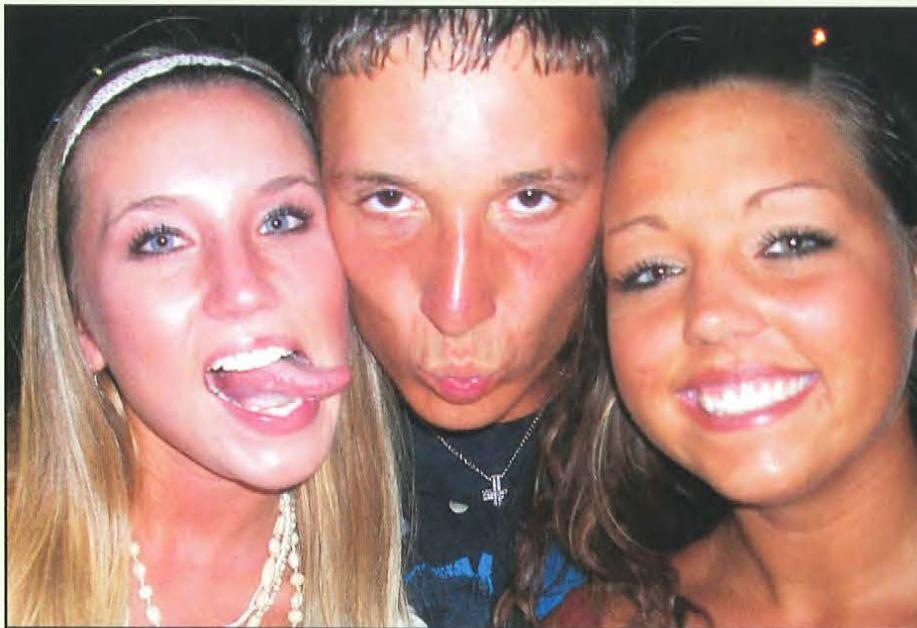

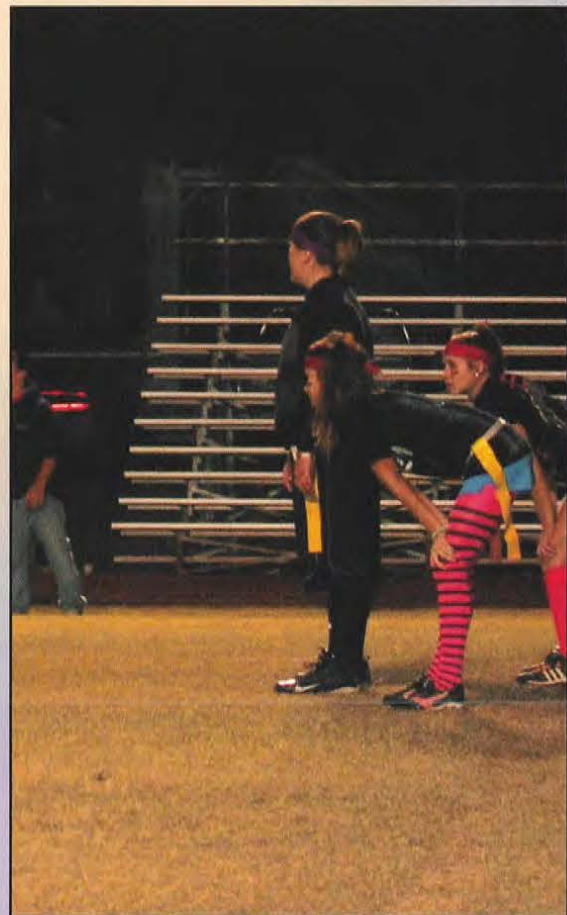


Fall Sports Rally

The first ever Beefcake Volleyball tournament was played this year with every class gearing up as a team. At the end of the tournament the Sophomore team came out victorious.



