Student Survey

BHS student Taylor Stacy shared her survey she conducted for a research project. Her subject was "Sexual Assault/Sexual Harassment" She had 65 responses to her survey, of which 75% were female students.

Arnella Park shared she would use the survey with her current Health students as they recently had a 3-day presentation from LACASA on the subject. Will work with Safe schools sub-committee to identify an older target audience (11th grade? More males?), and add the question, "Did you take the health class at BHS with a BHS teacher?"

We will explore having Kayla Grant from LACASA present on Sexual Assault/Sexual Harassment to parents.

3. 5th, 7th and HS Sex Education Materials Review

a. Reproductive Health

Committee agrees the curriculum is appropriate and meets the needs of the students.

b. Videos

HS and 7th grade videos are age-appropriate and up to date. We will begin reviewing 5th grade videos. Both are dated and from the 1980's. The Aids video has inaccurate information being presented. Maltby staff will begin the process.

There is a concern about the JK-4 Health lessons that were identified and approved to be taught this year. Elementary teachers are having difficult time trying to fit the lessons

into the day with the other curriculum mandates, assessments and enrichment programs. Henry has agreed to explore moving some, or all, lessons to the PE teachers.
