#### M-Step Testing...

Our 5<sup>th</sup> Grade have started the M-Step Assessments and will be testing in the areas of English, Math, and Social Studies and Science. The testing window for our 5<sup>th</sup> graders continues through April 18th. Our 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will be testing in the areas of English, Math. The 6<sup>th</sup> grade testing window runs from April 30<sup>th</sup> to May 2nd. Please do your best to avoid appointments or anything that would remove students for testing days. #### Math Placements for Next Year's 7th Grade...

If your student qualified to take the Algebra 7 placement test an invitation was sent home. Invitations to take the placement test are based on student M-Step and NWEA scores. Testing will take place the morning of April 24th at Maltby. Parents please remember that 7<sup>th</sup> grade Algebra is only developmentally appropriate for a very small percentage of our students. Our 7<sup>th</sup> grade Pre-Algebra class is a very appropriate placement developmentally for the vast majority of our students, and will still permit them to progress all of the way through our most advanced math classes in high school.

## IMPORTANT .. 6<sup>TH</sup> GRADE PARENTS .. IMPORTANT

For all students entering the 7<sup>th</sup> grade, it is required by law that the school district report their immunization status to the local health department. With that being said, all children who attend school in Michigan are required by state law to be fully immunized to their standards. I have attached a document below that reviews Michigan's vaccination requirements for school. Please review your child's immunization status with their Physician as soon as possible to ensure compliance. Note that the Meningococcal and Tdap vaccinations are required for children 11 years of age or older upon entry into 7th grade. If you have a personal objection to immunizations, please contact the Livingston County Health Department ASAP to set up an appointment to obtain a certified immunization waiver, 517-546-9850. If your student is not fully immunized in accordance with the Michigan law OR does not have a certified immunization waiver on file by the first day of the 2019/2020 school year, they will be excluded from attending Scranton Middle School until compliance is met. Please feel free to contact me with any questions or to inquire about the current record of your student's immunization status. See flyer on page 4.

## DID YOU ORDER A YEARBOOK?

Yearbooks MUST be ordered online.....if you haven't already done so, please visit YearbookOrderCenter.com. Your order number is 3719. The cost is now \$35 until April 20<sup>st</sup>. After that date, the cost is \$40.00 and you must either send in a check or cash to Maltby. Online orders will be unavailable after April 20<sup>th</sup>.

If you can't remember if you ordered a yearbook, please go to the same sight and double click on New Order, type in the order number 3719 and then click Review Existing Order.

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## Middle School Math Information:

For the majority of incoming 7th graders, the most developmentally appropriate math placement is Pre-Algebra (7th Grade Math). Then in 8th grade, students who have met the placement criteria will be invited to take High School Algebra 1. To ensure the most appropriate math placement for each student, multiple data points are used to determine which math course will best meet your student's needs. A small percentage of students may be ready to advance into High School Algebra 1 in 7th grade. To be certain that prerequisite understandings and skills are in place, an Algebra 1 Placement test will be administered to qualifying students.

- Due to the fact that any student taking High School Algebra 1 in 7th grade will be skipping two full years of foundational middle school mathematics, the criteria for the Algebra 1 Placement Test is very rigorous:
  - a. Students must have a earned an Advanced or Proficient (Performance Level 4 or 3) on the Spring 2018 M-Step Mathematics Test.
  - b. Students must have also scored in the 90th percentile or higher on the nationally normed NWEA (Measure of Academic Progress).
- For students who meet the criteria, an invitation letter to take the Algebra 1 Placement test will be sent home on Friday, April 5, 2019.
- During the school day on April 24, 2019, the Algebra 1 Placement test will be administered at Maltby by MIS Math teachers and BAS Math Coach.

Over the next few months we will be developing class lists and student assignments for the 2019-20 school year. If you have important information regarding your child that the school staff may not have, this form provides an opportunity to share that information with school personnel. Please note that requests for a specific teacher CANNOT be honored. Forms are available at all elementary offices and the Maltby office starting this Friday, May 12th and MUST be returned by May 10, 2019.

## **PARENTS** VACCINES REQUIRED FOR SCHOOL ENTRY IN MICHIGAN


Whenever children are brought into group settings, there is a chance for diseases to spread. Children must follow state vaccine laws in order to attend school. These laws are the minimum standard to help prevent disease outbreaks in school settings. The best way to protect your child from other serious diseases is to follow the recommended vaccination schedule at www.cdc.gov/vaccines. Talk to your health care provider to make sure your child is fully protected.

During disease outbreaks, incompletely vaccinated students may be excluded from school. Parents and guardians choosing to decline vaccines must obtain a certified non-medical waiver from a local health department. Read more about waivers at www.michigan.gov/immunize. \*If the child has not received these vaccines, documented immunity is required. All doses of vaccines must be valid (correct spacing and ages) for school entry purposes.

Raptor is being installed in all Brighton schools to supplement the district's program of campus safety for students and staff. Part of keeping students and faculty safe is knowing who is in our buildings at all times, and the Raptor system will allow us to do that. Raptor will better inform us on the visitors, contractors, and volunteers seeking entry into our schools, and provide us with a safer environment for our students and staff.

The visitor process will appear like this:

- Upon entering a district building, visitors will be asked to present an ID, which may be scanned or manually entered into the system.
- If a parent or guardian does not have government-issued identification, the school staff member can ask to see another form of ID and manually enter the person's name into the Raptor system to perform a background check. The Raptor system only checks the visitor's name and date of birth, no other data from the ID is gathered or recorded, and information is not shared with any outside agency.
- Once entry is approved, Raptor will issue a badge that identifies the visitor, the date, and the purpose for his/her visit.

It's important to note that a visitor's badge will not be necessary for those who visit our schools simply to drop off an item in the office or pick up paperwork. If a person does not have identification, he/she can still be given access to the building, but will be escorted by a school staff member.

The safety of our students is our highest priority and the Raptor visitor management system provides a consistent means for keeping away people who may present a danger to our students. We want to thank our community in advance for your understanding and support for enhancing building safety protocols in Brighton Area Schools.
