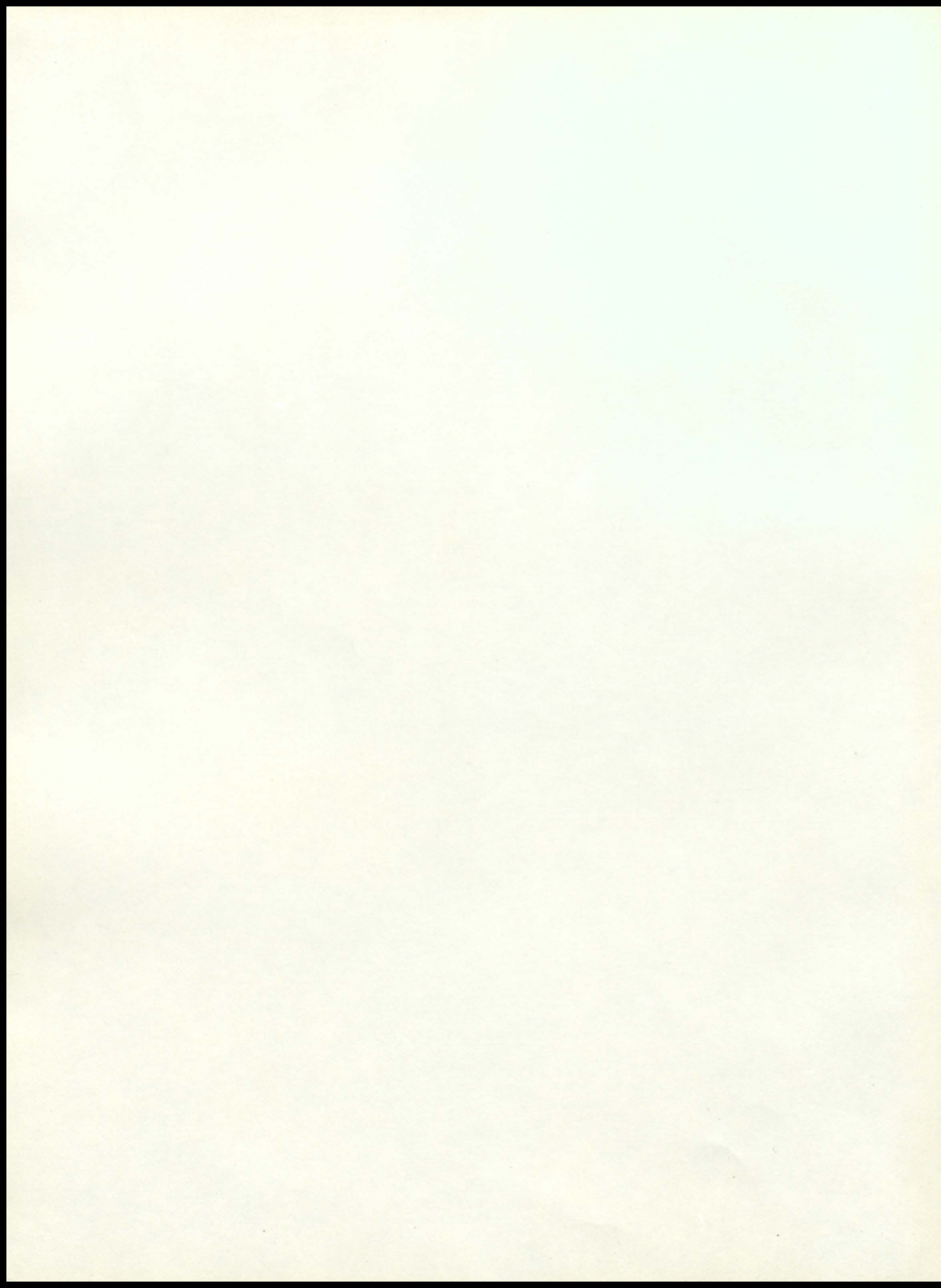

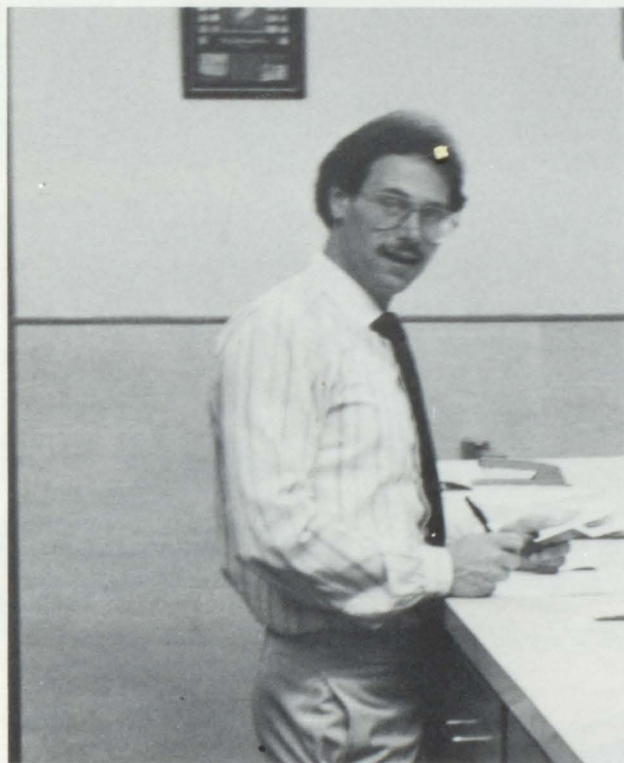
This year the yearbook staff is dedicating the yearbook to two people in new positions.

At first glance, a 2-7 overall record, with one of the wins coming as the result of a forfeit, might be considered little to brag about. Coach Bauman isn't bragging, but there were a lot of positive notes to the season. Consider that five of the seven losses resulted in a total spread of only 16 points. As Mr. Bauman said at season's end, "We were always six points behind, but we can play with anybody."

Leadership was provided by the seniors, as is usually the case with STMA football. Tri-captains Glen Barbeln, Paul Pohlkamp, and Roger Tiernan all led the team. Barbeln was the quarterback, completing 38 passes to become the third leading quarterback in the school's history. Pohlkamp and Tiernan were a good one-two punch, gaining 612 and 463 yards respectively. The offensive and defensive lines featured team award winners Marvin Vetsch, Joe Kessler, and Stan Barthel.

Randy Wacker, Ed Hackenmueller, and Ken Sanderson, next year's captains, provided quality leadership from the junior class. Wacker was Barbeln's favorite receiver, catching 15 for a 24.2 average. Sanderson and Hackenmueller were first and third in defensive points. The outlook for the future is good as the kids will continue to work hard to improve.