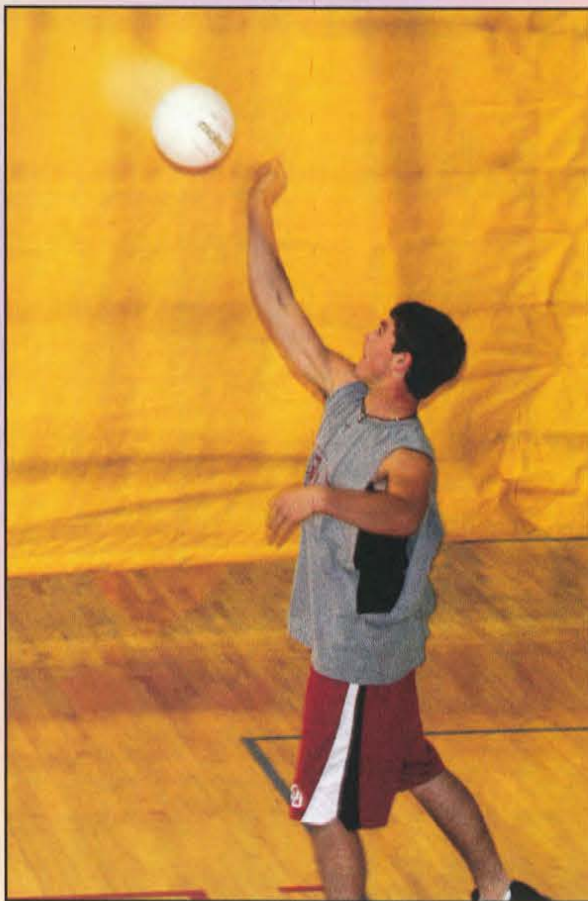
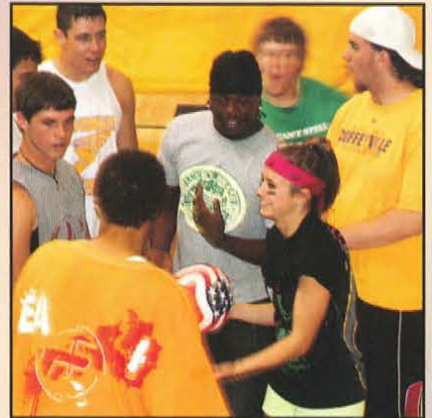

