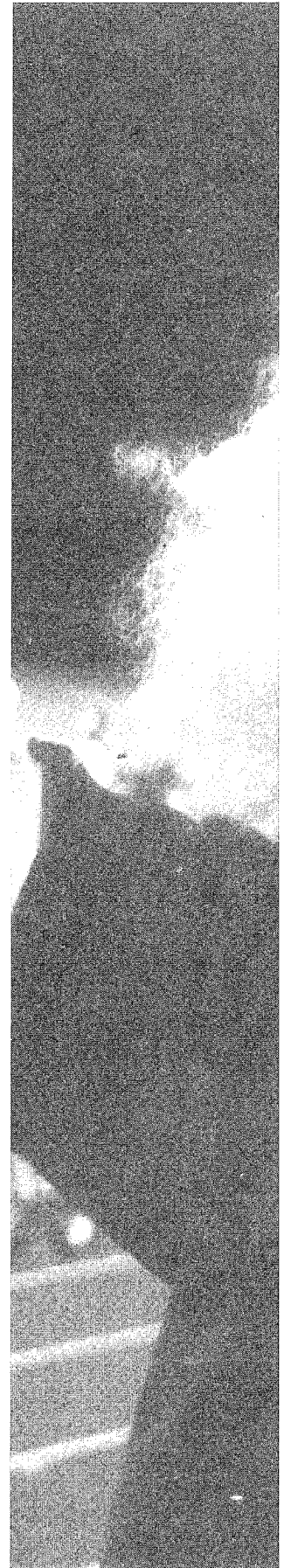


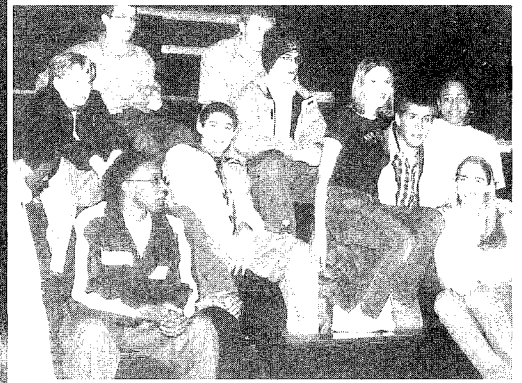
Workin' It

Joyce Cox was one of the many new teachers at F.K.H.S. this year. She educated students in subjects of Geometry and Algebra. This was another small change that took place in the school.

