- Course Requests: all changes must be submitted to Mrs. Krutsinger by MAY 8.
- Once schedules are finalized, there will be minimal movement/changes.

Summer classes @ JALC and CCHS Dual Credit

Keep in mind, **you are starting your college transcript** when you enroll in a dual credit or dual enrollment class.

- Dual Credit-- Taught by a CCHS teacher
- Dual Enrollment-- Taught on the JALC campus or online

Students receive JALC college credit for BOTH dual credit and dual enrollment courses. CCHS students do not receive high school credit for dual enrollment courses
