What is the WSISD DAEP?

The WSISD Discipline Alternative Education Program is a behavior modification program designed to serve students who have been removed from their home campus for violating the WSISD Code of Conduct or for students in WSISD who have been charged with a felony offense. DAEP exists to support students through behavior management, academics, and a structured environment.

My student has been assigned a DAEP Placement, what do we do next?

Your next step is to schedule and attend a DAEP Intake Meeting at the RISE ALTERNATIVE CAMPUS. Please call 817-367-1364 or scan the QR Code below to schedule an appointment.

The student and parent/guardian should attend the intake meeting. DAEP students must adhere to a stricter dress code while at DAEP. The dress code includes wearing a gray collared shirt and black dress pants or shorts. In addition, students are not allowed to wear hoodies, jackets with hoods, makeup or have long fingernails while attending DAEP.



Important DAEP Information:

- The DAEP school day is 8:15 AM to 3:15 PM, Monday thru Friday. Students should not be dropped off before 8:00am.
- No district transportation will be provided.
- No electronic devices (including cell phones) will be allowed in the classrooms.
- Breakfast and Lunch will be provided or you may bring your lunch (no fast food or carbonated drinks).
- All drinks must be sealed.
- Students enter through a metal detector each day and belongings will be searched.
- Students assigned to DAEP are not allowed to return to their home campus, or any WSISD campus or location where WSISD activities are taking place during their DAEP placement.
- Students will receive instruction in their core subjects and any elective offered at WSISD DAEP. Students should show up on time and ready to work each day.

It is imperative that students, parents/guardians, DAEP staff, and Home Campus staff work together to ensure each student's successful completion of their DAEP Placement and have a smooth transition back to their home campus.
