

Board of Directors Input: Key Factors for a Successful Strategic Plan

- Intentionally and proactively ensure new voices are included seek input beyond those who have traditionally provided input
- Demonstrate that input has been heard and understood (including previous input)
- Use a process that is straightforward, easy to understand, and well communicated through a variety of methods that reach all stakeholders
- Begin with a clear vision of what we want the school district to become and build a plan to accomplish that
- Set priorities and focus on the most impactful areas
- Think creatively and imaginatively
- Understand lessons from the past and avoid continuing unproductive practices



Board of Directors Input: Key Factors for a Successful Strategic Plan

- Clearly define roles for administrative leadership and the Board of Directors and create a productive structure for decision-making
- Establish buy-in by those who have to do the work leadership, schools, central offices
- Build the plan around sound, proven educational practices
- Build solid systems to manage implementation
- Manage expectations about what the plan will accomplish and the required timeframes; cannot be all things



Board of Directors Input: Key Factors for a Successful Strategic Plan

- Allow for customization to meet student needs at individual schools
- Partner with others to achieve the plan
- Maintain transparency and honesty about priorities, accomplishments, constraints, and barriers
- Create a system of accountability with clear measures, reporting, and course corrections
