


We never thought, that night when you left, That we'd never see you again.


We said, "So long, we'll see you tomorrow," Didn't know we were about to lose a great friend.

We didn't get a chance to tell you goodbye. It doesn't seem fair, you were too young to die. And so now we hope that you'll never forget The fun we had, times


we'll never regret.





The team's third place finish in the district points to better things in 1983.




Picking a senior to represent the whole class is a difficult task, but the senior members of the staff think Steve Maeyaert is a good example of the class of 1983.


# Girl Cagers Make It To Region
