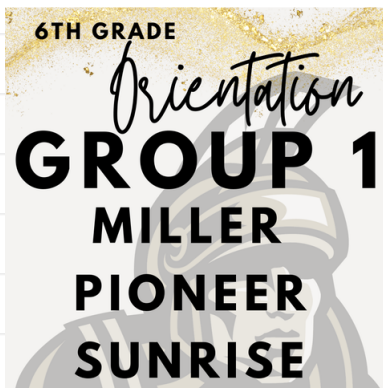



Lunch Schedule

Lunch Period

We operate a closed noon period. All students will remain inside the school building for lunch. Students can eat school lunch, bring a lunch from home (milk may be purchased at the school), or if they choose not to eat, a place will be provided for them to spend their time. ***Parents must come into the office and sign your child out if you plan to take them out for lunch. Students are not allowed to bring outside food or drinks back with them, so please have them finish it before checking back in.***

LINQ Connect Lunch Money

We operate a computerized lunch payment program. Students use their school ID number to access their account. Breakfast is served from 7:30 - 8:00 a.m. for \$1.55 and lunch is \$2.85. Students are notified by the cashier when their account dips to a low balance. Please help in monitoring your child's account to ensure they have adequate funds. A la carte items range from \$.40 to \$2.50. Meal payment may be brought to Student Services or through the district's online payment program, [LINQ Connect](#). **If paying by check, please write the student's ID number on the check.** *Sorry for the inconvenience, but we do not accept payment by card in school.*

Parent Reminders

School Safety

At Simle, we recognize that safety for our students is an important issue. Simle has developed a comprehensive safe school plan to ensure our students' safety. Our staff, parent advisory council and our school emergency team have reviewed this plan. Specific procedures have been put in place should a safety emergency arise at our school.

Student Information Updates

Please notify us of any changes to home, work, and emergency contacts phone numbers. It is very important that we have current information as those numbers are used for alerts. Address changes must be completed online through the PowerSchool Parent Portal. More information can be found [here](#) regarding address changes.

Dropping Students Off at School

Please do not double park in front of the school. This causes congestion and danger for students on foot. Please do not drop off or pick up students in the parking places reserved for staff and school buses. This will help in getting the area cleared as quickly as possible. Attempt to meet your child in a designated spot near the school to avoid congestion. Students arriving at school before 8:00 a.m. may go to the cafeteria for breakfast, to their assigned grade level gathering area, or remain outside. In the morning, students can be dropped off on both the West side (19th Street) or East side (Simle Dr.) entrances. Once the school day begins at 8:08 a.m., all students must enter on the East side entrance. This is the same for any guests entering the building.

Picking Up Students at School

All buses will load and unload on the West side of the building at the 19th Street entrance. After school, we ask parents to NOT pick up their students on the West side, as it is for buses only. Parents can pick students up to the North, East, or South of the campus. If you have any questions, please let us know.

Physical Education Uniforms

It is required that all students taking physical education wear the shirt that is being used in all BPS middle and high schools. Shirts may be purchased for \$5 on MyPaymentsPlus and then picked up from the gym instructor once school starts. Students can also wear the same shirt from last year, or from a sibling, and they are more than welcome to purchase more than one if they would like an extra. Students are also required to wear tennis shoes.

Report Cards

Teachers will report your child's progress on PowerSchool, which is what we encourage parents to use to view their child's grades. End of nine-week dates are October 27, January 10, March 21, and May 23. The link to your student's 1st Semester report cards will be emailed Friday January 24, 2025. The final report card link will be emailed on Friday, May 30, 2025. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's progress, feel free to call or make an appointment with your child's team.

Parents' Right to Know Clause

Through federal education law, parents have the right to request information on the professional qualifications of the teachers and paraprofessionals at our school. If you are interested in learning this information, please contact the school administration office at 701-323-4600. Upon this request, you will receive a detailed explanation of licensing, education, and experience of our teachers. You will also receive information regarding the names and qualifications of the paraprofessionals at our school.

ABSENCE EXCUSES - PHONE - 323-4603

Parents are required to notify the attendance office of any student absences. You can either call, email sms_attendance@bismarckschools.org, or send a note with your student to drop off in the main office. This should be done immediately the morning of the absence. You may need to leave a voicemail if you call as the main office can be quite busy. Students will be marked unexcused by their teachers if they are not in the class when it starts and by the attendance office if we are not notified by a parent that the student will be absent. Please be patient with us as we manually enter each student's absence. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Sending Payments to School

Because students need to bring money to school for lunch, sports fees, lab fees, etc., we ask that you ***do not combine checks for these fees***. It would be helpful if you would note on the memo part of the check the student's name and purpose of the check (Memo: Brian Smith - Football fee). ***The office does not have the ability to make change*** and all fees are distributed to separate accounts for bookkeeping purposes.

