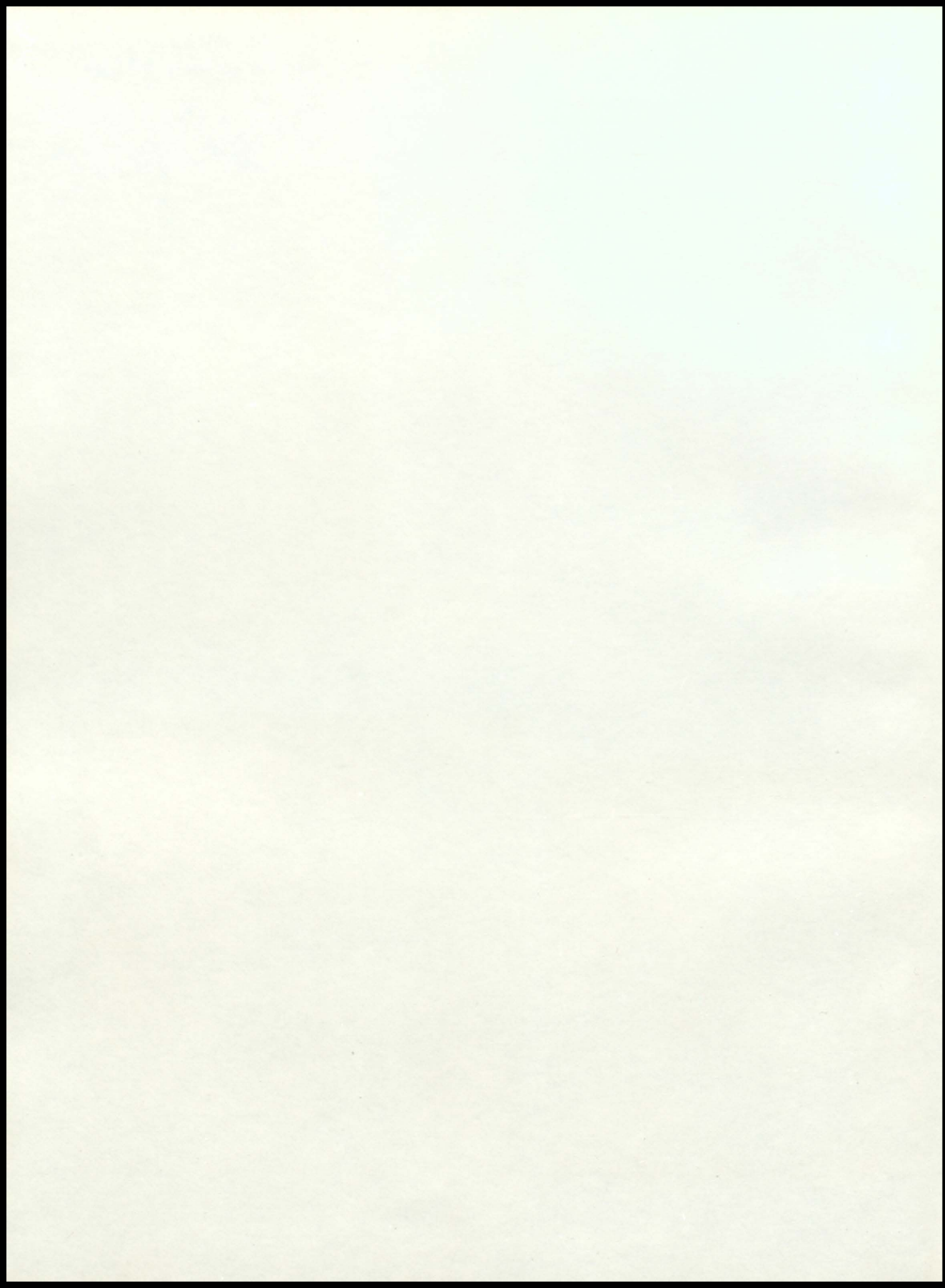












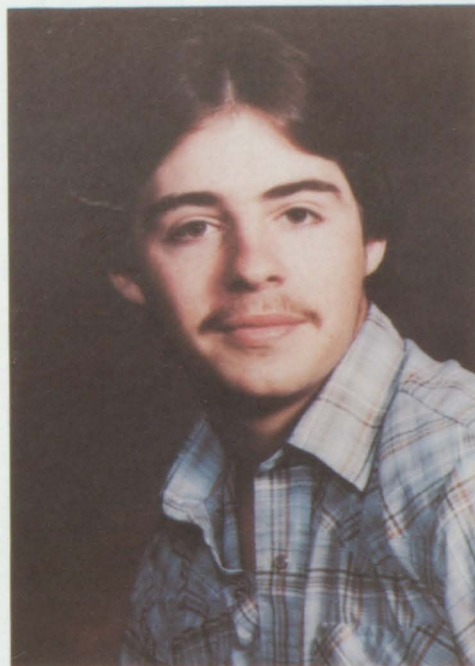


# We Miss You, Tony

we'll never regret.*

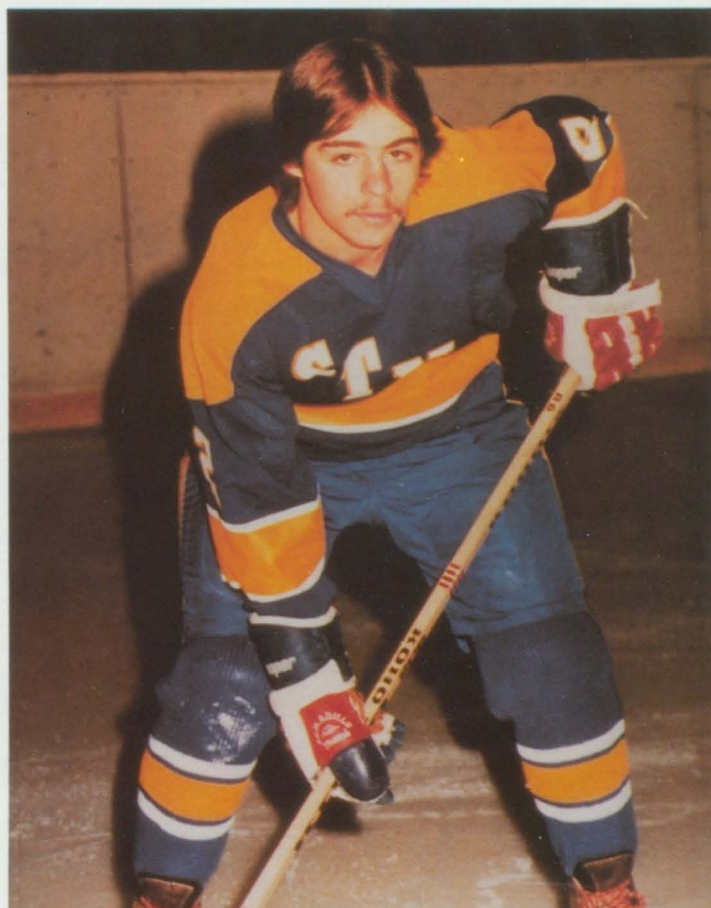
