Overview of the Strategic Planning Document

- During the 2021-22 school year, a large group of parents, students and staff met numerous times to evaluate the current state of the district and to set forth a vision for the next 5 years.
- In June of 2022, the Brighton Board of Education approved the strategic plan as presented
- Three measurable outcomes were identified and these will be evaluated annually by the strategic planning committee and the board of education. This include achievement, post-secondary attainment and culture for learning and growth.
- There are three primary pathways to achieve these measurable objectives:
 - Pathway 1: Curriculum and Instruction
 - Pathway 2: Assessment and Intervention
 - Pathway 3: Culture for Learning and Growth
- This is a 5 year plan that will be evaluated, reviewed and potentially adjusted annually.





Indicators of Success

 Achievement - 66% of Brighton Area Schools students will meet college readiness standards in math and ELA by 2027.

2. Post-Secondary

- a. 90% of Brighton Area Schools graduates will continue their education at a 4-year university, a community college, a certification-based trade school, a career-technical internship program or enlist in the armed forces within one year of graduation.
- b. Within 5 years of graduation, 66% of Brighton Area Schools graduates will have successfully completed a university degree, earned an associate's degree, a trade certification, completed a career-technical internship program or remain a member of the armed forces.
- 3. <u>Culture for Learning</u> While the ultimate target for each of these indicators would be to have 100% of students experiencing positive progress in each area, benchmark improvements will be measured annually assessing student's progress towards their goals, the level of connection and support with the school environment, the connections to their future careers and the well-rounded nature of their BAS experience.





Pathway to Success #1: Curriculum and Instruction

- **a.** Goal #1 (Core Curriculum): Brighton Area Schools will maintain a viable and guaranteed K-12 core curriculum that is aligned with State standards.
 - i. <u>Strategy #1:</u> Brighton Area Schools will cultivate a district curriculum process that will evaluate, revise, develop, norm, and monitor the district's K-12 curriculum including a system to advise and maintain the curriculum in collaboration with district leadership.
 - *ii.* Strategy #2. Brighton Area Schools will institute a district curriculum warehousing system in order to increase accessibility and usability for staff and train staff on the purpose and use of the resource.
- **b.** Goal #2 (Explore and Connections to Interest Areas). Brighton Area Schools will ensure that all students will be exposed to a variety of topics and have opportunities to explore their interests as part of the district's curriculum and programs.
 - i. <u>Strategy #1</u>: Brighton Area Schools will infuse the curriculum with a continuum of career awareness and preparation while creating opportunities for students to focus on their future.
 - ii. <u>Strategy #2:</u> Brighton Area Schools will provide a progression of STEAM opportunities for students and will focus on hands-on learning with real world applications including problems solving, critical thinking, and creativity.





Pathway to Success #1: Curriculum and Instruction

- **a.** Goal #3 (High Quality Instruction): Brighton Area Schools will provide challenging, engaging, and relevant learning opportunities for all students in a supportive and collaborative environment.
 - i. <u>Strategy #1</u>: High-quality classroom culture will be respectful, rigorous, and conducive to learning. Students feel free to contribute their ideas and questions, and challenge themselves to interact purposely and engage deeply with the content.
 - ii. <u>Strategy #2:</u> Learning opportunities will be student-centered and focus on thinking, inquiry, and use of knowledge (application) to provide personalized and meaningful experiences.
 - iii. <u>Strategy #3:</u> Instruction will be grounded in curriculum and dependent on student proficiency and growth, intentional planning, formative assessment, data analysis, and reflection.
- **b.** Goals #4 (Continuous Professional Learning): Brighton Area Schools will ensure that professional learning is relevant and meaningful for all staff, and connected to building and district goals.
 - i. <u>Strategy #1:</u> Brighton Area Schools will continue to annually and collaboratively review professional learning, assessing the needs of staff, and using this information to plan for future professional learning.
 - ii. <u>Strategy #2</u>: Professional learning will focus on experiences that cultivate skills, knowledge, and dispositions that enhance instructional and assessment practices, deepen our understanding of learning/learners, support authentic collaboration, and include feedback and reflection.





