District Realignment Recommendations: School closings and reconfigurations

- Superintendent Lane presented initial recommendations on August 4, 2011.
- As a result of feedback from the Board and community meetings, the Administration explored several additional considerations.
- Several adjustments are being incorporated into the final recommendations for Board discussion on November 7, and Board approval on November 22, 2011.

Revisions to August 4th Recommendations

November 7th District Realignment Plan revisions include:

- Closing 8 schools instead of 7
 - Pittsburgh Perry closes but building remains open
- Opening two New Schools instead of one
 - Opening a New North Side High School in the Perry building (current CTE and JROTC programs remain at Oliver as per August 4th recommendation)
- Keeping Early Childhood Program in Chartiers building vs. moving it to Langley building
- Changing from previously recommended PreK-8 to a K-8 school in the Langley building

Further Clarification on School Reconfigurations

- Pittsburgh Morrow PreK-5: Expands from PreK-5 to PreK-8
 - PreK-4 in Morrow and 5-8 in Rooney building
 - School will grow by adding one grade per year:
 - 6th grade in the 2012-13 school year
 - 7th grade in 2013-14
 - 8th grade in 2014-15
 - Any students in the grades 6-8 in the new Morrow feeder pattern will be offered the a choice between Pittsburgh Allegheny and Pittsburgh Schiller until the grade becomes available at Pittsburgh Morrow
 - The school would expand to the Rooney facility at the start of the 2013-14 school year
- Pittsburgh Westwood K-8: Changes from K-8 to K-5