*Remember how school

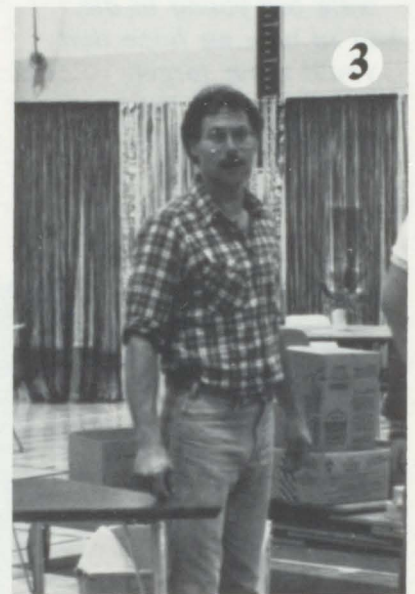

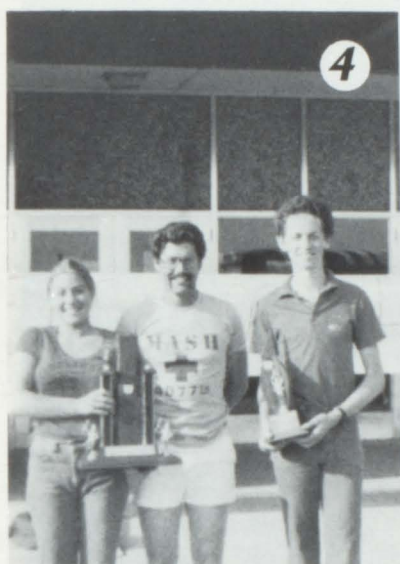




# Band Marches To Happy Tune

