


Passing time during the first week is always a challenge trying to find the next class.








MAJESTIC





It was a fantastic year for both the boys varsity and junior varsity teams. Kevin Hackenmueller and Matthew Eiyneck, who both were voted as honorary captains for the teams, helped encourage each and every runner to work together and help one another train throughout their season. The varsity team had very strong individual runners. Staying ahead of the pack is one key aspect to running cross country, and the boys this year were able to use that to their advantage. At the end of the season, the varsity team came out strong and placed third in both the Mississippi 8 Conference and Section 5AA meets, with All-Conference runners including Brendan Sage, Chase Cayo, and Alexander Aman.

The junior varsity team also had many victories over the season, including winning the Mississippi 8 Conference meet. "This year, we had ten people run a 5K in under eighteen minutes, which was a first in cross country history for the team", said Michael Bruner. Mr. Gregg Greeno, the coach for both the boys teams, said this about the season overall: "As a coach, the season was very gratifying and fun. Inspired by great senior leadership, the guys worked hard, improved throughout the season, and were fun to be around because of their positive attitudes." 
























Girls Golf










How To Direct a One Act: A Live Act-fomercial








STMA Math League hits the books.




WE MEAN BUSINESS








