Dear Eden Families,






Seniors Sign Letters of Intent




What's On Your Summer Reading List? Try these!




Gorgeous by Paul Rudnick



The end of the 2012-2013 school year brings six retirements with it. Retiring this year are Elementary Teacher, Rose Nowak; Jr./Sr. High School Librarian, George Kibler; High School Technology Teachers, Ronald Uhlman and Richard Brechtel; Jr./Sr. High School Secretary, Dottie Bauer; and Eden Elementary Principal, Richard Schaefer.

Rosemary Nowak started teaching in Eden in 1990. She grew up and attended college in Ohio, taught a year in San Antonio, Texas, then moved to Western New York with her husband, where she taught in various Catholic Schools until being hired to teach in Eden. She was originally hired to teach Sixth Grade Science. In 1990, the student population was increasing, so there was a need for an additional sixth grade teacher who had an interest in teaching Science. She was hired to fill that position and started out teaching five sections of Science. A couple of years later, she was asked to teach a section of ELA, along with the Science, and in subsequent years as class sizes have changed, she has also taught Social Studies and Math.



Mrs. Nowak received two Teacher Appreciation Awards from the ETA; One in the mid-nineties, and another last year for her participation as the Eden Representative for the Teacher Center.

Her fondest memories from her time at Eden include the many wonderful friends she has made, and the great students she has had who taught her how to laugh with them and laugh at herself. The kids kept her young at heart!... Hatching dozens of chickens and launching thousands of rockets, chaperoning class trips to places like the Whale Watch at Plymouth, Massachusetts, live theater in Toronto to see The Lion King, getting soaking wet on the Hurricane Deck during the Niagara Falls Experience, the end of the year Faculty Parties at Judy Maynard's House. Those parties signaled the official beginning of summer vacation. In addition, she has really loved serving as Eden's Representative on The Teacher Center Policy Board for the last 13 years.

The most valuable were the changes on the education side – typing tutors, word processing, reading, spelling, and math software, the Internet, iDevices, and electronic books.

Mr. Kibler is a member of Phi Beta Mu, an honorary library society. Some of his most memorable moments involved the seventh graders – new school, new teachers. As he grew weary of putting a "Library Closed for Lunch" sign up, he made a new one that said "Library Closed - Gone Fishing", which prompted a seventh grader to go to the office and ask Miss Menkiena, "Can he do that?"

Mr. & Mrs. Kibler are looking forward to traveling throughout the United States, including Alaska and Hawaii, with emphasis on the National Parks, where they plan to do some hiking, kayaking, and photography. They hope to spend more time with their two daughters, sons-in-law and five grandchildren. He also intends to complete restoration of his 1960 Corvette, and he looks forward to having more time to play guitar. Mr. Kibler will most remember the people - faculty, students, and staff - who make Eden the best school district!

Eden Central School has been a large part of Ronald Uhlman's life since he was a third grader at GLP and a member of the first graduating class from the existing high school. After graduating from Alfred Ag. & Tech., and working in the Syracuse area, Ron enrolled in Buffalo State College to earn a Bachelor's Degree in Industrial Arts. In the fall of 1980, he returned to Eden to embark on his 33 year teaching career. Mr. Uhlman earned a Master's Degree in Industrial Arts, as well as certifications in Occupational Math, Driver Education and School District Administration. taught more than 18 different technology courses over the years, driver education since 1978, and he belongs to several professional organizations. In addition, he was the Embers Yearbook advisor for many years, the ETA treasurer, building representative, President and Vice President of the Western New York Technology Education Association for nine years and a New York State Teacher's Retirement System delegate. In 1989, Mr. Uhlman was honored as the NYS Technology Education Teacher of the Year. He has also been honored with a NYSUT Leadership Award.

Retirement will afford him the time to boat, ski, paint, teach driver education, remodel and do yard work. He will enjoy his cottage property, as well as family and friends.



After graduating from college in 1979, Richard Brechtel started his teaching career at Starpoint. Teaching over 25 technology related courses during his 33 year career, Mr. Brechtel has enjoyed every minute. He has been a vital part of Eden Athletics as the boys and girls tennis coach, and he feels that he has learned a lot from the students, as well as other coaches both on and off the court.