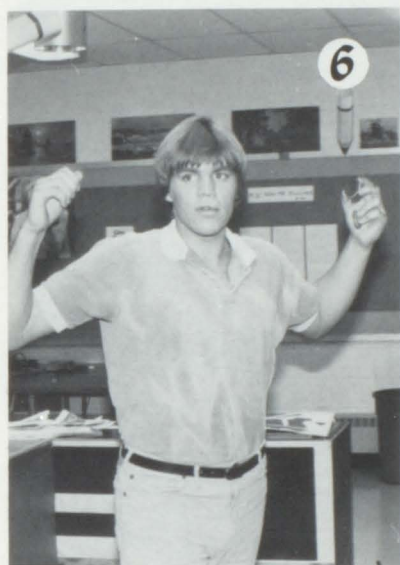

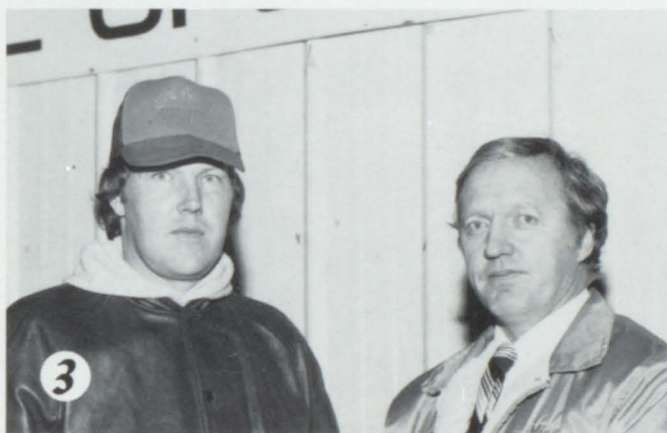




# Young Pucksters Improve At Season's End

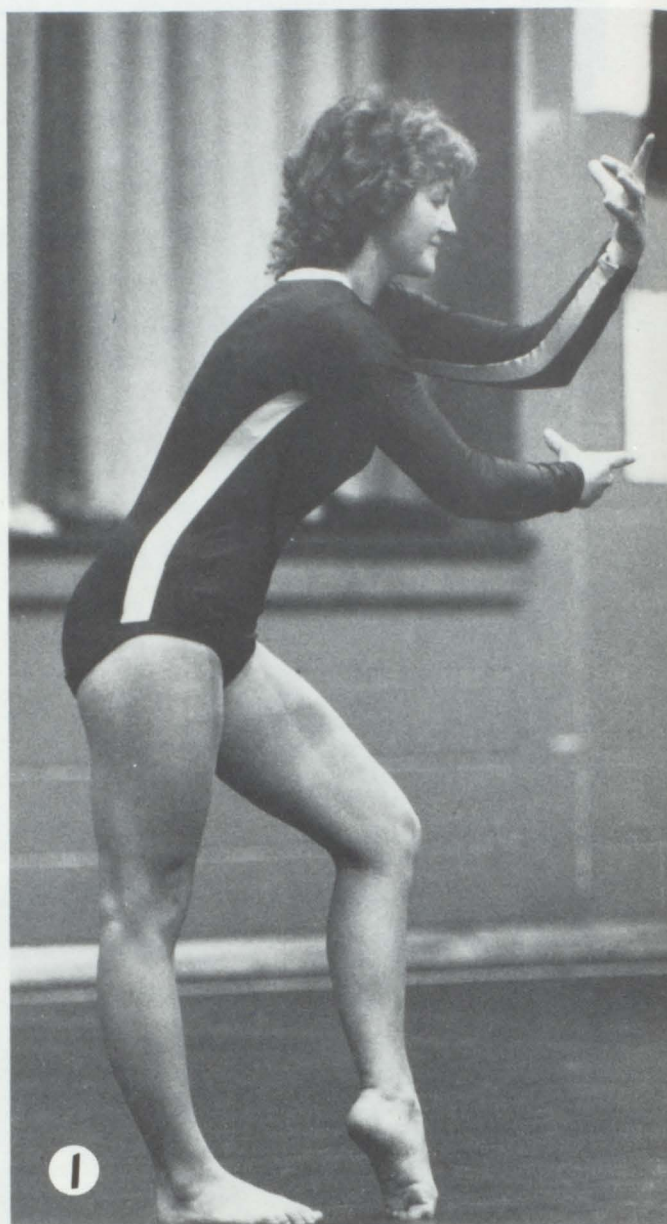


