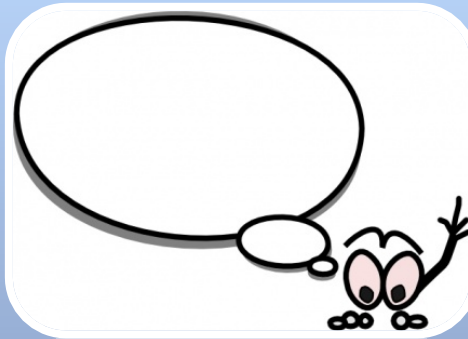
Who did you sit by in the cafeteria today?

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Language Development

Language development is one of the most important life-long skills. Talking with young children about their day promotes language development as well as social-emotional development.

Parents want their children to be successful and research indicates that their involvement makes a difference. These questions are intended to help start conversations that will strengthen family connections, increase oral language development and support success. Don't feel that you have to ask every question in the book, they are meant to be ideas to get you started.

- What did you have the most fun doing today?
- Did you play outside today? Did you swing or slide?
- Who did you sit by today?
- What was the nicest thing you did for someone today?
- Did your teacher read you a book today? What was it about?
- What was the funniest thing that happened today?
- Did you see your principal today?
- What was your favorite part of the day?
- Did you laugh today?
- What word did your teacher say most today?
- If you got to be the teacher tomorrow, what would you do?
- Tell me about three different times you used your pencil today.
- What do you think you should do more of at school?
- Who in your class do you think you could be nicer to?
- Did you run today?
