



Since 1953, the high school

has been located in four different buildings. The first building is now the Community Ed building. It opened in 1953 with a student body of under 100 students in grades 9-12. It was an all-Catholic High School. Although students from Albertville still attended, it was called St. Michael High School. Before this building was finished, high school classes were offered in what is now the Catholic Elementary School. The second high school was located in what is now St. Michael Elementary. The transition in 1992 to the third building, where STMA Middle School West is located, was because the previous school could not meet the demands of the arowing student body. This school was renamed St. Michael-Albertville High School. When this building first opened, STMA High School had 369 students. In fiftysix years, the student body arew from less than 100 to over 1.288. This lead us to the new building located just a few miles west of the previous high school. The newest school was built for the increase in the student body that was predicted to come. The students, staff, and community couldn't be prouder of this new facility.


with a bang. The students of STMA high had to leave the building they knew, inside and out, to start



#### The PAC

The Performing Arts Center seats 1,450 compared to the previous auditorium which seated 500. The new facility includes a pit for the orchestra. This is one of the largest high school performing arts centers in the state of Minnesota.

Each team used all their strength to try and win the game. Then the intensity in the gym rose as senior Jake Brown used all his strength to win it for the Senior class of 2010.







Maybe it's the intensity. Maybe it's the players. It could even be the fall weather, or possibly the exciting atmosphere. Then again, the attraction to football just might be held in the game itself. A single pass, interception, tackle, or touchdown can effect the result of the entire game. After STMA took Rogers's homecoming from them, Coach Bauman told the Crow River News, "Everybody played their part. It was a good victory for us." The Knights football fans are seemingly passionate about the game also. Dedicated fans stand in the chilly bleachers as rain drips down their faces. They stay until the very end of the game and scream until they no longer can.

The Knights rush out onto the field at the beginning of every game. They are eager and confident that this year will be another battle won by the Knights. They hope that each play they make will pull them closer to victory. Under the coaching of Earl Bauman and Curt Hahn, the Knights accomplished their goal by making it all the way to the section finals.

The team won the conference champion, in a three way tie with Rogers and Buffalo, and the Knights beat Rogers earlier in the season 11-6 before losing in the game that would have sent the Knights to the state championship. The Knights played hard, featuring great defense early in the season, and explosive offense by the end of the season. Coach Bauman completed his 30th season, and his overall win-loss record is now 188-122. The excellent combination of offensive and defensive players helped re-define Knights Football in 2009.

Senior Quarterback, Tanner Krutzig, completed 121 of 229 passes for 1608 yards and 13 TDs. His leading receivers were Blake Schirmers and Joe Carpenter in a breakout season, 32 for 660 and 7 TDs, including a 98 yard TD pass reception against Rogers in the playoff game. The season was an overall success because everyone on the team pushed hard and didn't limit themselves.






#### Back 2 Back Mississippi 8 Conference Champs


























