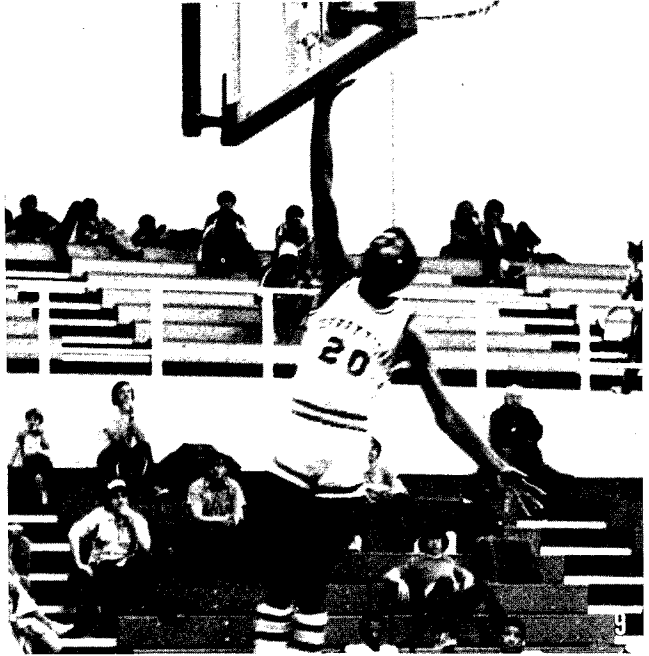
# Seniors in sports
