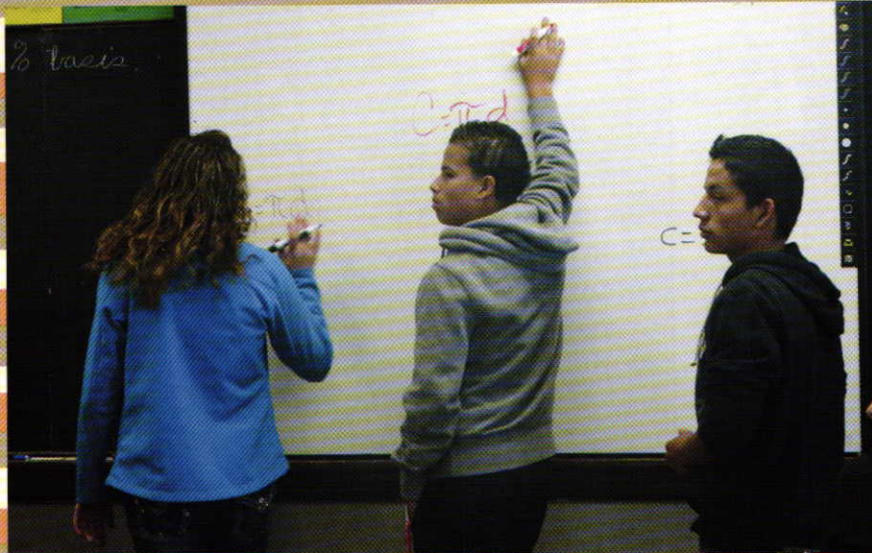

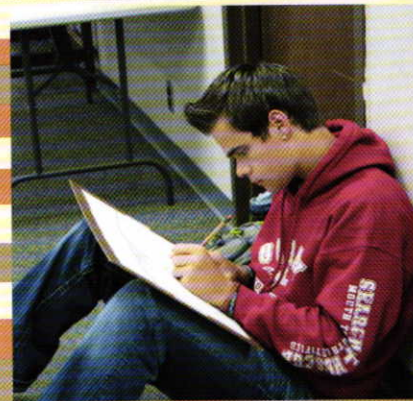

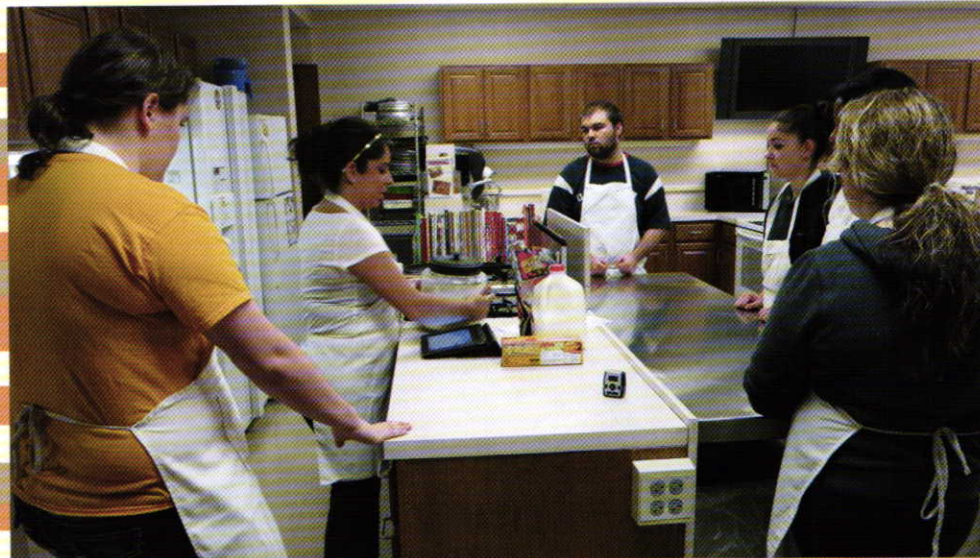

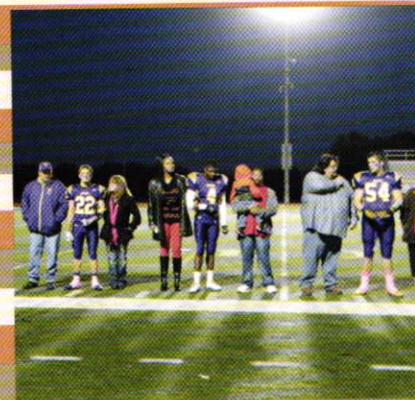
# Week 10

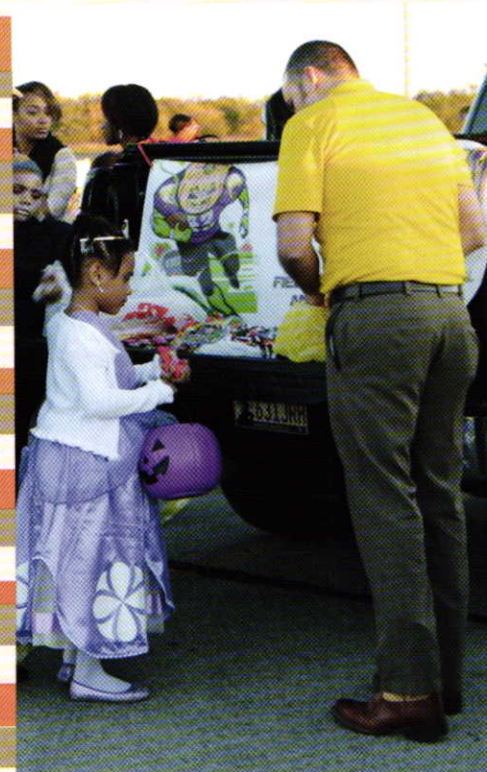


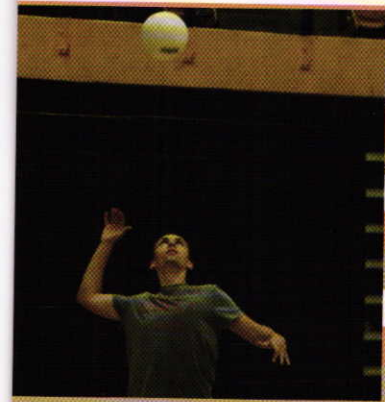

# Weeks 11-12

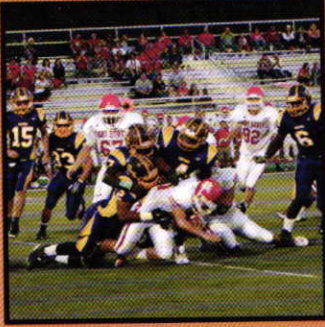

