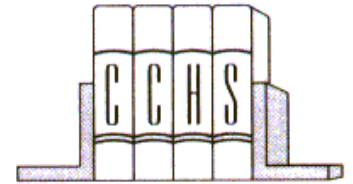

CCHS Distinguished Alumnus Dr. Matthew Broom

LCDR Matthew Broom, a 1995 Carbondale Community High School Graduate, was honored as the U.S. Navy's Uniformed Services West Chapter "Outstanding Youth Pediatrician of the Year" by the American Academy of Pediatrics in 2010. More recently, Dr. Broom received the "Dave Berry Award." This award recognizes an individual that sets high standards for excellence in the practice of pediatrics, holds significant promise for a career in military medical education, is a caring, compassionate physician who serves as a role model for parent interactions, and leads a balanced life that acknowledges the many facets of a whole self: career, family, friends, community,

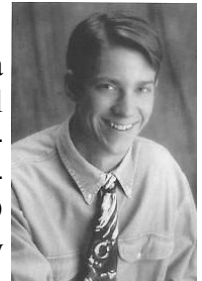

spirituality, and physical health. Broom was commissioned as a naval officer and entered medical school under the Navy Health Professions Scholarship Program. He graduated from St. Louis University in 1999 with a Bachelor of Arts in Chemistry and later in 2003 graduated from St. Louis University School of Medicine. Dr. Broom interned and remained at Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital until July 2006 when he reported to the U.S. Naval Hospital Okinawa in August 2007 as a staff pediatrician. Broom then joined the pediatrics department at the Naval Medical Center Portsmouth last summer to pursue his interest in medical education. Dr. Broom is now an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at St. Louis University School of Medicine.

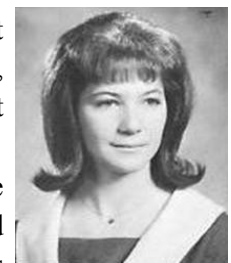

Booth is originally from Peoria, IL and graduated from Southern Illinois University with his undergraduate degree in Health Education and began

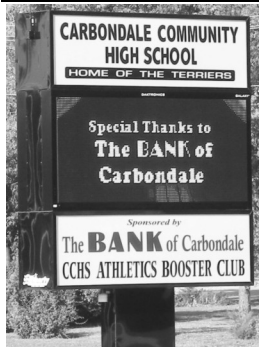

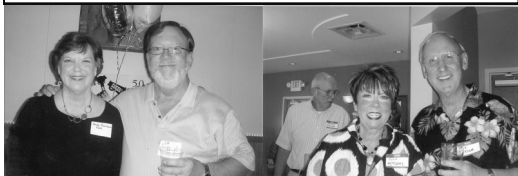

Board Member Retires After 38 Years

On April 28, 2011 the Carbondale Community High School (CCHS) District 165 School Board met to honor retiring board members and to welcome three new members. President Robert Brewer was among the retiring Board members. Brewer was presented with a plaque and an engraved courtyard paver brick recognizing his service to the Board.

Brewer served on the Board from the 1973-74 to 2010-11 school years for a total of 38 years. The board expressed its sincere appreciation

for Brewer's many years of service to CCHS.

Born and raised in Carbondale, Illinois, Brewer grew up watching his dad work as an engineer on the railroad.

Brewer graduated from CCHS in 1955. He was employed in the Bursar's Office at Southern Illinois University (SIU) for 37 years but has since retired. After graduation and on into his career, Brewer made it a goal to stay extremely involved with CCHS. Brewer received the Jake Goro Award in 1980 for outstanding service and leadership. He handed out that same award at SIU from 1998 to 2010.

Brewer still resides in Carbondale with his wife of 50 years, Betsy, and he is currently the head of the CCHS Education Foundation.

The Passing of Jim Fralish

Carbondale's James "Jim" Fralish, 72, passed away Tuesday, August 30, 2011, at home after a courageous battle with a brain tumor. Fralish was an active member of the Carbondale and Southern Illinois communities. He was a founding member of the Southern Illinois Audubon Society and held many leadership positions in that organization. He was

also a part of the formation of Carbondale Soccer Incorporated and served on the board of directors.

His love of the sport and commitment to the youth of the community resulted in the establishment of both boys and girls soccer programs at Carbondale Community High School. A guiding force behind soccer in Carbondale, Fralish served as an assistant and head

coach for the boys' team various times. He was also head coach of the girls' team. He gave an immeasurable amount of positive influence to so many girls and boys. His name is commemorated at the Fralish Soccer Complex inside the Carbondale Superblock, which was made possible because of the Fralish family's generous donations, where both the boys and girls teams have called their home since 2003.

He was born November 4, 1938 in Berlin, Wisconsin. On June 20, 1964, at the age of twenty six, he married Kathleen Brown. Fralish received his bachelor's and master's degrees in forestry from Michigan State University. After receiving his Ph.D. in plant ecology from the University of Wisconsin in 1969, he accepted a position at Southern Illinois University – Carbondale in the forestry department, where he taught and did research until his retirement.

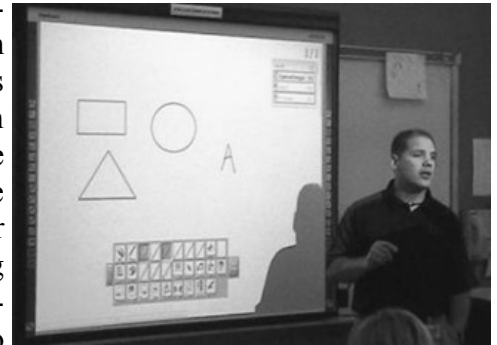

Haven't You Heard... CCHS Technology Update

At the beginning of the 2009-2010 school year, Carbondale Community High School (CCHS) received the Enhancing Education through Technology (EETT) grant. Over \$500,000 of technical equipment, such as interactive Hitachi StarBoards and data projectors, was given to the high school for teachers and students to use. Netbooks, iPads, tablets, science probes, graphing calculators, cameras, and student response systems are more devices that are changing the way students learn throughout their high school experience. New software and online resources are enhancing the school's computer systems. These resources and software include Rosetta Stone, Adobe suite, Moodle, and Skype. The teachers had to go through extensive training to learn how to use the new equipment and programs and then be able to integrate those into their classrooms. Certain teachers in each department have volunteered to be on the technology team to teach other teachers how to use the new equipment.

Ever since CCHS was granted the EETT grant, there have been many changes in the way students learn. Recent interviews with CCHS faculty and students explain how the grant has affected everyone differently. Jordan Pratt, a senior on the football team, says, "Ever since the school has gotten the grant, the football team has been able to film games. The team can see where mistakes were made and how to fix them." Dawna Barber, a

senior in the CCHS band, said, "It is easier to see problems in math and helps visual and hands on learners." Meredith Lipe, a new math teacher to us this year, explained how she loves her Hitachi StarBoard. Lipe says, "Geometry classes are easier to explain to students, and the examples given are much more helpful." Mr. Booth, the school principal, believes the EETT grant has kept the school current with 21st century technology upgrades. Booth also states that the grant has prepared students and teachers for the next level of new technology.