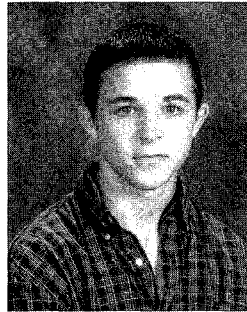

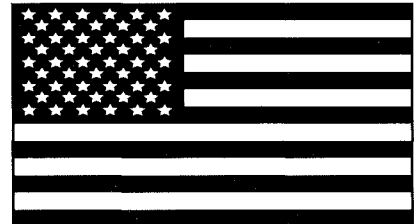
American Patriotism

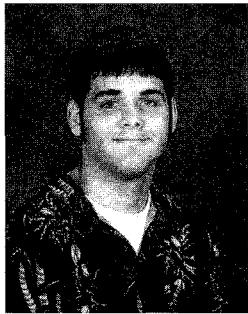

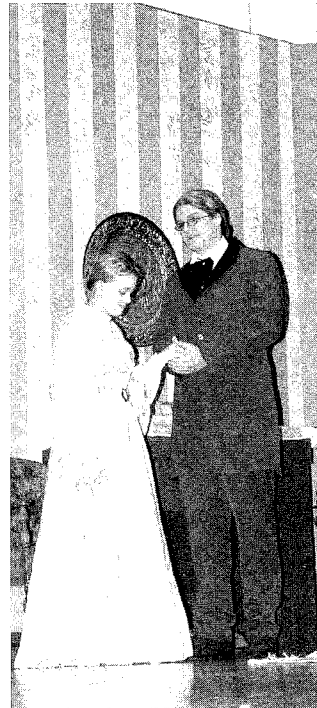

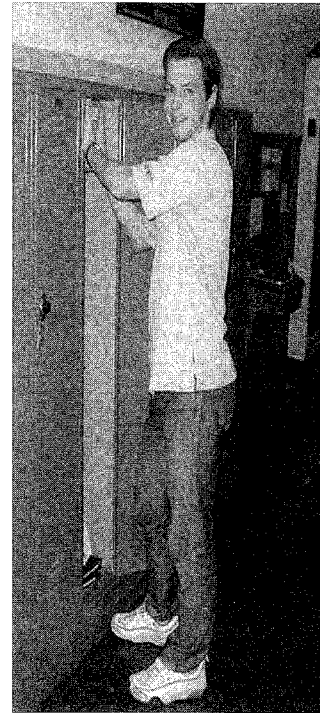

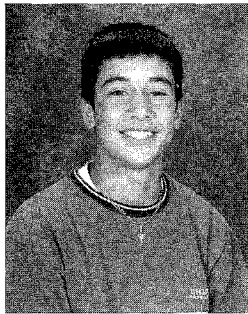