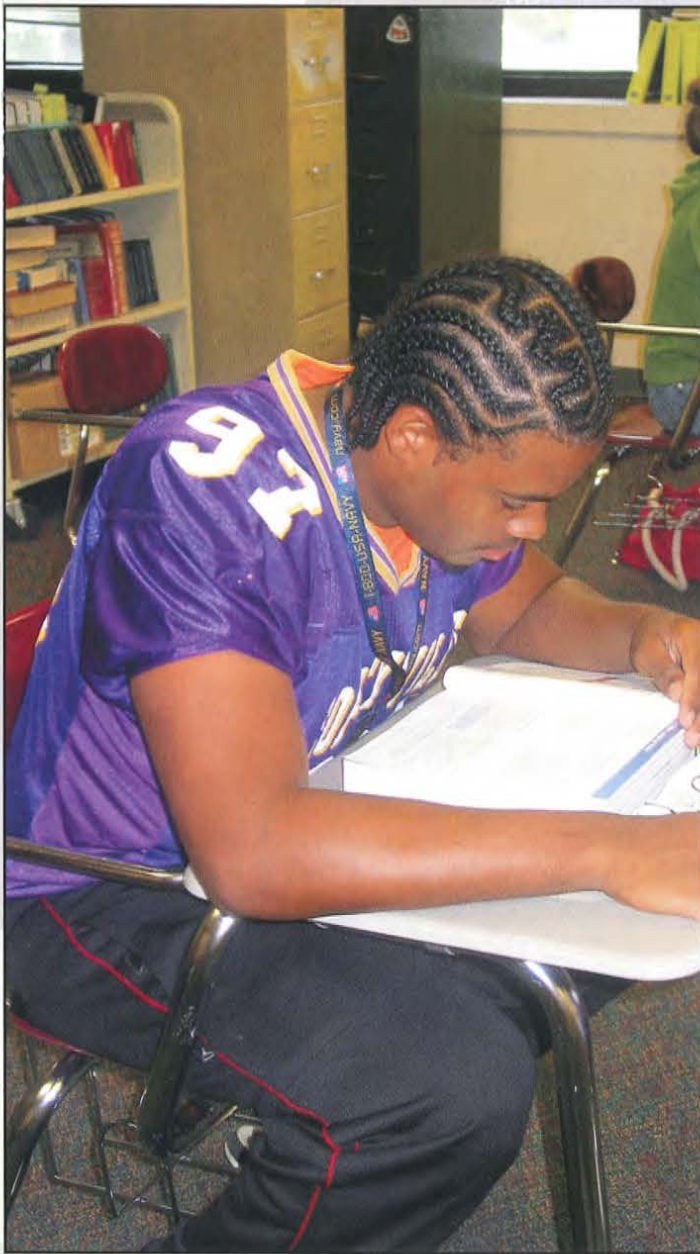

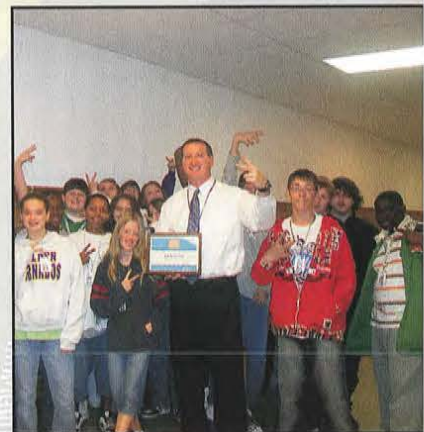


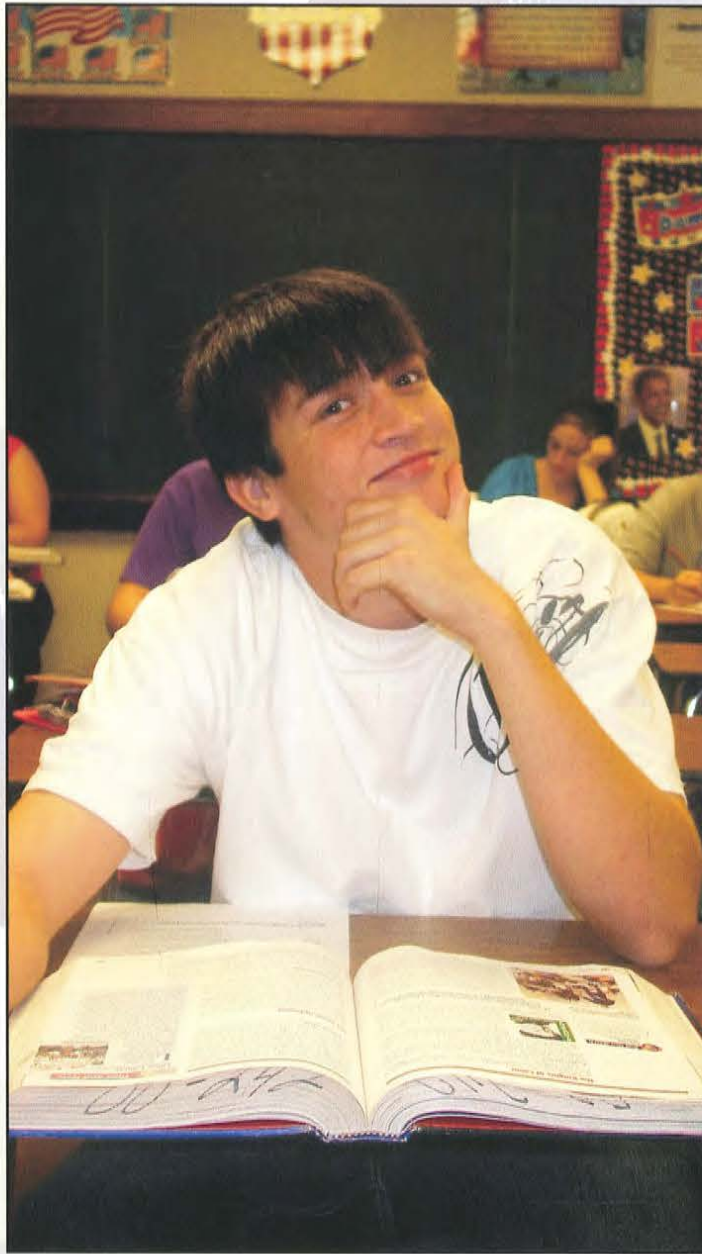
Social Sciences