# Junior-Laden Team Places 2nd In District

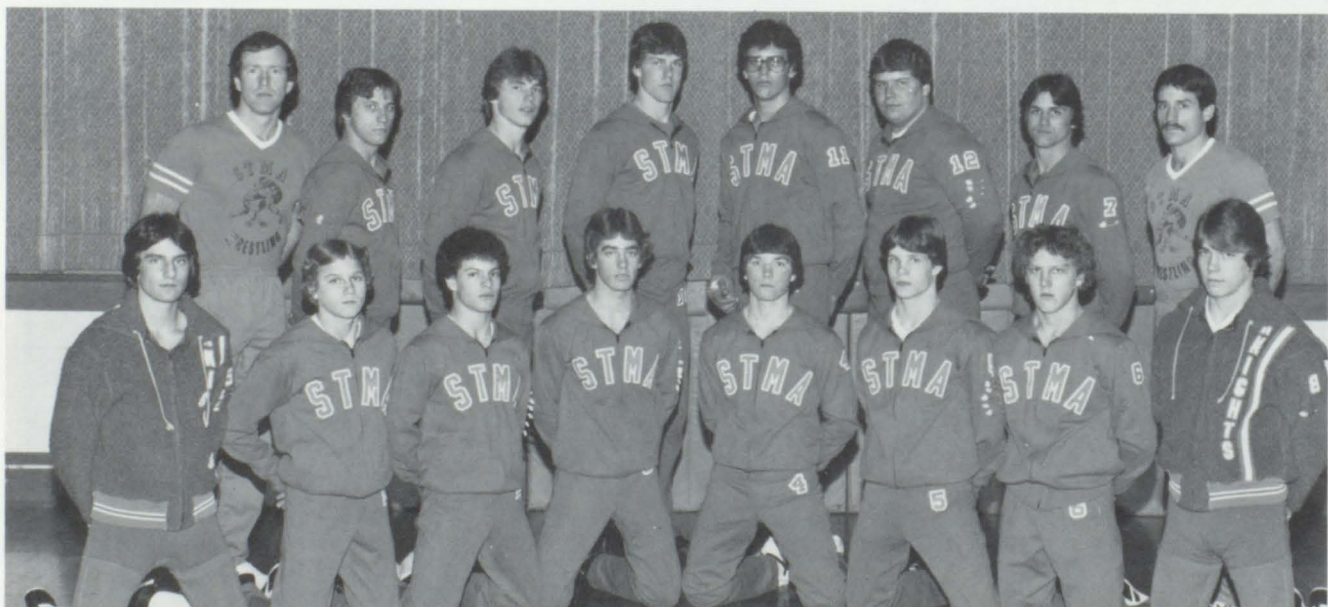
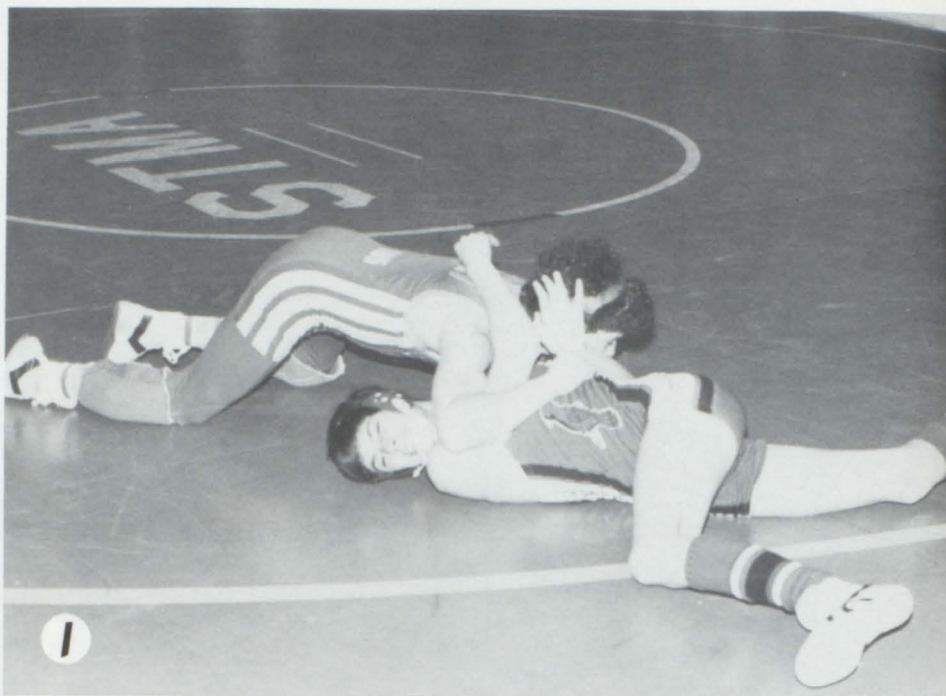
# Wrestlers Win District Crown

