













When asked what the most boring and the most fun thing they have done in class, answers ranged from self-portraits, making notebooks, silk screening, and taking notes.


Both sophomore Jason Owens and junior Justin Hanna said the most exciting thing they have done in art was paint, but others, such as junior Vincent Parker and
















Of course, what about those good old pep talks? "I believe it helps cre-












The added pressures of the coach and the realization of the competition may have had some effect the outcome, but senior Chris Priddy didn't think so.


"I didn't feel the pressure of them being any better. The question is, were we ready to play to our ability?" Priddy said.

The team plays by three rules set by the coaching staff...the 3 D's as they're sometimes called. Determination. Dedication. Desire.








November is a month many look forward to. A month to get out of school for two days at Thanksgiving. There was more to it than just that.








