UPDATE

Marysville Schools Emergency Levy on November 5, 2024

Marysville Schools is proposing a 5.5 mill emergency levy on the November 5, 2024, ballot to address a budget shortfall and maintain financial stability.

What is an Emergency Levy?

An emergency levy is a property tax providing a fixed sum of revenue each year for a set period, ensuring stable funding for the school district.

Why is the Levy Needed?

Since the last levy in 2008, the district has seen a significant reduction in Tangible Personal Property Tax revenue, which has impacted the budget. Marysville operates with one of the lowest revenues per pupil in the state.

Impact of the Levy If approved, the levy will generate \$6,443,102 annually for ten years, covering essential operational expenses and maintaining current service levels.

Cost to Taxpayers The levy will cost \$192.50 annually per \$100,000 of home value, or about \$16.04 per month.