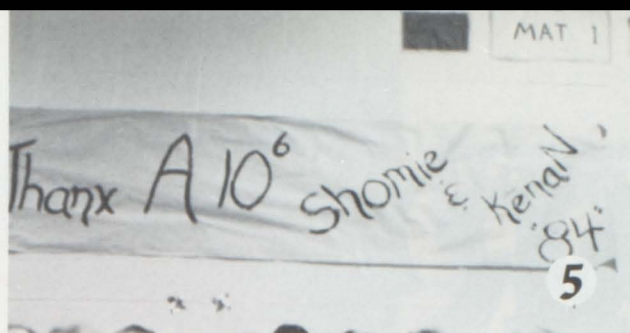


# Staff Does More Than Teach

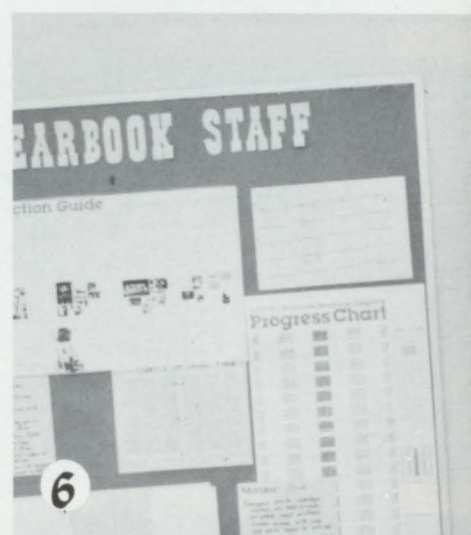

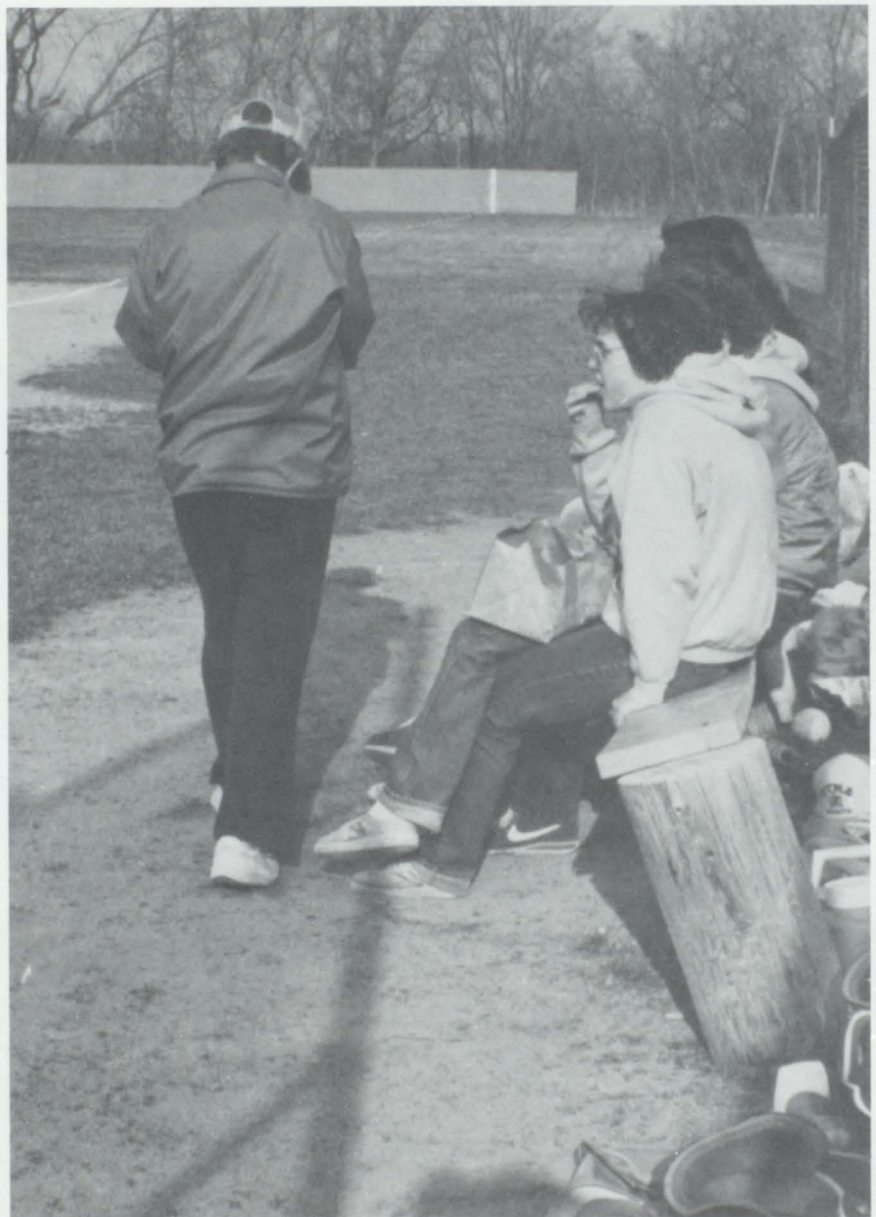
# YEAR at a glance

*For the school officials, it's a time of tests — every teacher is writing tests, making out grades, winding up a long, hard year of work.*