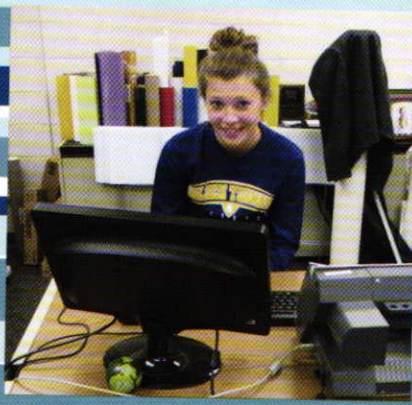

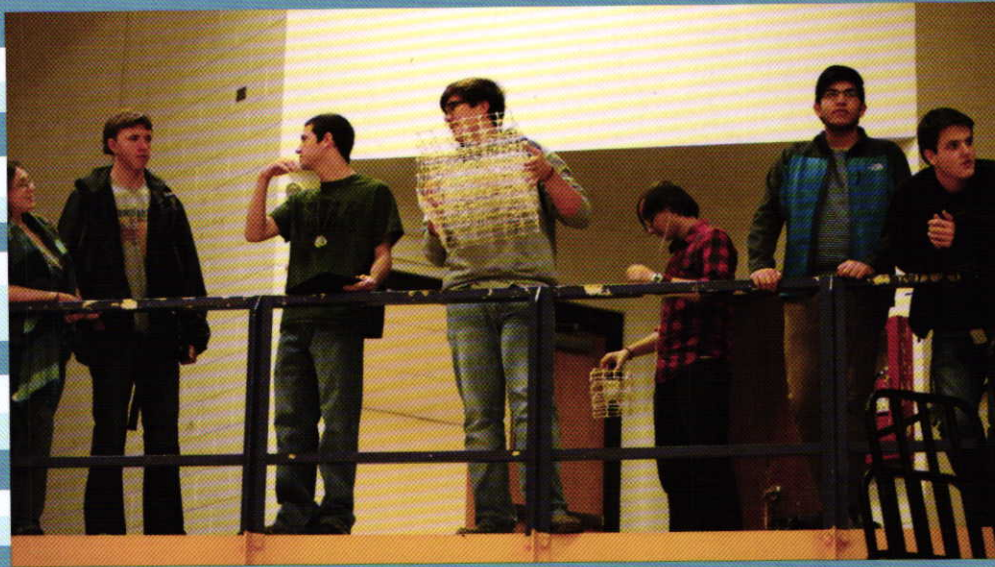

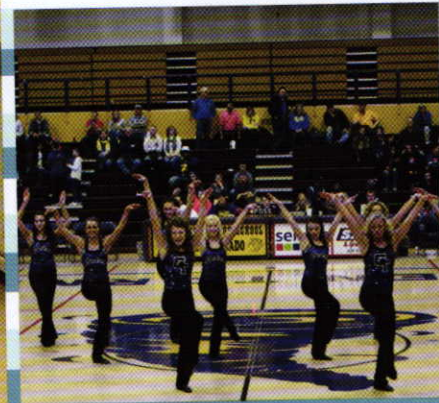
Junior Grant Newton was the only member of the FKHS Golden Tornado Wrestling team that qualified for the State Wrestling tournament which will be
