









The defense, which relied heavily on overall team speed and quickness, allowed opponents 41.7 points per game, while the offense scored 41.9.







#### Track Has Outstanding Season





When the play was presented, there was a feeling of intense relief and joy from the performance. The play turned out to be a big success, and we are all looking forward to next year's performance.





# Editors Notes: The Making Of A Yearbook

When was the last time you looked at a Knight yearbook or one from any other school? Did you flip through the pages aimlessly, or did you go through it slowly and look at how it was constructed? If you didn't look closely, you probably missed the fine craftsmanship that goes into every book.

A yearbook has its beginnings on paper. First, the order of the pages are mapped out in a book called a "ladder". This is done to ensure that pages are not forgotten and to show what will be put on each page. Next, a layout, or basic drawing, is roughly sketched for every page. This can be the most difficult procedure, especially for new staff members, because there are new concepts to learn, rules to follow, and tools to master.

The layout is done by enlarging or reducing photos, as needed, to fit four or five on the page. The tool used for this is a "cropper." It is used as a guide to mark the desired portion of a photo and to "crop out" the excess. The actual enlarging or reducing, though, is done by *Jostens*, the book's publisher.

Besides the arrangement of photos, the layout also shows the arrangement of the page's written work. Written work, or copy, as it is commonly called, may consist of headlines, picture captions, descriptive paragraphs, sports statistics, or coach's comments. These are all written by the staff member to whom the page has been assigned to, which is not always easy. It takes a special skill to write copy that is tasteful, accurate, and brief. The latter is usually what causes the most problems. It is not uncommon to rewrite copy three or four times in order for it to fit in its allotted space.

After the layout, with copy, has been completed, it needs to be approved by the editor or advisor. It is then ready for the copy to be punched into the computer. At this point, the page is finished; all that remains is the mailing of complete pages to *Jostens* for publishing.
