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

We offer an Early Morning Drop Off Program at Eden Elementary School from 7:00 am to 8:25 am for students in Grades K-6.



Team Work and Collaboration in the Eden Community

During the later portion of the 2015-2016 school year, my students had the very unique opportunity to design and fabricate new signage for the main entry/exit locations of the Town of Eden.

Six students who were all enrolled in Eden's most challenging Technical drawing class were chosen. After each of the students generated three initial design concepts for the new Town of Eden designs, the members of the Chamber of Commerce previewed each of them and supplied the students with feedback; which students, Luke Wilcox and Jake Vullo, used to revise and complete the finished electronic rendering/file of the sign design. Although the school district has its own CNC plasma cutter, the size of the new signs prevented the students from processing/cutting the stainless steel, which each sign is constructed out of, while on campus. Fortunately, Eden alumni were there to support this learning experience on multiple fronts. Alloy Welding and Fabricating owner, Rob Wierzba, who is also a class of 1989 member, enthusiastically stepped up to help the students process the raw sheet material at his shop. With some drawing/setup assistance from Cory Lauber, class of 2008, Rob and Jake Vullo employed Alloy Weldings incredible water table CNC cutting system to process/cut the raw material. The signs were then transported back to the school so that the finishes could be applied to each.

Raider Respond Day allowed the students the opportunity to repaint the existing support structures while simultaneously installing the new signs. Mr. Mesi, who oversaw one of the student installation crews, and Mrs. Nicastro, who provided artistic feedback/suggestions

during the design phase, should also be recognized for their efforts throughout this project.

In closing, this joint project not only produced incredible finished products, but also served as an example of what can be achieved when students get the opportunity and support to collaborate with community organizations and businesses. I am proud to have been a part of the team, and would like to thank all of the parties involved who helped create authentic/real world experience that the kids and community will benefit from for years to come.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF SKIERS & ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK

In consideration of me or my child being permitted to use the facilities at Holiday Valley Resort in Ellicottville, New York, I expressly acknowledge: I have read and understand the "Safety in Skiing Code" (Article 18 of the N.Y.S. General Obligation Law), the "Responsibilities of Skiers and Passengers" (12 N.Y.C.R.R., Part 54.4) and Holiday Valley's "Season Pass Policy" and agree to be bound by them. I have read and explained those regulations and responsibilities to my child in an age appropriate manner and he/she has acknowledged that he/she understands and agrees to be bound by them. Article 18 is posted at all ticket sale locations and at www.holidayvalley.com. I and my child are physically fit and possess the physical strength to meet our responsibilities as a skier/rider, and state that we will not ski or ride while under the influence of drugs or alcohol. I and my child agree to observe, read and abide by any and all notices as may be posted from time to time by the Resort which may pertain to our responsibilities as a skier/rider. I grant permission to the Resort to use any photograph, videotape, motion picture, recording or other record of my or my child's use of its facilities for any legitimate purpose. I and my child understand that trail conditions vary constantly because of weather changes and skier use. I and my child also understand that the risks of skiing/riding also include terrain park elements, jumps, slide rails and other man made features, changing weather conditions, bare spots, variations in snow, ice, forest growth, other ground cover, surface and subsurface conditions, and terrain, bumps, moguls, rocks, debris, equipment and machinery on slopes, collisions with other skiers and snowboarders, and natural and man made objects, and skier/snowboarder error. I have explained these risks to my child in an age appropriate manner. I and my child acknowledge that there are risks inherent in the sport of skiing/riding, and that as participants, I and my child could suffer personal injuries and/or death. I and my child accept the risks of personal injury and/or death. My signature signifies that I and my child have read, reviewed and understand the "Warning to Skiers" posted at this ski area. I agree, on behalf of myself and my child, that this acknowledgment shall be for the entire term of the pass and I relinquish my right to a refund of the purchase price of the pass that is allowable under "Safety in Skiing Code" for those persons unwilling to ski because of the sport or the duties imposed upon skiers by law. I agree, on behalf of myself and my child, that New York law applies to any issue relating to this agreement and my or my child's use of the facilities at Holiday Valley Resort. I agree, on behalf of myself and my child, that any lawsuit relating to this agreement or my or my child's use of the facilities at Holiday Valley Resort shall be brought only in the New York State Supreme Court, County of Cattaraugus, or the United States District Court, Western District of New York, and that those courts shall have sole and exclusive jurisdiction over any lawsuit relating to this agreement or my or my child's use of the facilities at Holiday Valley Resort

STUDENT SEASON PASS POLICIES

A student I.D., a driver's license or a birth certificate must be presented to verify birth date in order to pick up the season pass. The season pass is non-transferable and can only be used by the person to whom it is issued. Win-Sum Ski Corp reserves the right to revoke the season pass for any reason. Refunds are available only as regulated by law. If the season pass is forgotten, skiers must pay the prevailing daily rate. The season pass must be displayed above the waist, on the front of an outer garment at all times. For college students 23 years or younger, a current transcript must be submitted showing a minimum of 12 credit.

SKIER RENTAL ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK

Upon receipt of any ski rental equipment provided in connection with the agreement, I agree to inspect such equipment and return any such equipment for exchange if it is found to be unsatisfactory for my use. - •Choose a light-colored costume because these are easily seen at night. Add reflective tape or glow-in-the-dark tape to the front and back of the costume and to the trick-or-treat bag.
- •Only buy a costume that is labeled "flame-retardant." This means the material won't burn. If you are making your own costume, use nylon or polyester materials, which are flame-retardant.
- •Make sure wigs and beards don't cover your kids' eyes, noses, or mouths.
- •Kids shouldn't wear masks they can make it difficult for them to see and breathe. Instead, use nontoxic face paint or makeup. Have younger kids draw pictures of what they want to look like. Older kids will have fun putting the makeup on themselves. Test the face paint or makeup on your child's arm or hand before applying to make sure the paint doesn't irritate the skin.
- •Avoid colored or decorative contact lenses, unless they have been prescribed by an eye doctor for your child.
- •Put a nametag with your phone number on your children's costumes.
- •Avoid oversized and high-heeled shoes that could cause kids to trip. Make sure the rest of the costume fits well, too, which can help prevent trips and falls.
