

WEEKLY SCHEDULE

1st and 2nd Grade: Fundamental skills with 1-2 practices per week (Sun and/or Tue) + 1 or 2 scrimmages at the end of the season. Practice begins Tuesday April 17th and includes a team T-shirt. Program cost is \$60.

3rd and 4th Grade: Tuesday, Thursday practices and games, occasional Saturdays for tournament play, possibly occasional OPTIONAL Sunday practice. 8-10 league games plus 2-3 tournaments. Registration fees are \$200 and a \$56 player uniform fee* may apply per player.

5-8th Grade: Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday practices. Most games will be Tuesday or Thursday, occasional Sundays + Saturdays for tournament play. Likely 10-15 league games plus 3-4 tournaments. Registration fees are \$220 and a \$56 player uniform fee* may apply per player.

*Uniform Note: We will be using the same uniforms as last year. If the uniform from last season still fits then no need to purchase another one. If your daughter is new this year or the uniform doesn't fit, a new one will need to be ordered. This will be the final year for this current uniform.
