# **POLICY UPDATES**

# Medication Updates, Per New Board Policy Effective November 1, 2022

Medication Administration at school will only be performed when parent and clinician permission is provided in *writing*. This is the policy for over-the-counter and prescription medications (yes, including TUMS).

Families will be responsible for providing matching, properly labeled medications for over-the-counter medications, just as they would prescription, and a matching medication authorization form signed by the parent and the healthcare provider. Over-the-counter clinic "backup" stock will not be provided.

If students present to the clinic or office and request/need medication, they must have written

instructions/authorization on file and their medication stock to match signed, written instructions.





# IF YOU LIVE IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter

In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation

In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station

Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

You may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

### Eligible students have the right to:

- · Receive a free, appropriate public education.
- Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
- Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
- Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is their preference and is feasible.
  - \* If the school district believes that the school selected is not in his/her best interest, then the district must provide the student with a written explanation of its position and inform the student of his/her right to appeal its decision.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if requested.
- Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to the students' needs.

If you believe you may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available.

### Free School Meals for All Students Has Ended

When the 2021-2022 school year ended, so did free meals for every student. While the federal government funded a program that allowed all students access to free meals during the COVID-19 pandemic, Congress has declined to continue funding this program.

We understand this change may cause you to worry. However, there are important steps you can take <a href="NOW">NOW</a> to be sure your student receives the meals they need for the 2022-2023 school year.

If your student qualifies for free or reduced meals, they can still receive them this fall, but you <u>must take action</u> to make it happen. Please complete the **2022-2023 online application**, which is available at <a href="https://www.brightonk12.com/Page/7665">https://www.brightonk12.com/Page/7665</a> or go paperless with an online application on ParentConnect. Paper applications are also available at the school where your child attends.

If you do not qualify for free or reduced meals, you may begin depositing money into student accounts at any time to prepare for the cost of school lunches next year. Information on meal prices for the 2022-2023 school year are listed below;

If your student has a negative lunch account balance, we encourage you to pay it off as soon as possible and then begin depositing money into the account to prepare for the 2022-2023 school year.

Completing an application is the <u>only way</u> to be considered for free or reduced meals next school year.