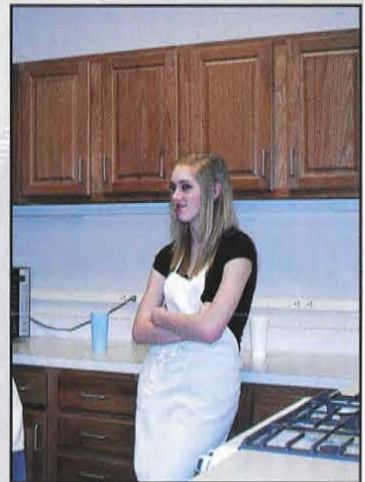


FACS

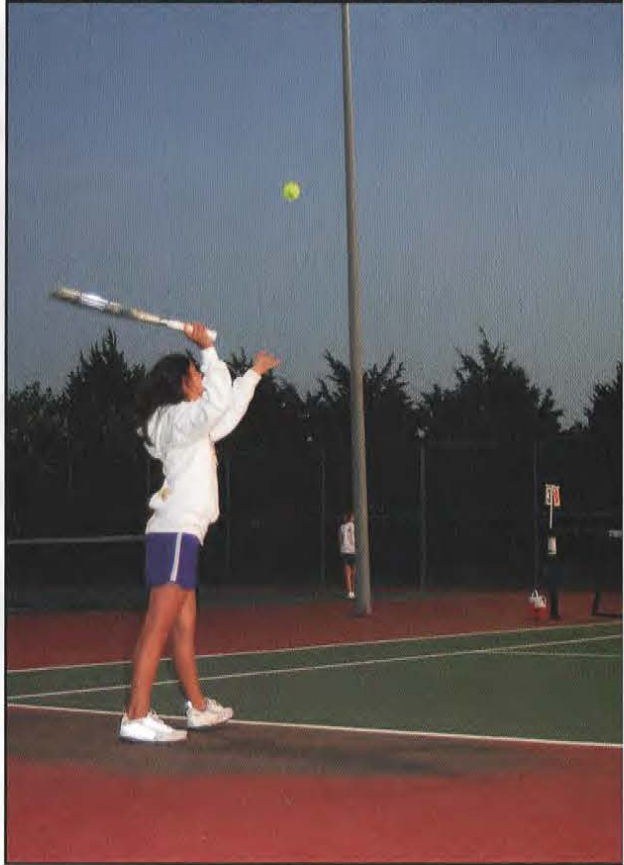

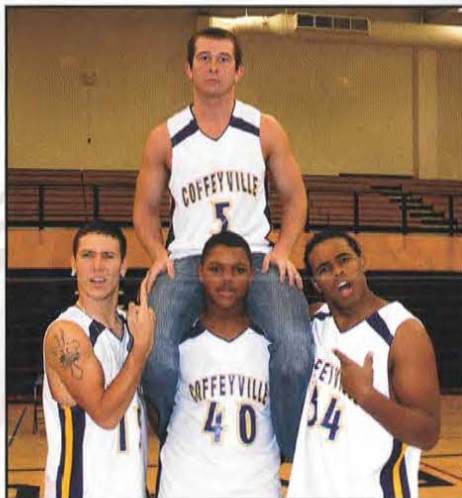

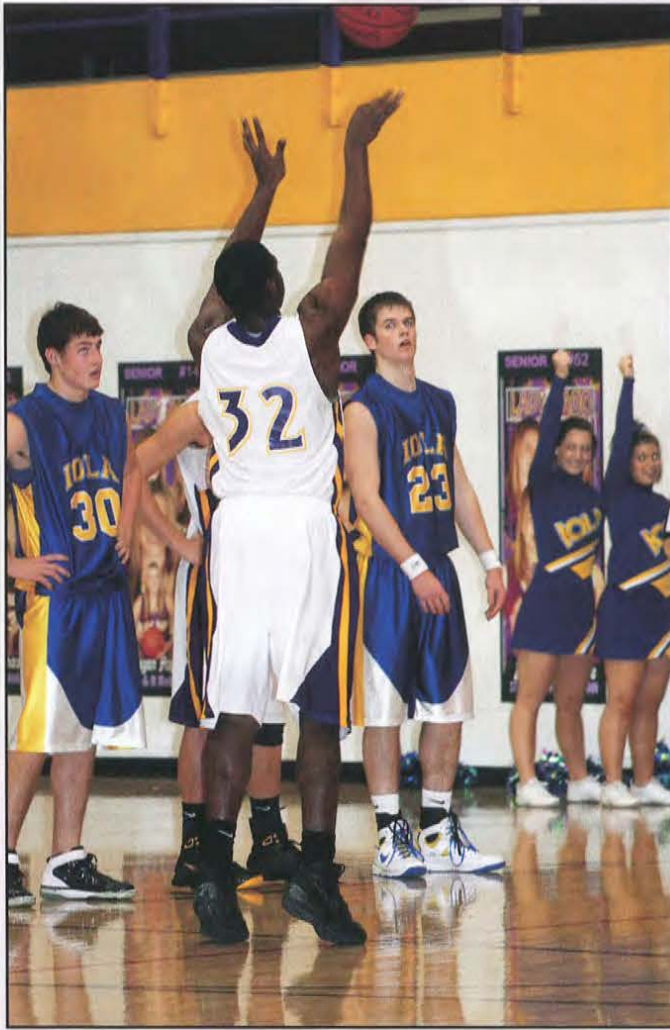

