From the Superintendent

Dear Eden Families,

Thank you, again, for supporting our upcoming capital improvement project. The State Education Department is reviewing our construction plans, and we are on schedule to put shovels in the ground early this summer. At some point between June 2017 and December 2018, every building will see some renovation. This is a huge project, and we are really excited to get started! For more detail, see our website at www.edencsd.org \rightarrow About Us \rightarrow Capital Project. Of course, a big project comes with a complex schedule. Thank you to our architects, Young & Wright, and our construction management group, Campus CMG, for overseeing this endeavor and making sure that everything runs smoothly.

First, you will see our three staging areas erected. One will be located at the Jr./Sr. High School on the grounds close to where we have put the bonfire in the past. The second staging area will be next to the Transportation parking lot, and the third staging area will be in the GLP parking lot near the woods. These staging areas will be office spaces for our contractors and will be clearly marked. They are restricted areas and off-limits to the students and public.

The highlight of our project will be a new state-of-the art technology infrastructure. This will require a rewiring of the entire district. Consequently, many ceiling tiles will be removed in order to do the work. It will definitely look like we are under construction, but it will be well worth the work. Our students and staff will reap the benefits of an infrastructure that will allow us to move toward 1:1 devices.

At the Elementary School, scaffolding will frame the front of the building, so that we can repair the masonry. The Elementary School playground will be fenced off and closed for the summer. There are renovations happening inside the building, as well, so teachers will begin packing up their classrooms this spring in anticipation of the building being closed for the summer. Inside, the contractors will be working on renovations to the main entrance, auditorium, cafeteria, toilet rooms, new district offices and other academic spaces. While 3rd grade will remain in their current wing, 4th grade will move to the first floor.

At the Jr./Sr. High School, work will begin at the back of the building. The Athletic Entrance will be closed off, as well as the tennis courts, so that improvements can be made to the All Sports Stadium, concession stand and drainage. Fencing will limit access in this area over the summer for your safety. The baseball diamonds will be accessible from the Jennings Road parking lot only. Inside the building, throughout the next 18 months, we will be working on a new secure entrance complete with a signature arch and handicapped accessible parking, modifications to academic spaces including the music, art, P.E. and technology spaces and a new School-Community Fitness Center. This new fitness center will be used by our Physical Education students during the day and open to the public before and after school.

At GLP, we will begin working on a new entrance, and renovation to Kindergarten classrooms, the cafeteria and other academic spaces. GLP's new entrance will be located in the area of the current Kindergarten classrooms and will feature a separate door for visitors, a secure waiting area in the main office, and the ability to screen visitors prior to access to the student academic areas.

As in any construction project, there will be trucks and other heavy equipment moving around. Please help us ensure your safety and that of your children by having a family conversation about obeying the No Trespassing signs for all of the fenced-off areas.

This is an exciting time for Eden CSD. With all renovations come some challenges, disruptions and dust. We appreciate your patience as we focus on making Eden CSD the very best education institution it can be.



Then each child showed a Board Member how to use some of the apps by talking to them individually, while showing them the programs they have used on their iPads. The children's interest and excitement for all they are learning was evident by the way they spoke with enthusiasm and confidence to each board member. Some of the favorite




Celebration of Martin Luther King, Jr.

This continuous improvement process goes on each day, with students learning to do their work better through everyday routines under the right conditions and with reading materials they can read independently.

Under the direction of Diara Kwartler, our IRLA Executive Coach, our teachers have been training throughout the year on how to use the diagnostic information that they are gathering on their students to become better teachers of reading, track real time progress and to get to know their students better than ever before. The successes that our students have shown so far, has led to the decision to expand this program to grades four and five next year. 
Eden CSD Earns Position on Advanced Placement District Honor Roll

Eden Central School District has earned a position on the 7th Annual Advanced Placement District Honor Roll! We are one of only three districts in the Western New York region, and one of 433 districts in the United States and Canada to receive this honor. This is the second time Eden has received this honor (the last time was 2011the first year the College Board gave out this distinction).

Inclusion for this award is based on AP data for the school years 2014, 2015 and 2016. In order to qualify, Eden CSD had to increase participation to AP exams by at least 6% overall, increase or maintain the percentage of minority students taking exams and scoring 3+ on at least one exam, and improve performance levels when comparing the percentage of students in 2016 scoring a 3+ to those in 2014.

Congratulations to everyone who made this possible over the past four years - faculty, students, the Eden Central School Board of Education, administrators and parents!



Co-gen Plant

It should come as no surprise to many of you that Eden Central School District has outgrown CoGen and is in need of more electrical power. As part of our Capital Improvement Elementary Project. Eden School, the Bus Garage and GLP will be going back on the Grid. The remaining power that we obtain from CoGen will be more than enough to power up the Middle/High School. The plan is for EES to go back on the grid by January of 2018, and for GLP to go back on the grid by November of 2018. Much needs to be completed in the capital project before this happens.

Looking down the road when our elementary buildings are back on the Grid, and knowing about WNY power outages, there is a possibility that one day our GLP and EES students may be enjoying a power outage and getting a bit of a break while our MS/HS students will be basking in the light.

GLASS BEADMAKING—THE FIRST STEPS

Turn hot glass into cool stuff! Join glass artisan Vicki Schneider at her beautiful studio in Woodlawn for an experience you will never forget. Vicki's studio, Expressive Glass, is located at 3333 Lakeshore Road (Route 5) Woodlawn, between the Ford and steel plants. In just three hours, you will make your own beautiful one-of-a-kind glass beads and enter the mystical and ancient world of lampworking. This clinic will introduce you to the art of safely flameworking soft glass. You will learn to melt glass rods, wrap molten glass around thin steel rods (mandrels), and create basic beads. After exploring various surface decorations, you will produce colorful treasures that you can use to create jewelry on your own.

NATURE PRINTS ON GLASS

Paint the backs of leaves and flowers with specially formulated vitreous enamel and use them to print the center section of a beautiful plate, suncatcher, tile, or night light. Add colorful pieces of glass to create a border around your print. You will learn basic cutting techniques and how to mix and use the vitreous enamel. Bring several leaves or ferns (4" or smaller) with pronounced veins and an N100 or P100 dust mask. (Masks can be purchased from a hardware store.) You may also bring small flowers. Petals that are very delicate do not hold up well to the paints. We will heat your design in a kiln until the glass melts and then heat it a second time, as needed, to slump it into a small plate.