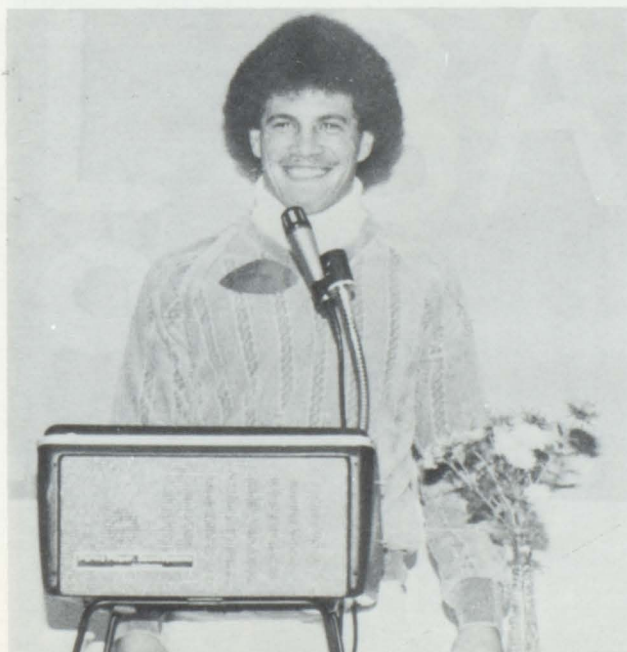

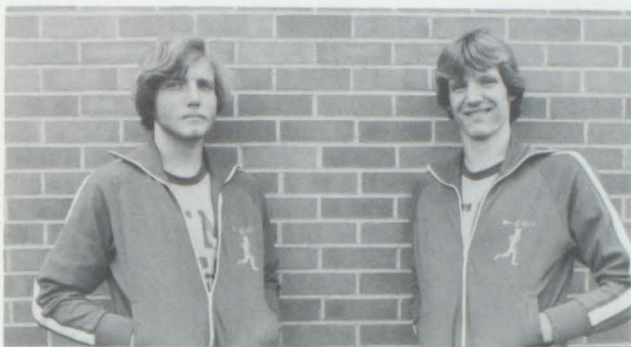

Young Girls Pace Running Team

