













Also, this year, the weather had brought us a few unexpected moments such as cheering in the hot blasing sun to, worst of all, the freezing cold and sleeting rain.


Even with all the new additions plus some complications, through thick and thin, we pulled together as a squad and had fun throughout the year.





Subsection champions included Robbie Kottke (119), Dan Vetsch (125), Eddy Dehmer (130) and Luke Barthel (145).


Senior Lance Barthel qualified for state as a junior, but an early season injury caused him to miss the rest of the season.

Eddy Sets New School Records