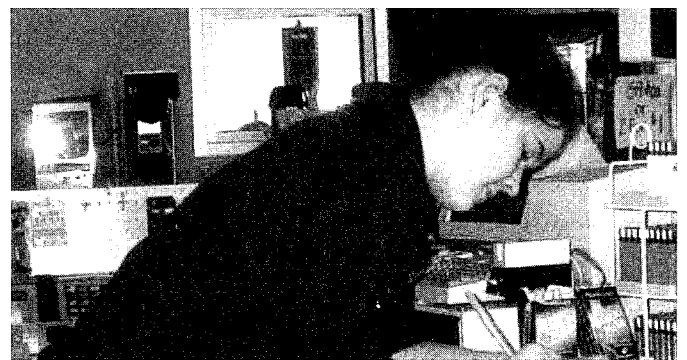

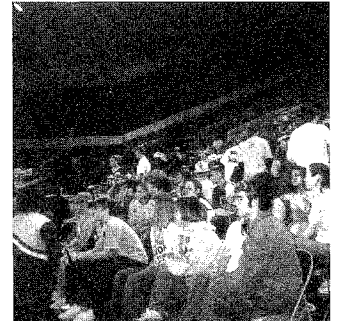

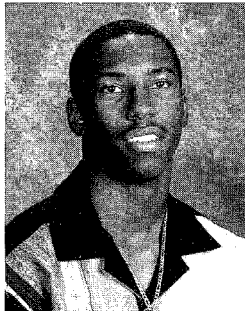

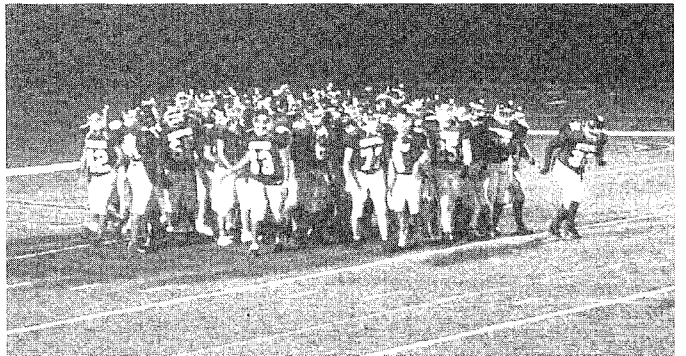

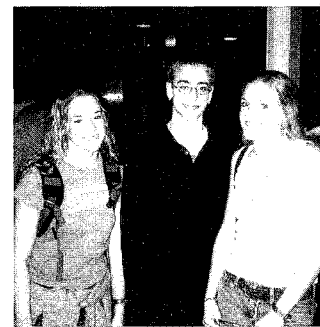

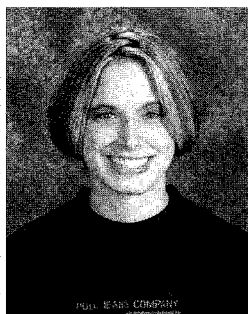

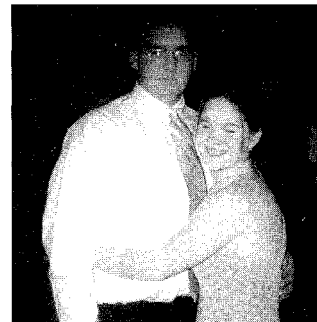