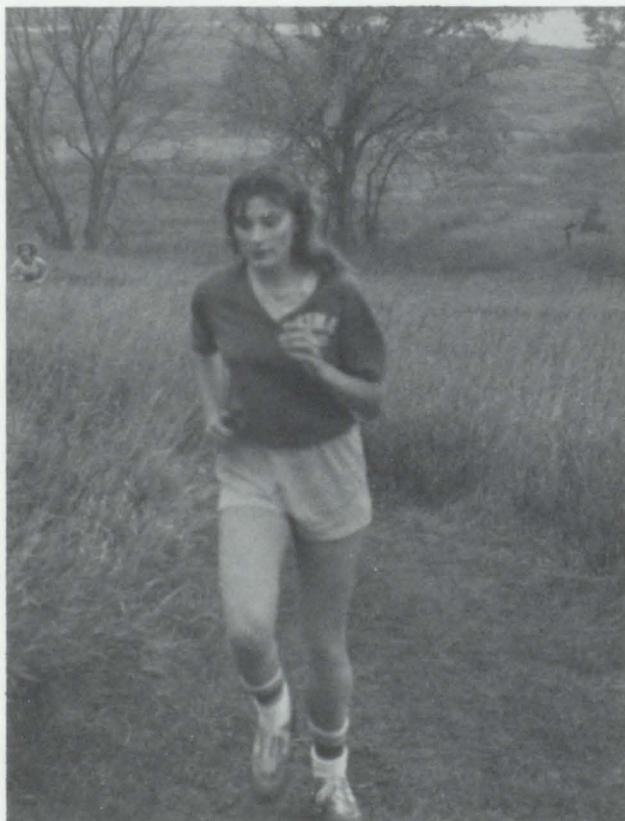

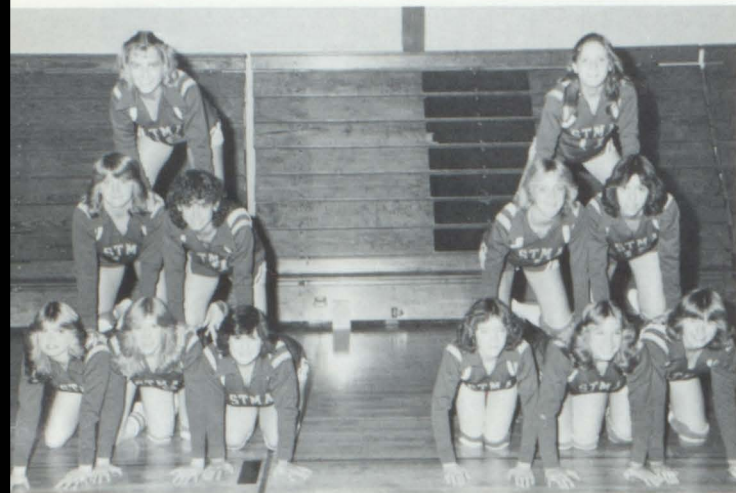

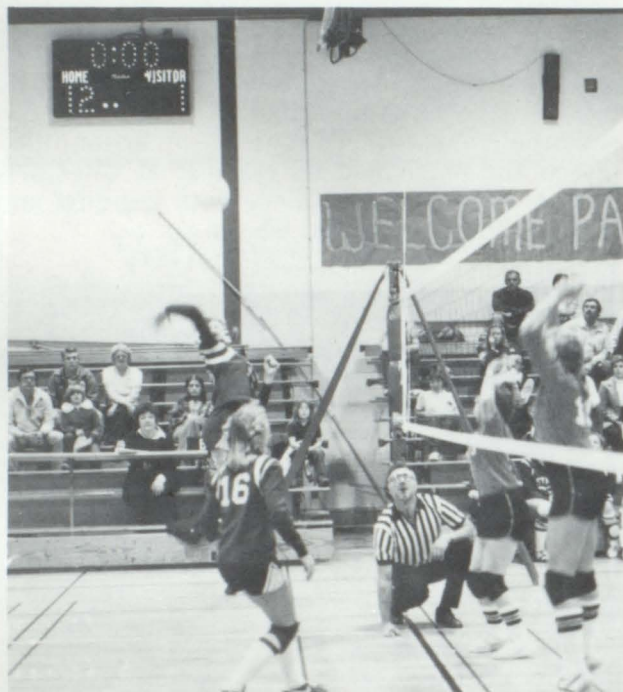