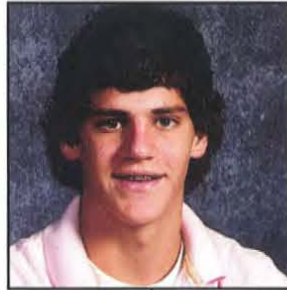

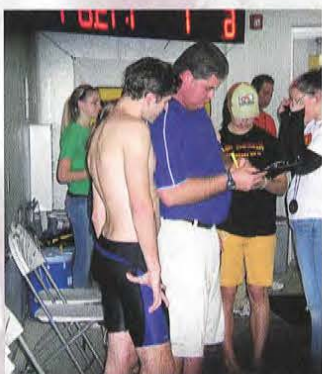

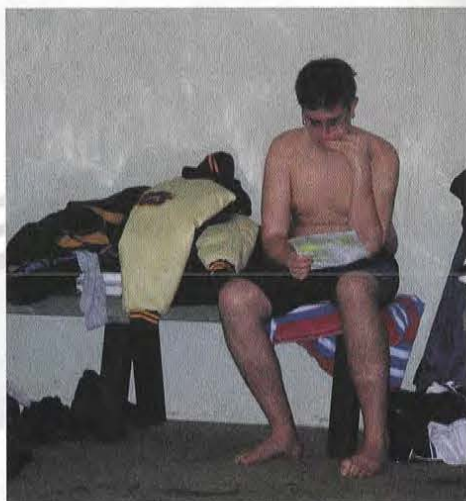