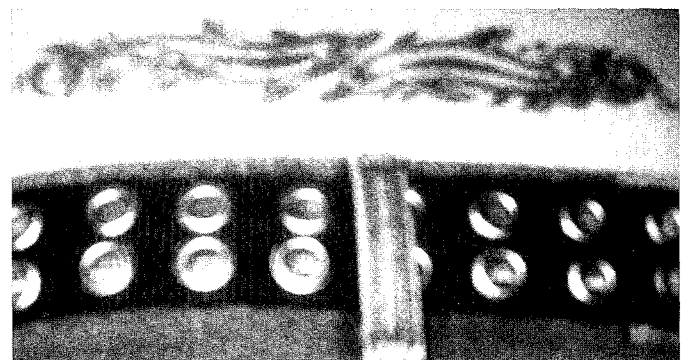

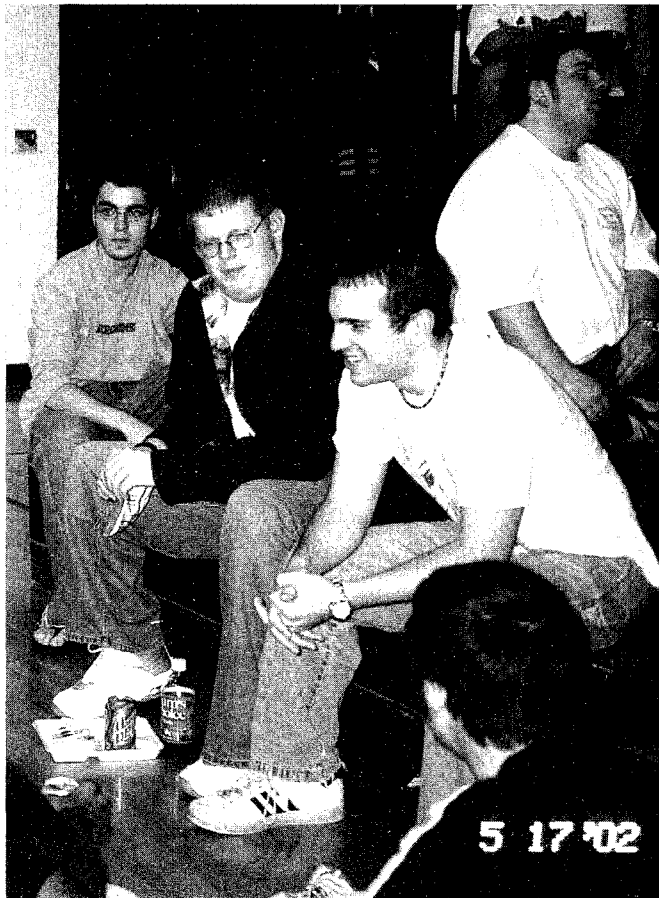

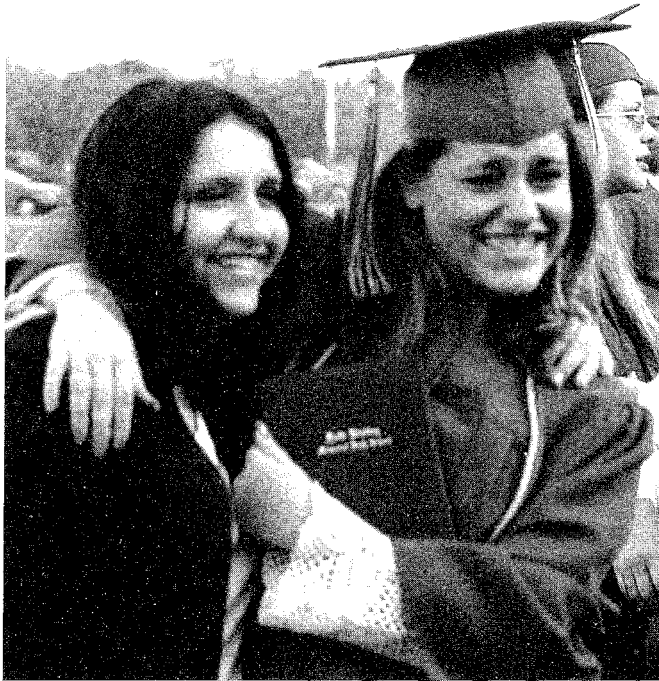


The End Is Only The Beginning

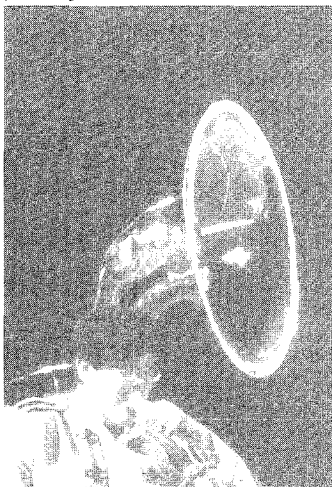

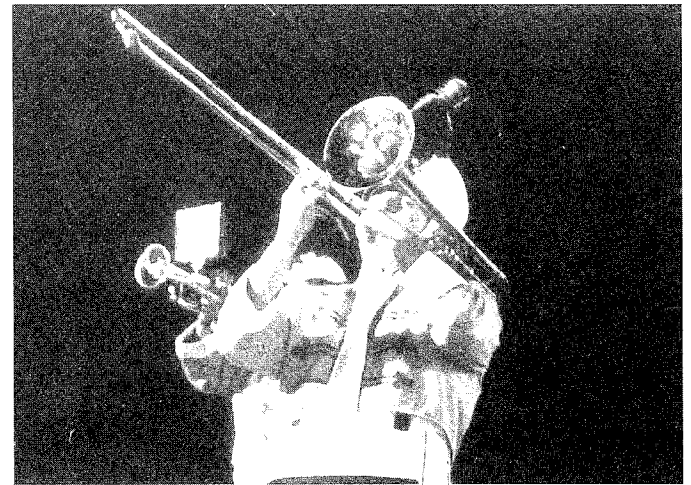

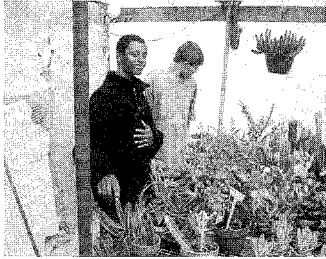

