REST IN PEACE

Ben F. King, an alumnus of St Joseph in 1955, passed away in New York on May 9, 2024. Ben was an internationally known ornithologist, having graduated from Benedictine College in Atchison KS and Loyola University. He was a U S Navy veteran and went on to become a recognized expert on birds of Southeast Asia and China, spending a couple of years there in research after his separation from the Navy. On returning to the U. S. he went to Cornell in New York. He became known in birding circles for his detailed research studies and formed a firm called "Kingbird Tours" which ran birding tours to Southeast Asia and China for years. He used those travels to further his research and began to write articles and even a couple of books. Over the years he became internationally known and regarded as "the" expert on Asian bird species.

He was also associated with the New York Museum of Natural History for years and still worked with them until his health began to fail several years ago. He had lived in NYC for many years, finding it a convenient base for his touring business which he closed several years ago.

He never married and friends in NY and the Museum are working with his extensive archive of research work which I understand is at the Museum.

Ben and I were pretty good friends in school and he attended 2 or 3 of our small class reunions, and always stayed at my home. We were a small class, only 36 in 1955, and sadly quite a few less these days.
