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# From the Superintendent

Dear Eden Families,

This is an exciting time for Eden Schools! On January 7<sup>th</sup>, we officially kicked off our proposed capital project-*Eden CSD 2020*, with a planning session. Approximately 120 people, representing various constituencies, were invited to participate in this planning phase. Campus Construction Management Group and Young & Wright Architects have been contracted to work with us throughout the entire project. The District is excited to be working with them. Their experience, expertise and problem solving skills are just what we need in order to recommend the right project for our students.

In order to meet our goal of bringing you a Referendum in December of 2015, three subcommittees were formed. These committees will explore ideas and issues within the areas of Health, Safety, Security, Infrastructure, Technology, Building Condition, Site Work, Academic Organization and Athletics/Physical Education. They will then present their findings to the Facility Advisory Committee and Board of Education.

Two of the first findings, which were presented to the Board of Education, are (1) whether to keep GLP or sell/lease it; and (2) whether to create a Middle School with grades 6-8. The Academic Organization Committee presented their findings at the February 11 Board of Education meeting. This was also the night that the other two sub-committees met for the first time.

I encourage you to let us hear your voice regarding this project. We want to know your thoughts! Feel free to join us at any of the upcoming Board meetings and committee meetings. You can also find our updates on our website, www.edencsd.org→ About Us→ Capital Project. Enjoy the weather!

# Eden Model UN Team Competes in Chicago

Over the weekend of December 11<sup>th</sup> through the 14<sup>th</sup>, the Eden Jr./Sr. High School Model United Nations Team traveled to Chicago to compete in the Chicago International High School Model United Nations conference or CIMUN. At this conference, students represented delegations from countries around the world in various United Nations committees.

Before the conference, the team researched their assigned country's history, current issues, policies and leaders. They then used this research to write papers stating their country's position on topics that have been assigned for debate during the conference.

During the conference, the delegations were challenged to solve some of the world's most pressing issues while practicing diplomacy, cooperation and consensus building. The students were judged on these categories and on their knowledge of their country's policies, their ability to give dynamic speeches and their knowledge and use of committee rules and motions.

Finally, the students cooperatively wrote resolutions, or solutions, to the issues they were challenged with. These resolutions required a number of sponsors who wrote the resolutions, as well as obtained signatories and delegates, to support the resolutions. After achieving a hearing before the committee, the sponsors gave speeches to convince the rest of the delegations to vote for and pass their resolution.

Eden's team this year was a young team of freshmen led by their senior president, R.J. Inserra. They represented the countries of Angola and Cambodia, as well as delegates in the small cabinet committees of the European Union, Association of South East Asian Nations and the Cabinet of the People's Republic of China. Eden's novice team did well with a number of delegates getting resolutions written and passed and giving speeches before their committees.

The high point of the CIMUN conference for this team was when freshman, Eleanor Hale, received the Best Delegate award for the Cabinet of the People's Republic of China. This was a surprise win for this freshman, as she was competing with practiced juniors and seniors from other schools.

The team looks forward to participating in other competitions during the season and hopes to return to Chicago as a more experienced squad in 2015 to bring home another Best Delegate and perhaps a Best Delegation Team Award!

# Invention Convention Coming to Eden

Calling all young inventors and their families! On April 8th, the district will be hosting an Invention Convention from 6:30-7:30 pm. The event is open to students in grades K-8. The district winners will be eligible to move on to a May 4th regional competition at Medaille College.

Inventors can pick up their local registration packets at their schools. K-6 will learn more about the competition and get registration materials through their art teachers. Grades 7-8 will get their information through their science teachers. Complete guidelines and various materials can be obtained at www.wnykidsinvent.org.

Students usually spend about two months developing and preparing their inventions for the final event in May. Locally, inventors must get their packets by March 2nd, submit their form by March 10th, and submit their entry by March 25th for the April 8th event at Eden Elementary School. Entries will be judged, and up to 15 Eden finalists may be submitted for the regional convention. The event is designed to promote creative thinking and scientific encourage problem solving in K-8<sup>th</sup> grade students.

## **BOATER'S SAFETY CLASS**

The New York State Parks and Recreation Department Boaters' Safety Course meets NYS requirements for a Personal Watercraft Boating Safety Course. It is intended to provide a basic knowledge of safe and legal boating practices. This is an 8 hour instructor led workshop, which includes a textbook and a 50 question multiple choice exam, which you MUST pass. Satisfactory completion will earn you an official completion certificate and may earn you up to a 15% annual discount on your watercraft insurance. It is approved by the NASBLA and meets education requirements for states with boater education laws. Course completion is good for life and is recognized by the US Coast Guard. MUST be over 10 years of age at beginning of course.