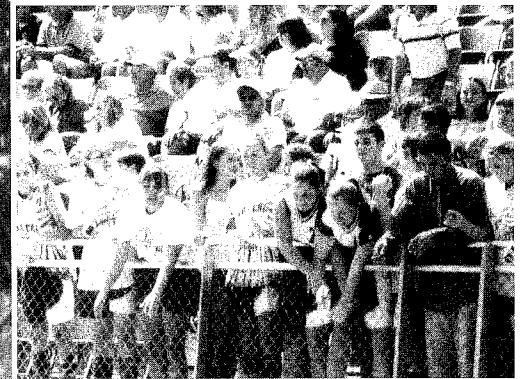

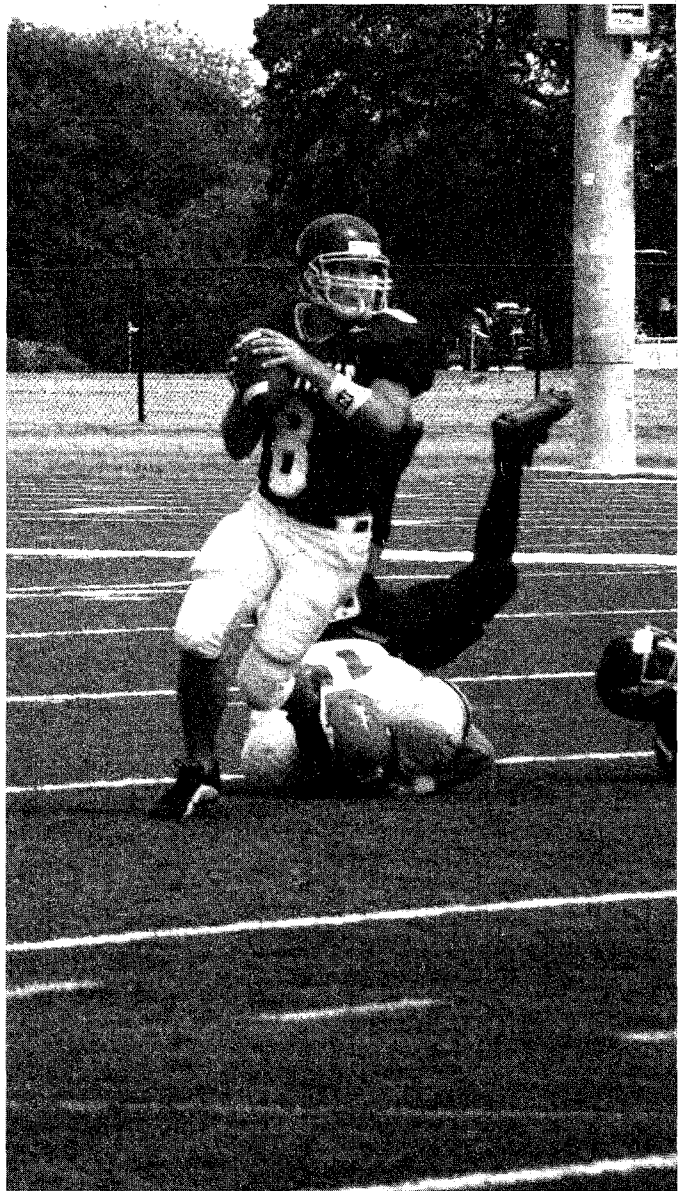

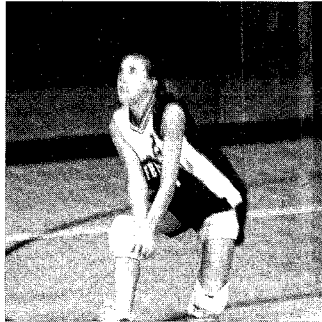

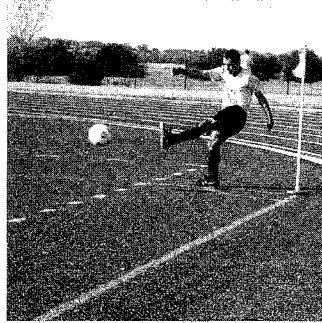

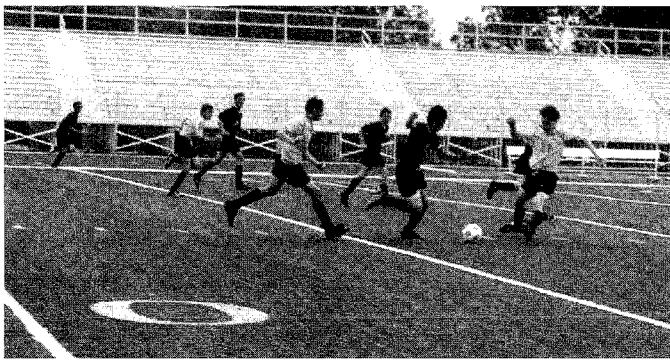

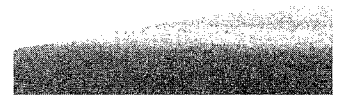

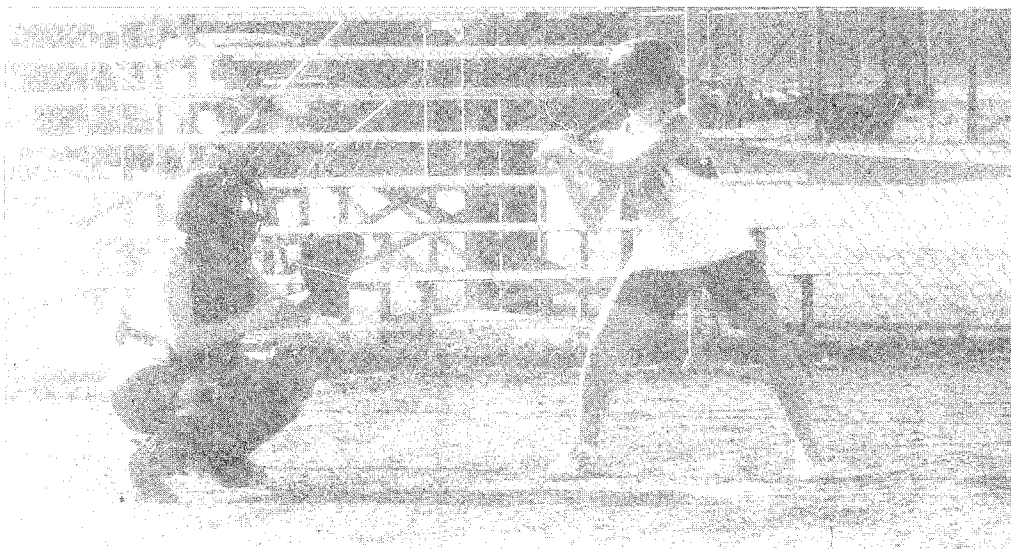