PowerSchool Parent Portal

Parents and guardians should have their own PowerSchool account; we ask that you do not use your student's account. With your own account, you will have access to each of your children's information such as their grades, attendance, and the daily bulletin through the PowerSchool Parent Portal. The account will remain the same from year to year, and school to school. If you have not created an account, please visit [PowerSchool](#) to do so. The PowerSchool Parent Portal is unavailable during the summer.

Cell Phone Policy

Cell phones are not to be visible and kept in lockers. If a student has a cell phone visible, they will be asked to put it in their locker. A student not willing to follow this policy will be asked to put it in an assigned place and picked up at the end of the period. Continued defiance with this plan will result in a referral to the school administrative office. Further, the school is not responsible for personal property, which includes cell phones.

- * one dose of Dtap (pediatric diphtheria, tetanus, and acellular pertussis) vaccine must have been given on or after the fourth birthday. Only four doses are necessary if the fourth dose was administered on or after the fourth birthday. Three doses of Tdap (adolescent/tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis) Td are required for children ages seven or older who were not previously vaccinated. Tdap should be used as the first dose followed by two doses of Td for children age seven or older not previously vaccinated.
 - † For public vaccination, in an IPV or IPV/OPV schedule one dose must have been given on or after the fourth birthday. The final dose in the series should be administered on or after the fourth birthday and at least six months after the previous dose. If four doses are administered prior to age four, a fifth dose should be administered on or after age four. Only three doses of IPV are required if the third dose is given on or after the fourth birthday. Children born before August 2009 only need four doses separated by at least four weeks. These children do not need a dose after the age of four.
 - ‡ Any doses of OPV administered after April 2, 2016, should not be counted as valid, because it was bivalent or monovalent vaccine, rather than trivalent. The child should be re-vaccinated with IPV vaccine, according to:
 - † One dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV4) must have been given on or after the tenth birthday. The second dose of MCV4 must be given on or after the sixteenth birthday. If the first dose of MCV4 is given after the sixteenth birthday, then only one dose of MCV4 is required for eleventh and twelfth grade.
 - ‡ One dose of Tdap must have been given on or after the eleventh birthday.
- Exemptions**
- Students may be exempt from immunization requirements for the following reasons:
 - Medical Exemption:** Requires a certificate signed by a licensed physician stating that the physical condition of the child is such that immunization would endanger the life or health of the child.
 - Personal Belief or Religious Belief Exemption:** Requires a certificate signed by the parent or guardian who sincerely held philosophical, moral, or religious belief is opposed to such immunization.
 - History of Disease Exemption:** Requires a certificate signed by a physician stating that the child has a reliable history of disease. History of disease exemptions may only be claimed for hepatitis B, varicella, measles, mumps, or rubella.
- Exclusion**
- All children must be up to date according to the school immunization requirements or have claimed an exemption. **By October 1st** of each school year or they must be excluded from school. Children enrolling in school after October 1st have 30 days to be up-to-date or claim an exemption or they must be excluded from school.

Illness During School Hours

Simle will be staffed with a nurse, part-time. Students should see the nurse if available, if not then go to the main office to notify their parents when they are ill. Parents must come into the school office to sign their child out of school.

To Return to School After Illness Your Child Must

- Be without vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours
- Be without an uncontrolled or persistent cough
- Have an oral temperature less than 100 degrees *without the use of medication*
- Feel well enough to take part in the usual school day

Medications

Under most circumstances, prescribed or non-prescribed medication should be dispensed before or after school, and under parent or medical supervision. If you would like staff to administer, or have your student self-administer any medication while on school property or during district-sponsored events, his/her parent must first complete the *Medication Administration Authorization: Middle/High Schools* form. If written parental authorization is not on file at our school, students' medication may be confiscated, and parents notified.

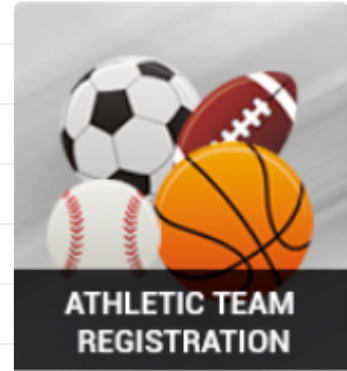

****STUDENTS WILL NEED AN UPDATED PHYSICAL EACH YEAR. PHYSICALS COMPLETED AFTER 4/15/24 WILL COUNT FOR THE 2024-25 SCHOOL YEAR****

1. The Rschool registration site will not allow you to register without providing documentation of your child's completed physical exam.
 2. **VERY IMPORTANT - ALL athletes must have their physical exam AND online registration completed prior to the first practice date of the activity they are participating in. They CANNOT practice until these items are complete!**
 3. Yearly physicals are not *required* for 6th grade activities, though 6th grade students are *encouraged* to have a yearly physical completed before participating.
- Pay your activity fee online through MyPaymentsPlus or in the office.



Activity Fees

Please have your activity fees paid before the first practice date.

- \$40/season, \$100 maximum per year/student, family maximum

\$200/family

- \$20/season for 6th grade activities
- \$50.00/activity for all high school activities, \$125 maximum per student