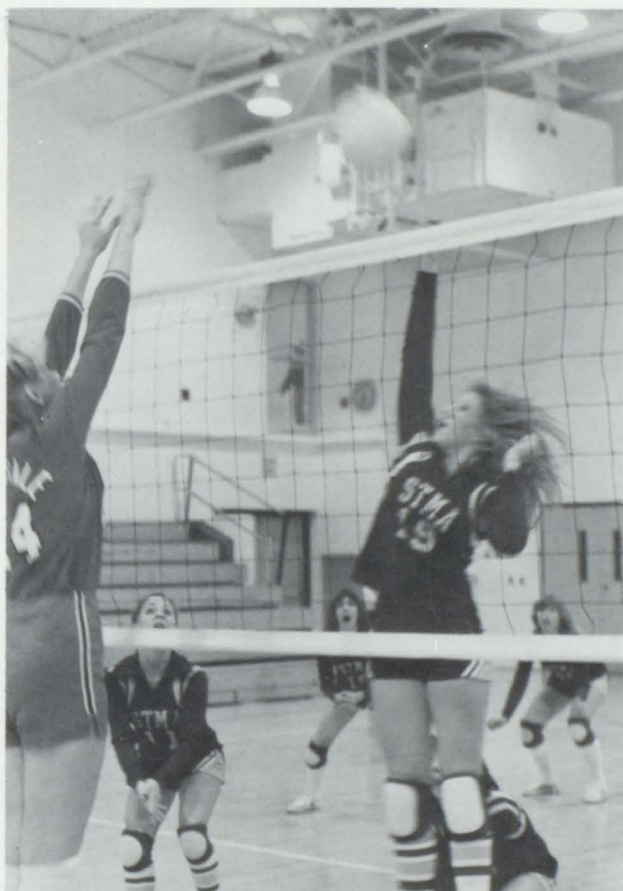

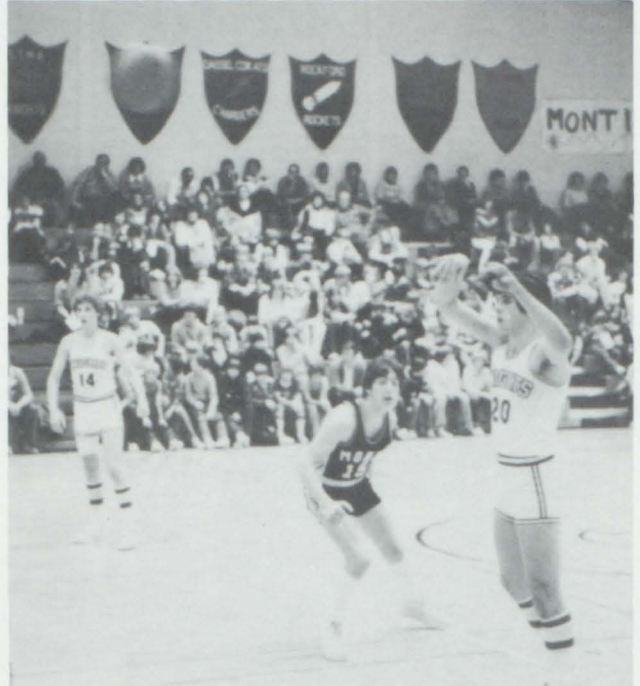

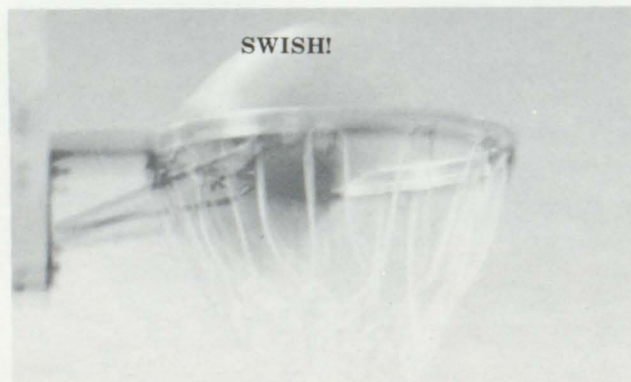

