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What does homelessness look like?



MCKINNEY-VENTO HISTORY

The McKinney-Vento Act was passed in 1987 and has been amended many times. The McKinney-Vento Act was implemented as the first step to address homelessness by the federal government to ensure students experiencing homelessness have equal access to public education.

MCKINNEY-VENTO ACT DEFINITION

Children and Youth who lack a "fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence" are considered homeless:

- Sharing housing with other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship.
- Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds.
- Living in shelters
- Unaccompanied youth includes a homeless child or youth not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian

McKinney-Vento Act

- Ensures students experiencing homelessness are identified.
- Ensures students experiencing homelessness are immediately enrolled, even if they lack required documentation.

- Provide services to students experiencing homelessness that are comparable to those offered to other students.
- Ensures student's school of origin.
- Provide School of Origin transportation.




IDENTIFIED STUDENTS EXPERIENCING HOMELESNESS BY LIVING SITUATION



Doubled-Up **76.6%**

Liaisons must ensure that students experiencing homelessness:



Are identified collaboratively with school personnel, other organizations, and agencies.



Are enrolled and provided equitable access to succeed in school.



Have access to educational services for which they are eligible.



Receive referrals for medical, dental, mental health, housing services, and other appropriate services (includes families).

Unaccompanied Youth



Are enrolled in school.



Have opportunities to meet the same state academic standards as housed students.



Are informed of their independent status for the purpose of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

UNACCOMPANIED YOUTH

- REVIEW EACH SITUATION ON A CASE-BY CASE BASIS
- REVIEW THEIR LIVING SITUATION AND NIGHTTIME RESIDENCY
- STUDENT MUST BE BOTH UNACCOMPANIED AND EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS
- UNACCOMPANIED YOUTH CAN ENROLL THEMSELVES
- WE DO NOT REMOVE THE PARENTS/GUARDIANS NAME FROM THE CONTACT INFORMATION IF THE STUDENT WAS PREVIOUSLY ENROLLED UNLESS THERE ARE LEGAL MATTERS INVOLVED.

SCHOOL COUNSELORS MUST ASSIST STUDENTS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS WITH COLLEGE PREPARATION AND READINESS

McKinney-Vento eligible students have the right to:

Receive a free, appropriate public education.

Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.

Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.



Enroll in the local school or continue attending their school of origin.



Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if requested.



Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to the student's needs.

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
