When you walk outdoors lately in WNY, it is difficult to miss the fact that autumn is upon us. The colors are spectacular! The weather has been better than June! All of this has contributed to a great start to our 2014-2015 school year. It is great to have the students back at school.

Of course, the change in seasons leads me down the path of winter approaching and SNOW DAYS. Last year, school districts in southern WNY averaged around eight emergency closing days-some due to blizzard conditions, but others due to severe cold. Depending on the weather predictions you tend to follow, the forecast looks the same for this winter. Knowing that this is a possibility, we have put a few new protocols into place:

A two-hour delay to the start of school. Generally speaking, the buses would pick up your student two hours later than the typical pickup time. Principals will determine the schedule of classes for the day. Details for PreK and VoTech will need to be addressed given the particular circumstances of that day. We will have school if temperatures are approaching -25 degrees Fahrenheit with winds of less than 10 mph and good visibility. Of course, our buses need to start, as well. National Weather Service guidelines indicate that a person dressed properly for the conditions can withstand these temperatures for up to 30 minutes. Please ensure that your students are dressed properly if they are waiting for a school bus or are driving themselves to school. Research shows that crossing your fingers and your toes in anticipation of better weather works. I hope this is true.

On another note, our Board of Education has adopted the 2014-2015 District Goals. Our initiatives moving forward for Eden CSD are fully aligned to these goals. As always, we appreciate your thoughts and feedback.

- Increase academic rigor and raise expectations for all Eden students.
- Effectively implement the common Core State Standards.
- Strengthen the culture of the district by building greater trust through improved communication among all school-community stakeholders.
- ♦ The Board will review and approve a three-year written plan to guide facility changes/improvements.

Eden CSD is focused on creating an academic environment that allows students an opportunity to grow and reach their highest potential, this includes our actual facilities- Eden Elementary, Transportation Department, GLP and the Junior Senior High School. It has been ten years since Eden CSD embarked on a capital project. That is a very long time. In order to assess our current physical condition, we are in the process of completing a Building Condition Survey (BCS). Do we have leaks? Is our foundation secure? Do we have the electrical capacity to offer exemplary programs for our students? This BCS is one tool which will be utilized by a School-District Capital Project committee to make recommendations to the Board of Education regarding a future capital project (District Goal #4). In addition, we need to assess what else we need in a capital project to ensure that our students are safe, secure, and on the cutting edge of technology and instruction. In other words, what should Eden CSD look like 5 years, 10 years and perhaps 15 years from now? Stay tuned for more information regarding a potential capital project. These are exciting times to be a Raider.

The Eden School Community is a gift. I look forward to working with you toward the same goal - improving learning for all of our children.

The driver of a vehicle upon a public highway, street or private road upon meeting or overtaking from either direction any school bus marked and equipped as provided in subdivision 20 of section 375 of this chapter, which has stopped on the public highway, street or private road for the purpose of receiving or discharging passengers, or which has stopped because a school bus in front of it has stopped to receive or discharge any passengers, shall stop the vehicle before reaching such school bus when there is in operation on said school bus a red visual signal as specified in subdivision 20 of section 375 of this chapter and said driver shall not proceed until such school bus resumes motion, or until signaled by the driver or a police officer to proceed. For the purposes of this section, and in addition to the provisions of section 134 of this chapter, the term "public highway" shall mean any area used for the parking of motor vehicles or used as a driveway located on the grounds of a school or of a board of cooperative educational services facility or any area used as a means of access to and egress from such school or facility.

If approved by the Board, eligible veterans would have their applicable exemption(s) applied to their total assessed value, which would result in a tax savings to Veterans. That difference will be added to the tax bills of the rest of the taxpayers. The exemption value and resulting savings will vary depending on the nature of a veteran's military service.

Be advised that this is a non-binding advisory proposition. The Board of Education of the Eden Central School District is not bound by the adoption or rejection of this proposition, and the Board of Education is solely responsible for determining whether, and to what extent, the District may adopt the exemption set forth herein