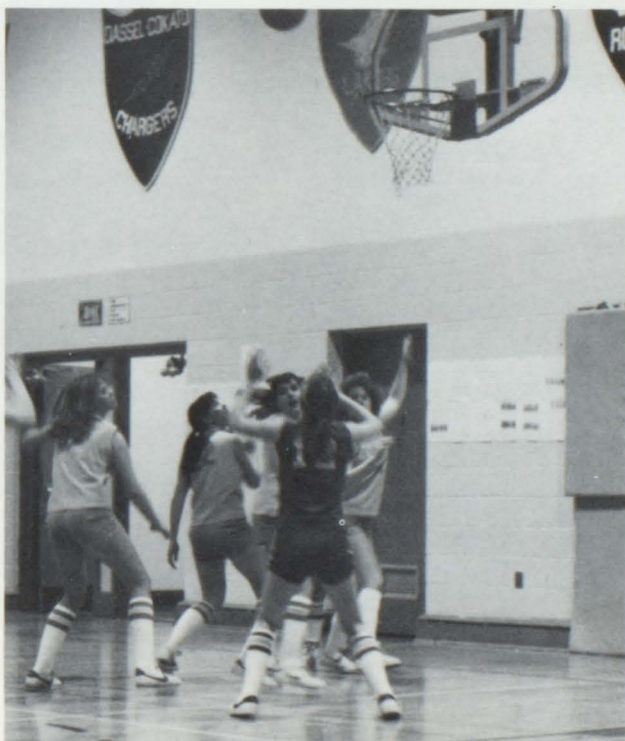

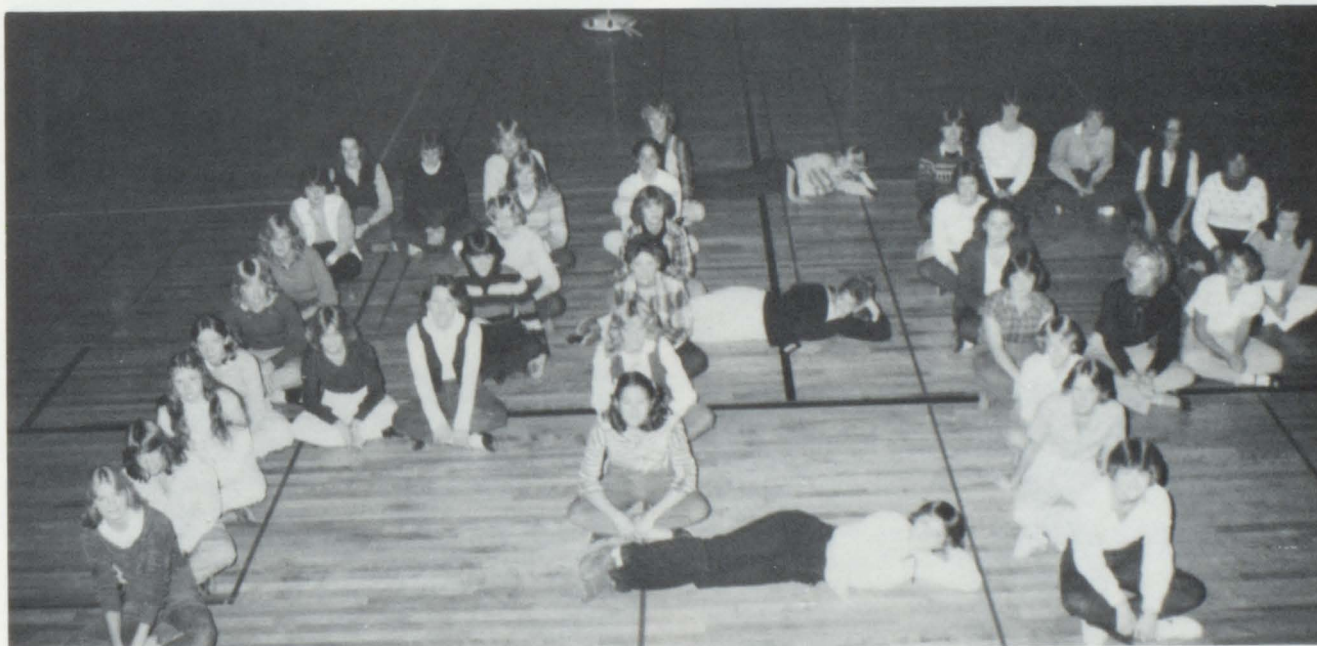

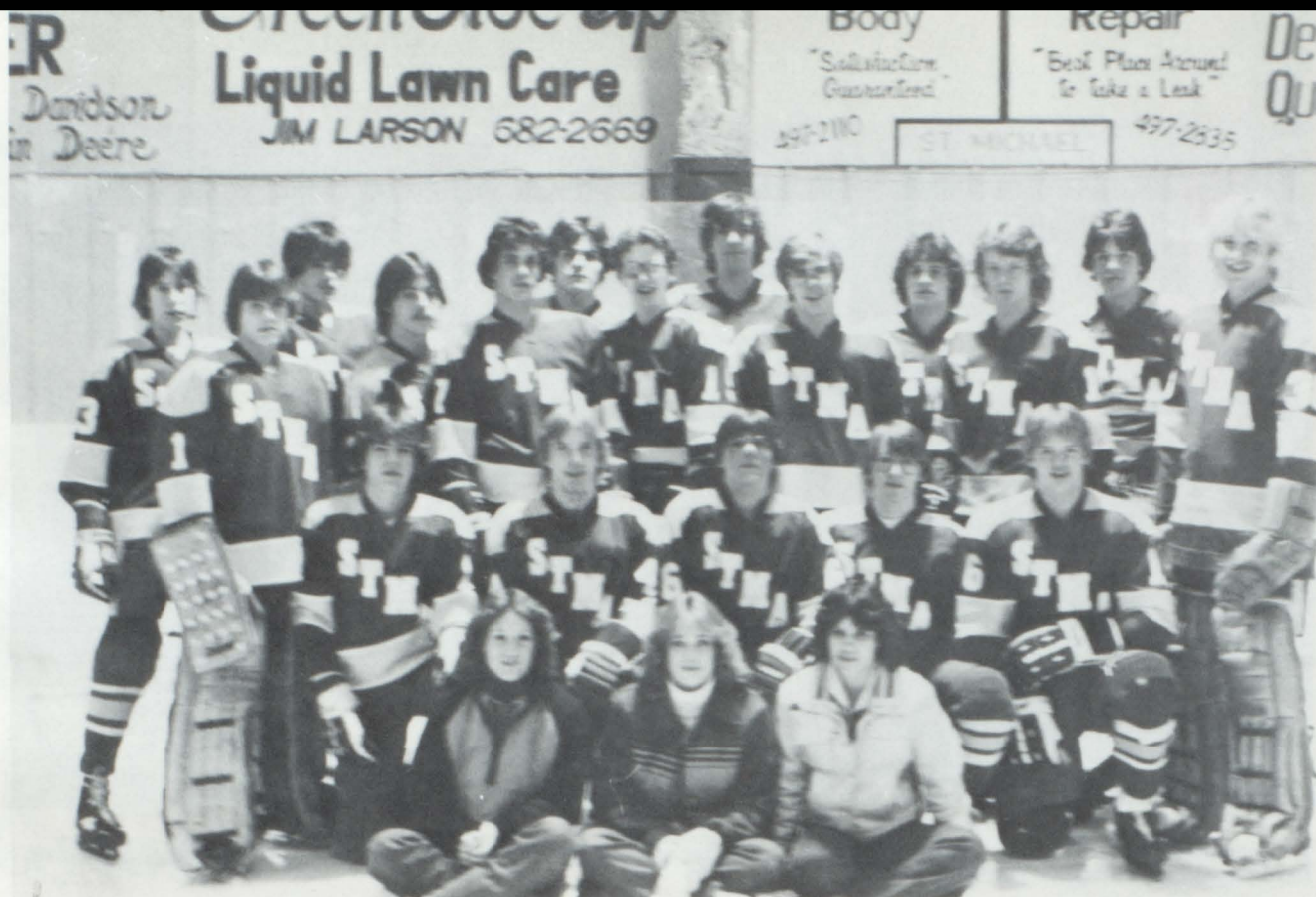

