






Juniors

It will certainly be a year to put the past behind us, live the present, and focus on the future. Also for us to go beyond just being classmates, and to pull together and become friends.






One-Act Play



Other parade entries included Grand Marshal Don Klaers, junior high floats, and a special senior class float.




































Career Day
















Winter Week



Started As Underdogs Ended As Topdogs








Tennis '91=Adjustment, footwork, endurance




Knights Win Sixth Straight WCC Title And Sixth Sub-Section: Mariotti State Champ











The five seniors led the team well throughout the season with great support by two juniors and a host of sophomores and freshmen.







Despite bad weather, canceled and rescheduled games, the Knights played twenty-one games ending with a record of twelve wins and nine losses.

































The flags of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania fly at the United Nations building after these Baltic states declared their independence.