Pathway to Success #2: Assessment and Intervention

- a. Goal #1 (Effective Assessment System) Brighton Area Schools will maintain a comprehensive, coherent, and continuous K-12 assessment system to foster student learning, success, and opportunity.
 - i. <u>Strategy #1</u>: Brighton Area Schools' balanced assessment system combines frequent classroom assessments with periodic, standardized assessments to provide information on student outcomes and improve the education and achievement of all students.
 - ii. <u>Strategy #2</u>: Brighton Area Schools will continue to develop and utilize aligned informative quality assessments based on clarity, validity, and flexibility and are reflective of student learning and outcomes.
- **b.** Goal #2 (Intervention) Brighton Area schools will utilize data to monitor student progress, provide intervention, and ensure all students receive the appropriate level of support necessary for academic, behavioral, and social success.
 - i. <u>Strategy #1</u> (Tiered Support System): Brighton Area Schools will fully implement a Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) and use this system to identify and assist students in need of additional support.
 - ii. <u>Strategy #2</u> (Student Academic Failure): The Brighton Area Schools will develop a systematic approach to address student academic failure.





Pathway to Success #3: Culture for Learning and Growth

- **a. Goal #1 (Environment for Learning and Growth)** The Brighton Area Schools, through strategic and intentional efforts, will provide the optimal environment for student learning and growth.
 - i. <u>Strategy #1</u> (Relationships): All students within the Brighton Area Schools will have positive, meaningful relationships with peers and staff.
 - 1. Action Step #1 (Peers): The district will create age-appropriate systems to gather student feedback regarding positive peer-to-peer relationships and will develop and/or expand programs to assist students in need.
 - 2. Action Step #2 (Staff): Programs will be developed at each level to ensure that all Brighton Area Schools students have at least one positive and meaningful connection with a BAS staff member.
 - ii. <u>Strategy #2</u> (Student Wellness): In addition to supporting students that may currently be in crisis, the Brighton Area Schools will develop and/or expand educational programming to proactively address wellness topics including stress management, healthy habits, and student safety.
 - iii. <u>Strategy #3</u> (Involvement Beyond the Traditional School Day): The Brighton Area Schools will ensure that students have an opportunity to grow and explore beyond the traditional school day.
 - 1. Action Step #1 (Involvement): The district will create age-appropriate systems to annually gather student feedback regarding their involvement and interests. Additionally, the district and individual schools will use this data to explore new and/or expanded programming to match with student interests.
 - 2. Action Step #2 (Service and Leadership): The district will examine current programming and educational opportunities that support character development through service to others and leadership.





Pathway to Success #3: Culture for Learning and Growth

- **a. Goal #2 (Mindset for Learning and Growth)** The Brighton Area Schools, students, and parents will work collaboratively to set high expectations for learning, behavior, and well-being.
 - i. <u>Strategy #1</u> (Your Best, Your Growth, Your Future): The Brighton Area Schools, students, and parents will work collaboratively to set high expectations for learning, behavior, and well-being.
 - 1. Action Step #1 (Learning about Setting Goals): Training will be conducted to assist students, staff, and parents with setting meaningful goals for each student.
 - 2. Action Step #2 (Personal Growth Plans): At each level, an age-appropriate system will be developed for students to both set and monitor personal growth goals throughout the school year. Goal areas will minimally include career interests, academic goals for the current year, behavioral goals, and goals connected to student well-being.
 - ii. <u>Strategy #2</u> (Learning Focused on Mindset) Through strategic and intentional programming and learning opportunities, the Brighton Area Schools will reinforce the mindset and behaviors that will support student learning and growth.
 - 1. Action Step #1 (Monthly Educational Themes and Messaging):
 - a. Each year, the district will create a calendar where one or more mindset or behavior will be chosen each month for focus and study.
 - b. Age-appropriate messaging will be placed throughout the district to reinforce thematic lessons focused on the mindset and behaviors that support student learning and growth.
 - Action Step #2 (Deliberate Programming to Support Mindset and Behaviors): At each level, uniform
 programming will be identified that will support and guide staff efforts to teach the mindset and behaviors
 needed to support student learning.
