



























Performing arts



















































The 2006, 188-page edition had a press run of 1,000 copies and was produced by Lifetouch Publishing. Our local Lifetouch account representative was Anne Marie Hickey. The book was output using 178 lines per inch screening direct to metal plates, printed on a 40" Heidelberg speedmaster CD1032-5L and bound together using the Diamont Bookline from Mueller Martini. The pages were printed on No. 1 grade, 100 lb gloss paper. The cover was designed by the 2006 STMA yearbook staff and bound on a 150-pt. binder board with tight backed smythe sewn binding.