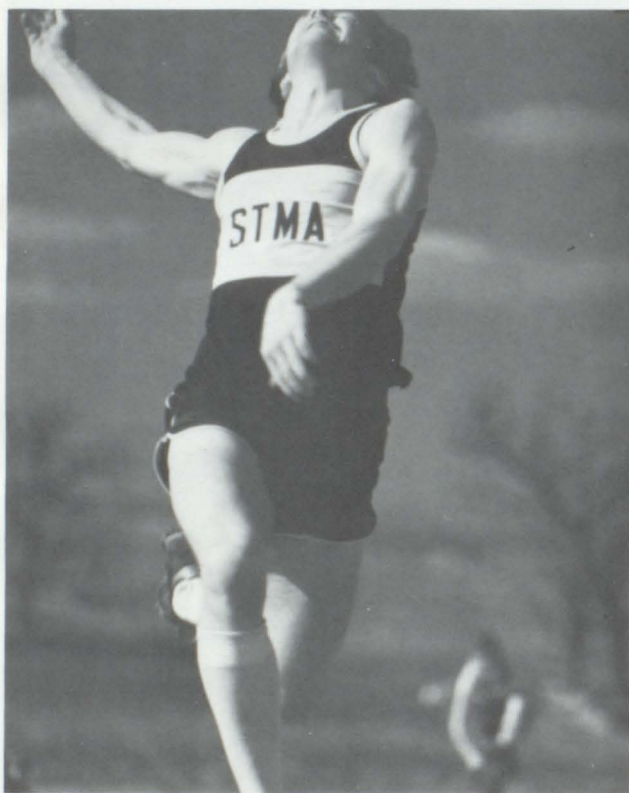

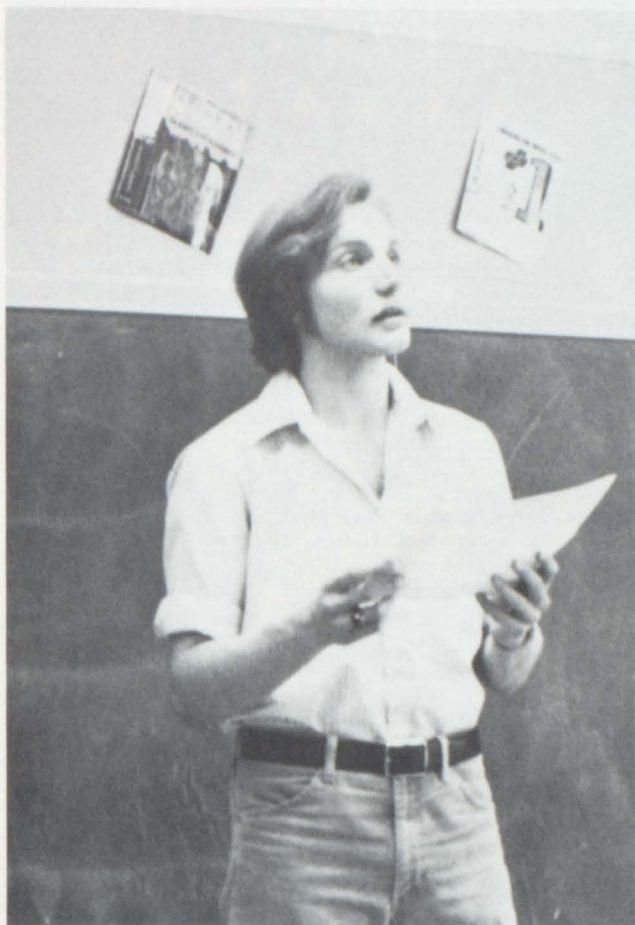

Writers Make New Format

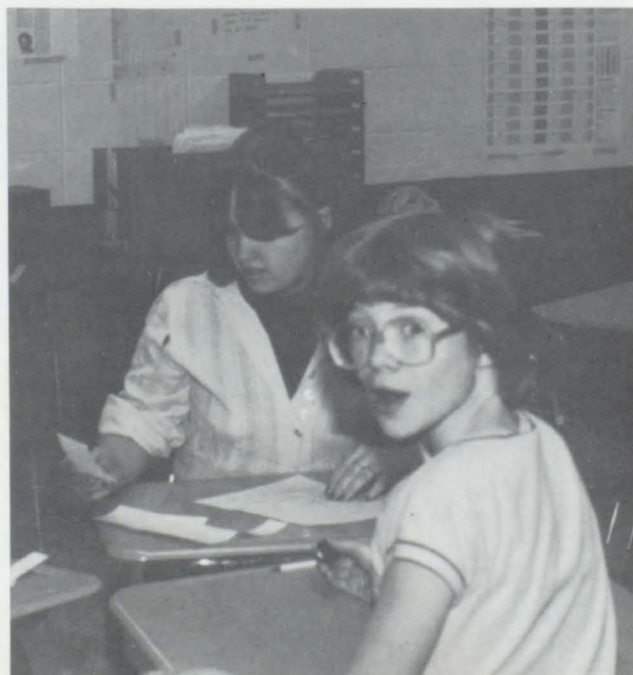