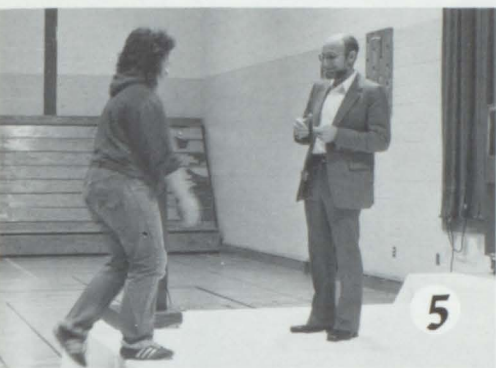
*But all the members of the STMA community look forward to the spring as the best time of the year; a time when cares are forgotten and minds wander to better places and better times.*

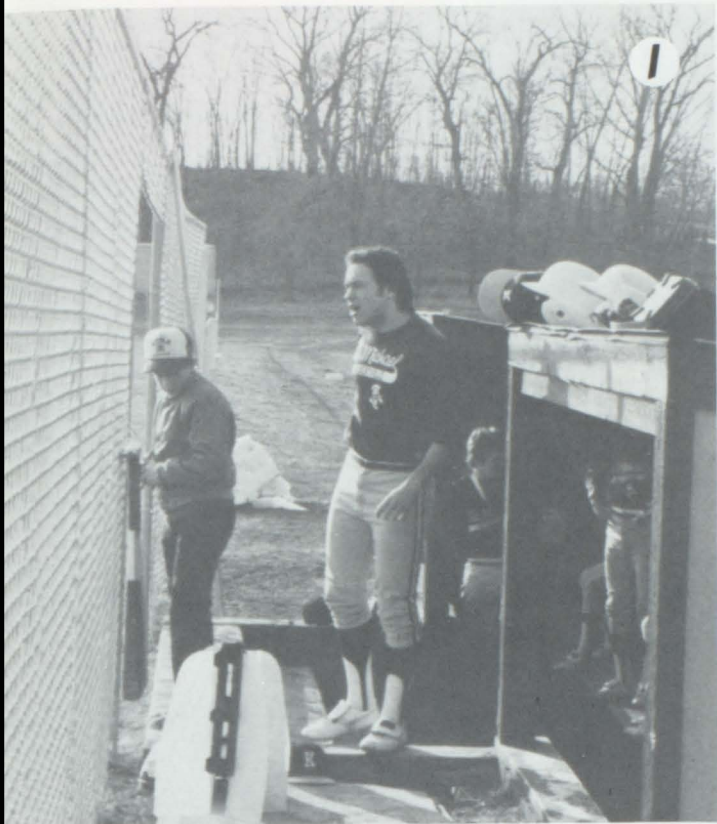
