School Background

Founded in 1942, Jesuit College Preparatory School of Dallas is a private Catholic secondary institution for young men rooted in the Ignatian tradition, emphasizing the development of the whole individual through its motto, Men for Others. The school aims to form men who are intellectually competent, religious, loving, committed to serving others, open to growth, and physically fit. Jesuit Dallas is accredited by COGNIA and was honored as a 2022 National Blue Ribbon School, recognizing its commitment to educational excellence.

Graduation Requirements (27.0 Credits)

Jesuit Dallas requires a four-year core curriculum in English, Science, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science, and three years of foreign language (Spanish, French, Latin, or Mandarin). Students are required to complete a full year of computer science programming, fine arts, and physical education, in addition to 1 semester of Health Seminar and 1 semester of an elective of their choice. Unique to Jesuit, seniors complete a year-long Social Justice and Public Policy course that ties their community service experiences to broader societal issues. This course includes reading research, integrating economics, and features guest speakers, field trips, documentaries, and non-fiction works.

Grading and Course Policies

Jesuit Dallas uses a standard letter scale (A, B, C, D, and F) and includes pluses or minuses on the scale (at right) to calculate and determine the 4.0 cumulative GPA.

AP and honors courses receive weighted consideration in the cumulative GPA calculation, with AP courses given a 1.0 weight and honors courses a 0.5 weight. To be eligible for a teacher recommendation for AP and honors courses, students must have earned at least 85% in the previous course in the same discipline. Unless identified as AP or Honors, all courses are taught at a rigorous and college-preparatory level. The maximum number of courses a student may take per semester is six.

Class Rank

Jesuit Dallas does not rank its students for purposes of college admission. The quality of a student's curriculum and individual achievement is discussed in a personal letter of recommendation.

Community Service and Social Justice

Jesuit Dallas fosters student relationships with Christ through mandatory community service, engaging with the poor, vulnerable, and marginalized. During their senior year, students dedicate every Wednesday to partnering with a service agency in the DFW metroplex, completing over 100 hours of service. Many also participate in global service programs in Guatemala, Mexico, Honduras, Peru, and Ecuador.
