Grade 9 - eLearning - Day 1

The following eLearning assignments must be completed in all four core subject areas, including English, Math, Science, & Social Studies. Students are encouraged to contact their teachers for questions pertaining to each assignment.

ELA

For this assignment, you will write a letter to your English teacher introducing yourself and sharing information that will help him/her get to know you better. Below are a list of questions that may give you some ideas:

- How do you feel about school? What are your hopes for this school year? What do you hope to accomplish after high school?
- What are your talents? Tell me about the things that you're good at, that make you feel proud, and that you've accomplished in your life.
- Tell me about your family. How do you get along? Who are you closest to? What are unique things that your family likes to do or traditions you celebrate?
- What do you enjoy doing? What are your favorite foods, music artists, sports, celebrities, movies/shows, books, etc?

Requirements:

- Use letter format (greeting, body, closing)
- Minimum of 250 words

Math

List eight times during a typical day that you would use <u>addition</u> to figure something out. Explain in words why addition would be used for each situation that you listed.

List eight times during a typical day that you would use <u>subtraction</u> to figure something out. Explain in words why subtraction would be used for each situation that you listed.

List eight times during a typical day that you would use <u>multiplication</u> to figure something out. Explain in words why multiplication would be used for each situation that you listed.

List eight times during a typical day that you would use <u>division</u> to figure something out. Explain in words why division would be used for each situation that you listed.

Science

Write a conversation between a tornado and a hurricane in which each tries to persuade the other that it is more dangerous. Please have at least 250 words in your persuasive argument.

Social Studies

Create a travel brochure for your hometown that includes the following:

- A map of the city and surrounding areas to include major local landmarks and attractions.
- A brief description of the town's physical geography (landscape, climate, rivers, etc.).
- Information on the culture (local food, religion, festivals, traditions)
- Interesting facts about the town.
- Images that depict the town you would want travelers to be aware of when visiting.
