

Community Scholarships

This scholarship is available to all students at Field Kindley High School. One completed application will work for all of the scholarships listed below. The student simply needs to meet the criteria.

There are different scholarships that make up the Community Scholarship.
The Community Scholarship criteria is listed below:

Acme Foundry Inc.

Offers a scholarship to a graduate who plans to further their education in a college or a university. The recipients are chosen from Acme Foundry employee's scholarship applications submitted to the office.

The American Legion Post 20

Is for a student pursuing a career in Nursing or Education.

Dave's earthly contribution to humanity did not end with the car accident, which took his life if this scholarship helps another person to serve the GOD OF LOVE through individual growth and dedication.

NOTE: Any senior who has already filled out the Community Scholarship Application, your application will automatically be submitted for consideration. You DO NOT have to complete another form.

International Bullying Prevention Association Student Scholarship Program

Applicants must meet all of the following criteria to be eligible for this scholarship:

- Be a high school senior or current college student planning to attend or enrolled in an accredited, non-profit, four year college or university in the United States in the fall of the following year.
- Be a US citizen or legal permanent resident
- Previous winners of the IBPA Student Scholarship are *not eligible* to apply.
- Student may only enter one time per scholarship competition. Any attempt to obtain multiple entries by using different or multiple e-mailed addresses, identities or logins is prohibited and will result in disqualification.
- No exceptions will be made.

Application are accepted year-round, so send in your application anytime!

What are the selection criteria? The IBPA Board of Directors committee will select winners by reviewing and scoring essays received. Decisions of the selection committees are final and are not subject to appeal. No application feedback will be given.

What are the details of the award?

- Up to 2 scholarships in the amount of \$500 will be awarded annually to students who are United States citizens and are not renewable.
- Students may reapply each year as long as they continue to meet the eligibility criteria.
- The scholarships will be paid to the students to be used for attendance including tuition, housing, books and other educational costs at any accredited, nonprofit, four-year college or university.
- Students may transfer from one institution to another and retain the award.

Cherokee Nation Scholarships

Concurrent Enrollment Scholarship:

This scholarship is for any high school junior and senior Cherokee student who is enrolled at a college or university and resides within the 14-County jurisdictional or contiguous counties. This scholarship covers tuition, books and fees up to 9 credit hours. The funds are sent directly to the school. Applicants must provide:

- Completed application (paper)
- College class schedule
- Recommendation from a school official
- Most recent high school transcript

Valedictorian-Salutatorian Scholarship:

This scholarship is for the Cherokee high school senior named Valedictorian or Salutatorian and resides within the 14-County jurisdictional or contiguous counties. The scholarship is a one-time award of \$1,000 for the Valedictorian and \$750 for the Salutatorian. Applicants must provide:

- Completed application (paper)
- Verification letter from a school official
- 7 semester high school transcript
- Completed and signed Substitute W-9 form

Promise Scholarship:

This scholarship is for incoming freshmen on campus at Northeastern State University, Rogers State University, or Connors State College. Recipients can receive up to \$4,600 per semester. Applicants must provide:

- 7 semester high school transcript
- Student Aid Report - www.FAFSA.ed.gov
- Parents' Income-Must meet NAHASDA income guidelines
- Driver's License
- Proof of Residency - Must reside in 14-County jurisdiction
- Reference letter
- Acceptance letter to NSU, RSU, CSC
- Essay

- Maintain a 2.7 GPA

Undergraduate Scholarship:

This scholarship is for Cherokee students pursuing their first Bachelor's degree at a college or university. Applicants must reside within the 14-County jurisdictional or contiguous counties. Recipients can receive up to \$2,000 per semester. Applicants must provide:

The Coolidge Scholarship A Scholarship for America

The Coolidge Scholarship ("The Coolidge") is one of America's most generous scholarship opportunities for college-bound students. Eligible recipients are high school juniors who plan to enroll in a college in the fall of 2018 and are American citizens or legal permanent residents (current high school seniors are *not* eligible to apply). Any student of any background, planning to pursue any academic discipline of study, may apply to this non-partisan, need-blind, program. The Coolidge is a full-ride scholarship that covers a student's tuition, room, board and expenses for ***four years of undergraduate study*** and it can be used by recipients at *any* accredited U.S. college or university. The main criterion for the Coolidge is academic merit.

The scholars program is administered by the Calvin Coolidge Presidential Foundation, the official foundation dedicated to America's thirtieth president. The competition for the Scholar slots is significant. Yet even students who do not win have said they are glad they went through the application process because it helped prepare them for college application later on. Furthermore, the Coolidge Foundation invites the top 45-50 applicants to participate in its Coolidge Senators Program, which includes an all-expenses paid Summit Weekend in Washington, D.C.

Kansas City Associated Equipment Distributors Scholarship 2017

The Kansas City Associated Equipment Distributors awards annual scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each (\$500 per semester) to up four full-time students. Both men and women, attending a vocational/technical school, and pursuing a certificate or associate's degree in Diesel Mechanics or Heavy Equipment Repair, are eligible to apply. The recipients will be chosen based on their interest in entering one of these fields of study, upon completion of their certificate or associate's degree. Selection is based on the individual's general aptitude and personal traits that are conducive to success in these fields of study. To remain eligible the recipient must be enrolled full-time starting in the fall semester of the year in which the scholarship is awarded. Once a student has completed the first year of school, they may re-apply for the scholarship for their second year, but must meet all qualifications.

All applications, including essay, transcripts and letters are due on or before April 3rd (if submitted electronically), or postmarked by April 3rd if mailed.

The scholarship winners will be announced at the KCCEOA May meeting. The Local County Clerk/Election Official will contact the scholarship winners in each respective county by May 15th.
