The FKHS Theatre department will perform the play, *She Kills Monsters*, on December 10th and 11th at 7:00 p.m. in the Roosevelt Middle School Benefiel Auditorium. This will be the first performance of the school year for theatre teacher Ryan Bearrick.

She Kills Monsters is written by Qui Nguyen and tells the story of Agnes Evans, a young woman grieving for her deceased sister. The Evans sisters never were especially close, but after Tilly's death Agnes uncovers a notebook containing a game scenario created by her sister. She discovers that Tilly was well-known Dungeons and Dragons player, and that she was passionate about online fantasy gaming. In order to unlock more secrets

about her mysterious young sibling, Agnes recruits a "dungeon master" named Chuck to help her understand and grieve Tilly. Chock-full of supermodel elves, dominatrix warrior women, and nasty ogres, *She Kills Monsters* is a surprisingly sweet tale of friendship, loss, and acceptance.

Students prepare to go Remote after Thanksgiving

Soon enough FKHS students will be going remote for the end of November, through December and the start of January. During this time Google Meets or Zoom calls will be required for attendance.

If you do not attend then you will be counted absent. November 25-27 is Thanksgiving break and the first day of Remote learning will start on Monday, November 30. Students will have three weeks of classwork remotely, until Dec. 18.

Finals will be scheduled for Nov. 17-18, with first, second, and third hour finals given on Nov. 17 and fourth through seventh hour finals will be on Nov. 18. All students will take a final in every class.

During those three weeks, in the afternoons teachers can bring students in to work, students can participate in community service, and seniors will be presenting their senior projects.

After Christmas break, students will start the Spring semester remotely on Jan. 6, then on Jan. 11 will return to on-site learning.

According to FKHS principal Travis Stalford, the reason for going remote during these times is that many families travel during the holidays and being remote will hopefully curb the spread of any virus that students might come into contact with during

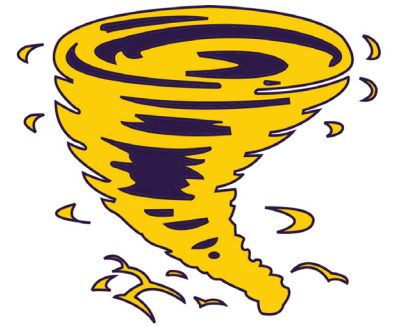