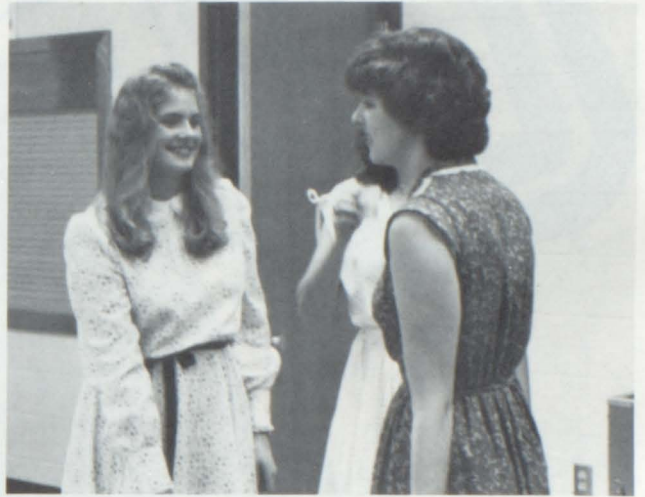

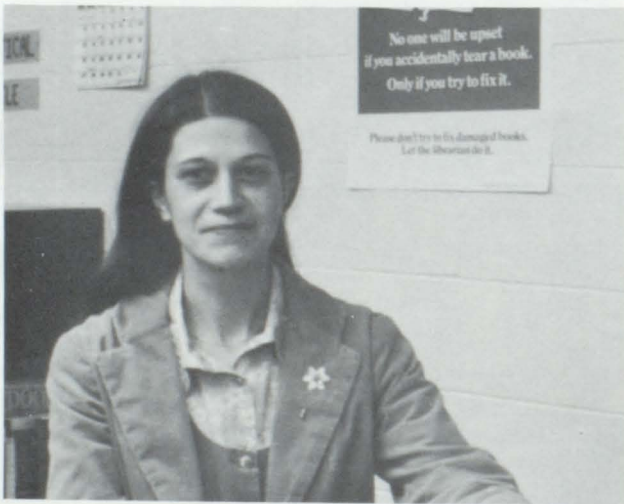


Staff People Solve Problems
