## FKHS students earn medals at SkillsUSA State

The FKHS SkillsUSA chapter competed at State on April 24-26, at Hutchinson. They participated in three competitions: Video Production, Prepared Speech, and Community Service.

The team of juniors Olivia Foulk and Murrain McKellips took second in video production, and junior Kimberley Moore took third in prepared speech. The team of freshmen Breanna Bradshaw, Allee Erne, and Emily Long took third in community service and freshmen Jamiah Burnett and Long finished fourth in video production.

In the Video Production competition, teams were required to create a 60 second video promoting how SkillUSA prepares you to be career ready. The teams also had to edit their videos and submit them to a judge. In prepared speech Moore wrote a 5 to 7 minute speech over how SkillsUSA and the schools CTE programs

are preparing her for her future career. In the Community Service contest the contestants presented their Community Service project, "Blankets for Babies" to a panel of Army National Guard judges.

"It was really exciting to get the experience to go on this trip with everyone else and get the experience to perform in front of judges from the Army National Guard," Bradshaw said.

The students held four bake sales to earn the money to buy fleece material. With the material they made 22 tied fleece blankets and then donated them to the Coffeyville Fire department to hand out for infants and young children who need warmth and comfort because of a fire or other emergency situation.

The chapter was also recognized at the conference Opening Ceremony for a membership increase.

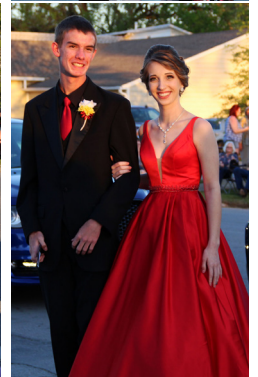
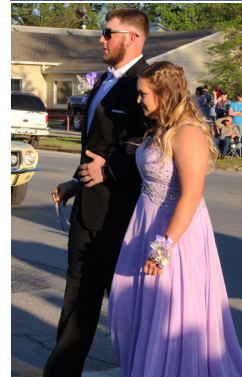
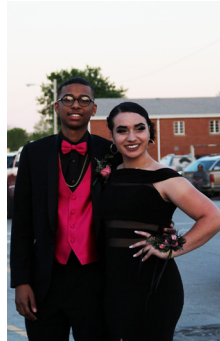