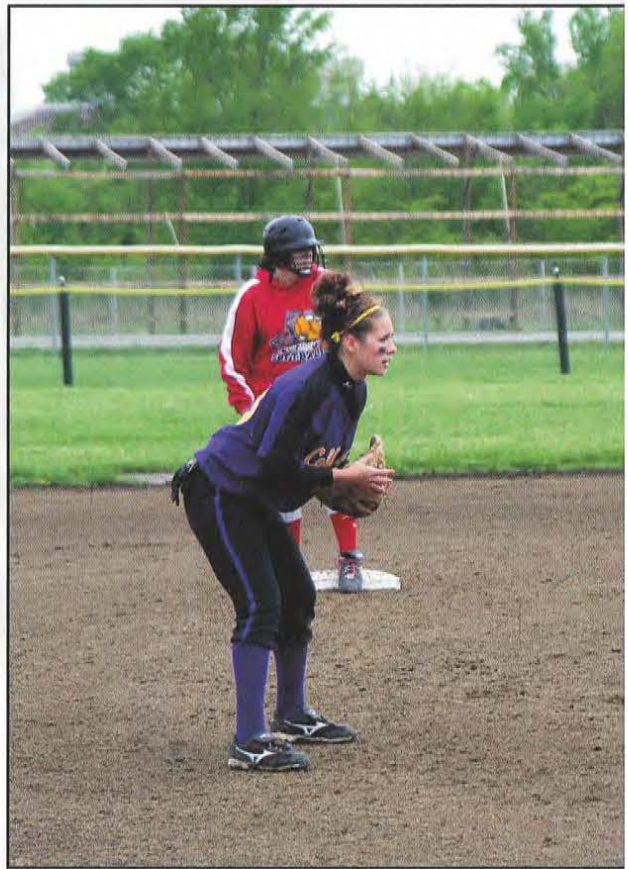

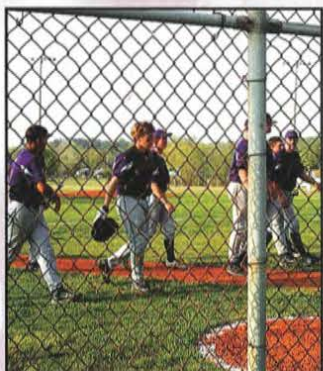

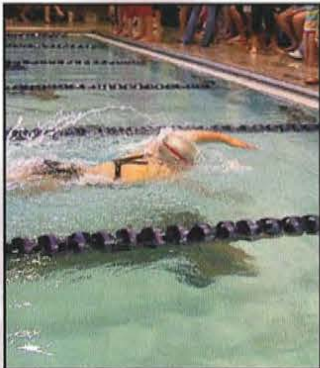

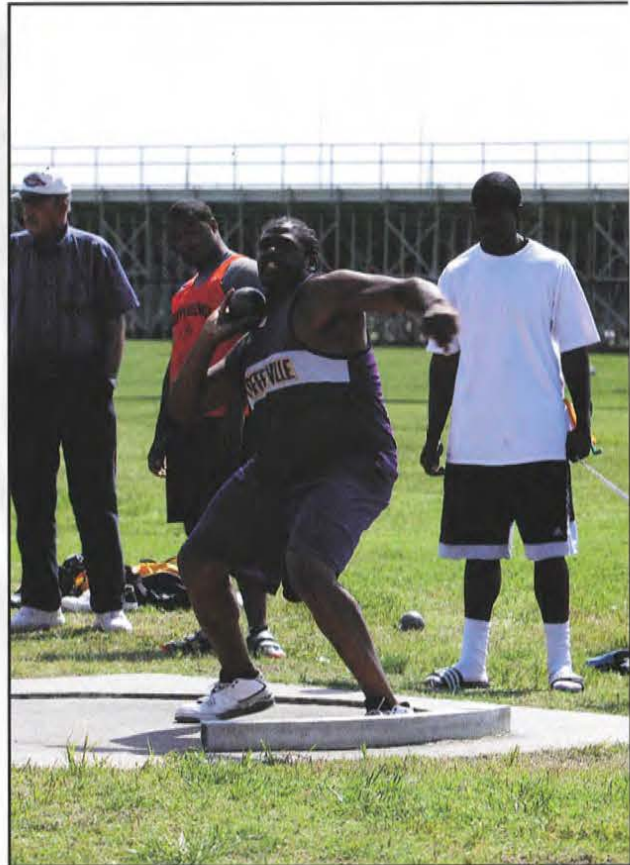
