LABEL STUDENT'S PERSONAL ITEMS!

We cannot stress enough the importance of having your student's personal items labeled with permanent marker. Jackets, lunchboxes, pencil boxes, hats, water bottles (no glass water bottles!) and anything else your student could possibly lose at Maltby needs to be marked. Our Lost and Found bin is already filling up and this is only the fourth week of school. If there is a name on an item, we do our best to get it back to the student.

VISION SCREENING

LCDH is providing Vision Screening on **2/18 and 2/19 with rescreening on 2/20 for all 5**th **graders.** Please send a note if you DO NOT wish to have your 5th grader screened. If you have a 6th grader and would like them to be screened, send a note in giving permission to be screened. Screening is targeted for 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th graders and self-contained classes. Also screened are last year follow up and parent/teacher requests. If your students brings home a pink slip, please sign and return it.

IMPORTANT HEALTH INFORMATION!

Written authorization from a physician <u>is required</u> before school staff can dispense ANY medication (over the counter, homeopathic or prescription) to your son/daughter at school!

- Instructions must be specific for medication, dosage, time to administer and for "as needed" meds, the frequency and circumstances under which to administer the medication.
- Medication must be provided in the original prescription or manufacturer's container.
- Parents can come and administer medication anytime to their student.

Your cooperation is appreciated as we do our best to keep your children safe.

Attendance & Office Procedures

If your student is going to be absent from school please use our convenient twenty-four hour absence call-in line **(810) 299-3688**.

- -Please obtain a doctor's note to receive a medical "M" code for attendance.
- Please call when your student will be coming in late.
- You must call in each day that your child is absent.
- -Please call no later than 9:00 a.m. on the day of the absence.
- Students arriving late to school **must** report to the office to sign in.
- Please send in a note for early dismissal and have it signed by office personnel.
- We will only allow students to be signed out by people who are listed on the emergency card.

<u>Transportation</u>: Students are responsible for their own transportation to/from Mt. Brighton each time they ski/board. There is no PA system on the hill, so either make arrangements for pickup ahead of time or text your student.

<u>Student Behavior</u>: This is a school-sponsored club; therefore all Brighton Public School rules and code of conduct apply during skiing & boarding. If a student makes poor choices and does not follow the code of conduct for either Mt. Brighton or BPS, he/she will not be able to participate in BSBC outings. Our goal is to make this an enjoyable and safe club. Anyone failing to comply with the rules will be asked to leave. If a student is on probation or suspension with his/her school, he/she may be excluded from BSBC trips.

<u>Chaperones</u>: A Club Sponsor will be in the Lodge from 4:00-5:00pm to hand out lift tickets, rental equipment vouchers, etc. and to check that anyone who signed up is accounted for. After that, students are free to ski and board on their own. The check in time is strict. Sponsors want to have fun with the kids outdoors, so please be on time or students may not be able to get their tickets. After 5:00pm club sponsors may be on the hill.

<u>Clothing</u>: It gets cold on the mountain after the sun goes down, so dress in layers and always wear a windproof jacket and waterproof pants and a helmet. If you're unsure about buying specific outerwear, Summit Sports in Brighton is a great local resource. If you do bring extra clothing, use a locker to store your items.

Equipment: You are responsible for either bringing your own equipment, or renting your equipment. Don't leave your equipment unattended. A free ski/board corral is offered in the rental department. Use it if you don't want to lose your equipment. Mt. Brighton requires all skiers/boarders under age 18 to wear a helmet while on the hill. No exceptions.

<u>Identification</u>: Students should have their school ID on them when they are skiing with the club (if they have one). If something happens while the student is on a BSBC outing, ski patrol will know who to contact if they see their student ID card.

Leaving the Ski Area: Mt. Brighton is a large area and no one can keep track of all the students all the time. A sponsor is on the premises from 4:00-5:00pm. After that, students are expected to behave according to rules and code of conduct for both Brighton Public School and Mt. Brighton.

Lessons: Your student must be 7 years old or older to participate in the group lessons. You may purchase a 1-hour group lesson any week that you are skiing; you will just RSVP by Sunday of that week that you would like a ski or a board lesson. We will have a calendar with sign up spots for each week and month of skiing. If you're a first timer skier/boarder, we recommend you take a lesson. You will have more fun and be safer on the hill. You will sign up and pay for lessons in advance and receive a voucher once you arrive at Mt. Brighton. Your student will check in at the BSBC table in the lodge, pick up his/her tickets and vouchers, then go to the group lesson meeting place on the bunny hill. Lessons start promptly at 6pm.

<u>Lockers</u>: Mt. Brighton has small lockers available in the lowest portion of the building behind their equipment rental. Lockers are \$5 and \$7 (depending on size) and the user creates a passcode which allows him/her to access the locker as many times as he/she wants. Mt.

<u>Weather</u>: Winter can be fickle sometimes; if Mt. Brighton isn't open due to not enough snow to ski/board on a date your student is scheduled, you'll have a credit towards another date. If a date is cancelled due to an act of God, we will announce it by the end of the school day and try to post it on our Facebook Page. No refunds will be given for these dates.

<u>Reservations</u>: Each week you will be asked to RSVP so we know how many students will need lift tickets, lessons, rentals, etc. A Google Form will go out each week; it is the students' responsibility to complete the reservation form by Sunday evening. If we don't receive a reservation, it means the student will not be attending the following Tuesday / Wednesday. If you make a reservation you will be charged for whatever you ordered, even if you cancel at the last minute.

Refunds: There are no refunds in any ski club payments. This will be treated like all pay to play sports.

(Grades K-4) This 6 week class takes students on many multimedia art adventures! Students will learn techniques in clay and attachments and create their own working clock. After firing, the clocks will be painted and decorated with things like gemstones and glitter. A clock mechanism will be added before it is taken home, all it will need is a AA battery! A painting will be done while students learn about proper use of brushes and blending of paints.

After firing, the masks will be painted and decorated with things like gemstones, feathers, pipe cleaners and glitter. A painting will be done while students learn about proper use of brushes and blending of paints.

Art Adventures - 2

(Grades K-4) This 6 week class continues where Art Adventures 1 left off with more multi-media adventures. Students will create their own clay mask. After firing, the masks will be painted and decorated with things like gemstones, feathers, pipe cleaners and glitter. A painting and other 2D projects will also be created.

(Grades 5-6) In this 6 week class students will learn techniques in clay and attachments while making a large clay bowl. After firing, the bowls will be glazed with food safe glazes and can be used for food! A painting will also be done while students learn about proper use of brushes and blending of paints.

For all grades and both sessions there will be drawings adding color with marker, crayon, watercolors and chalk pastels! This class allows students to use and explore a wide variety of materials while creating their works of art all while incorporating the elements and principles of art. Students will learn what makes a good artistic composition, as well as, exploration of different media and continued growth of creativity! They will also receive an art book filled with fun activities. Projects are all adapted to the age and grade of each student.
