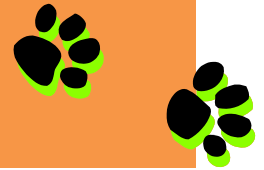

We are closing in on the end of the school year! It is hard to believe a year has gone by so quickly! Last Day of School...

If you have not heard yet our last day of school has been confirmed as **June 7th**. Dr. Gray communicated that we did qualify to have 3 state of emergency days forgiven. Our last day of school on June 7th will be a half day.

Parking Lot...

Just a gentle reminder, students are not permitted to walk in the parking lot themselves. Please meet your student on the sidewalk at pickup if you are parked in the middle of our lot. PLEASE DO NOT drop your student off in the parking lot at the corner near the handicap parking spots. We have seen several parents do this and the proper procedure if you do not wish to use the drop off lane is to park in the lot and walk your student to the sidewalk. We also ask that you please be patient and drive slow around our school- this is the time of year that many of our students who live close begin walking home again.

The warmer weather is close!! Please make sure your student's attire is in compliance with our dress code. IMPORTANT .. 6TH GRADE PARENTS .. IMPORTANT

For all students entering the 7th grade, it is required by law that the school district report their immunization status to the local health department. With that being said, all children who attend school in Michigan are required by state law to be fully immunized to their standards. I have attached a document below that reviews Michigan's vaccination requirements for school. Please review your child's immunization status with their Physician as soon as possible to ensure compliance. Note that the Meningococcal and Tdap vaccinations are required for children 11 years of age or older upon entry into 7th grade. If you have a personal objection to immunizations, please contact the Livingston County Health Department ASAP to set up an appointment to obtain a certified immunization waiver, 517-546-9850. If your student is not fully immunized in accordance with the Michigan law OR does not have a certified immunization waiver on file by the first day of the 2019/2020 school year, they will be excluded from attending Scranton Middle School until compliance is met. Please feel free to contact me with any questions or to inquire about the current record of your student's immunization status.

PARENTS VACCINES REQUIRED FOR SCHOOL ENTRY IN MICHIGAN

Whenever children are brought into group settings, there is a chance for diseases to spread. Children must follow state vaccine laws in order to attend school. These laws are the minimum standard to help prevent disease outbreaks in school settings. The best way to protect your child from other serious diseases is to follow the recommended vaccination schedule at www.cdc.gov/vaccines. Talk to your health care provider to make sure your child is fully protected.

Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (DTP, DTaP, Tdap)	4 doses DTP or DTaP 1 dose must be at or after 4 years of age	4 doses D and T or 3 doses Td if 1st dose given at or after 1 year of age 1 dose Tdap at 11 years of age or older upon entry into 7th grade or higher
Polio	4 doses 3 doses if dose 3 was given at or after 4 years of age	
Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)*	2 doses at or after 12 months of age	
Hepatitis B*	3 doses	
Meningococcal Conjugate (MenACWY)	None	1 dose at 11 years of age or older upon entry into 7th grade or higher
Varicella (Chickenpox)*	2 doses at or after 12 months of age or Current lab immunity or History of varicella disease	

During disease outbreaks, incompletely vaccinated students may be excluded from school. Parents and guardians choosing to decline vaccines must obtain a certified non-medical waiver from a local health department. Read more about waivers at www.michigan.gov/immunize.

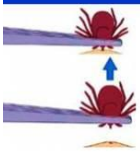
*If the child has not received these vaccines, documented immunity is required.
All doses of vaccines must be valid (correct spacing and ages) for school entry purposes.

TICK INFORMATION.....

It is that time of the year when kids are outside a lot more and so are ticks! Please be sure to check your children thoroughly for ticks on their clothing and skin after playing outdoors. Common places for ticks to nestle include: under the arms, in and around the ears, inside the belly button, back of the knees, in and around hair, between the legs and around the waist. If a tick is found, remove it as soon as possible. For detailed information about tick removal, see www.cdc.gov/ticks/removing_a_tick.html. If your child develops a rash or a fever within several weeks of being bit by a tick, seek medical attention.

**Tick removal tips**

- Remove as quickly as possible.
- Use tweezers to grasp the head close to the skin.
- Pull gently.
- Use soap and water, or antiseptic on the bite.

...preventing tick bites

- Use a repellent containing no more than 30 percent DEET.
- Use repellents that contain permethrin on clothing.
- See your healthcare provider if you have symptoms of fever, rash, body aches or fatigue after a tick bite.
