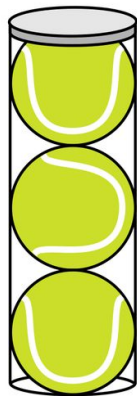

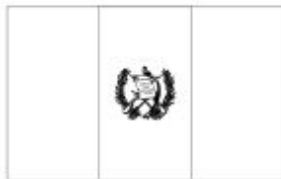
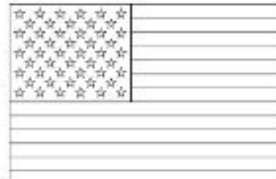
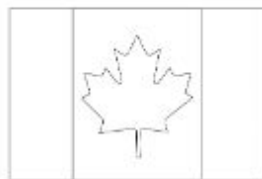


THE BASICS

North America is one of the seven continents! This continent is in the western hemisphere of Earth. North America is the third largest continent in the world. There are 23 countries in North America. It is bordered by four oceans.

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COUNTRIES IN NORTH AMERICA



North America has 23 countries. Canada is the largest country. Canada is a little bit bigger than the United States. There are many smaller countries, such as Mexico. There are also nine islands that are part of the continent.

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LANDFORMS IN NORTH AMERICA

There are different landforms in North America. Mountains, volcanoes, plains, and deserts are just a few. The highest mountain is Denali. This mountain is in Alaska. The lowest point in North America is Death Valley. It is 282 feet below sea level. It is the hottest and driest location in North America.



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WATERWAYS IN NORTH AMERICA



North America is full of lakes and rivers. No country in North America is landlocked from the ocean. The largest lake is Lake Superior. Lake Superior is in the United States. It is as big as the state of South Carolina. It is the largest freshwater lake in the world! North America is home to one of the longest rivers in the world. The Mississippi River runs from the top of the United States to the bottom.

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PEOPLE IN NORTH AMERICA



Native Americans were the first people to live in North America. People from Europe came later to make towns. Now North America is a mixture of many cultures. English is the most spoken language. French and Spanish are spoken too. About 579 million people live in North America today.
