Besides the memories of the Knights' 1974 season, Joe Marx will carry something extra with him when he graduates. He will not only take with him two years' worth of All-Conference honors (last year The Great River Conference and this year in the Wright Country), but also Joe was named to the November 21 WCCO Radio All-State Team of the Week on that station's prep parade program. The honor that probably is the most prestigous of his awards is his being named WCC Lineman of the Year by the 10 coaches in the conference. He was also named STMA's Most Valuable Player by the vote of his teammates.

STMA probably had one of the best kicking corps it has ever had, let by placekicker Loren Vetsch and punter Joe Marx, who took over for the injured Dave Schumacher. Among the accomplishments of this group is Loren Vetsch kicking a 39 yard field goal, the first in the school history. After this achievement, Loren was named the Star of the Week by The Minneapolis Star. Joe Marx, filling in for the injured Dave Schumacher, punted for a 34.7 yard average with his longest being 55 yards.

Why was Mr. Flahaven worth the trouble?


They said, "He's a good teacher. We really learned grammar. He's someone you can talk to. He'll chaperone anything."


