## Budget Message

## Loraine Ingrasci, Interim Director of Finance

#### 2013-14 BUDGET DEVELOPMENT MESSAGE:

The 2013-14 budget was adopted on April 23, 2013 in the amount of \$25,720,426, which represents a 2.1% increase over the current year's budget. The Board of Education, along with the administrators, faculty and staff began work on the 2013-14 school budget in early winter of 2013 facing the challenges of increased contractual expenditures and decreasing State Aid. The initial gap between revenues and expenses was \$1,691,041. Eden Central School District did receive an increase in State Aid of \$231,801, which was applied to reduce this gap.

The proposed budget includes the following reductions/cost containments: one administrative position; five Jr./Sr. High teachers; the 5 p.m. bus run; the Gifted and Talented program in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade; a 5% reduction in the athletic budget, 10% reduction in materials and supplies; 5% reduction in non-mandated music; restructuring the department chair structure; and a proposed change in health insurance.

The Board maintains the tax levy below the state required two percent tax cap. Final tax rates will be adopted in August 2013, after all information from the State and assessor is received. Your continued support of the Eden Central School District is appreciated. Thank you.

## **PROPOSITION NO. 1 (ANNUAL BUDGET)**

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to wit:

RESOLVED, that the budget for the Eden Central School District, Erie County, New York, for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2013 and ending June 30, 2014, as proposed by the Board of Education in the total sum of \$25,720,426, is hereby approved and adopted and the required funds therefore are hereby appropriated and the necessary real property taxes required shall be raised by a tax on the taxable property in the District to be levied and collected as required by law.

## **PROPOSITION NO. 2 (REPAIRS TO CO-GENERATION PLANT)**

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to wit:

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education ("Board") of the Eden Central School District ("District") is hereby authorized to expend from the District's Repair Reserve Fund, established on February 10, 2010 and funded by voter approval on May 18, 2010, an amount not to exceed \$32,000 for the purpose of purchasing and installing a new catalytic converter for the co-generation plant as required by Environmental Protection Agency regulations, with such co-generation plant providing electricity to District facilities and with the result that such expenditure from the 2010 Repair Reserve Fund shall have no impact on the tax levy of the District for the 2013-2014 school year.



You may request an application by calling 992-3629 or writing the District Clerk at 3150 Schoolview Road, Eden, New York 14057 no later than Tuesday, May 14, 2013.

The completed application must be returned and received by the District Clerk. If approved, an official ballot will be mailed to the applicant.

If desired, an application may be completed in the office of the District Clerk no later than 3:30 p.m., Monday, May 20, 2013. The application will be reviewed for eligibility and, if approved, an official ballot will be provided to the voter at that time. It is recommended that the Clerk's office be called at 992-3629 to assure that the Clerk is available at the time of the anticipated visit.

A ballot may only be counted if received by the Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of the vote, Tuesday, May 21, 2013.



#### From the Board President

Although our warm weather came slowly this spring, our activities at school are anything but slow. Musicals, concerts and spring sports teams have kept everyone busy. This spring marked the arrival of Sandy Anzalone, our new Superintendent of Schools. She has wasted no time getting to know students, parents, staff and community leaders and is already having a positive impact in our district. You will see her at many school events. Please take a moment to say hello and welcome Sandy to Eden.

The School Board has been focused on next year's budget. We developed a number of activities designed to gather input. On Saturday, March 23<sup>rd</sup>, we hosted a community forum at the high school to share budget updates and gather input and suggestions on how to deal with our budget gap. Attendees chose the group they were most interested in (sports, music, etc.) and brainstormed ways to reduce costs and generate revenue. This forum generated some great ideas from our community and helped the board better understand the needs of our district. Thank you to all who participated in this event. In an effort to listen to concerns of faculty and staff directly, the Board set aside time at each school to meet with anyone who wanted to talk to us about the budget. These meetings were also productive and helpful. Finally, an online budget survey was posted to gather input. We had a significant response from the survey and appreciate the input received.

The Board recently approved a budget for the 2013/14 school year. It adheres to the 2% tax cap, which is consistent with last year's spending plan and with state law. Unfortunately, our expenses are rising considerably in the area of negotiated salary, benefits and pension costs. The Board proposed two ideas that would close our budget gap and maintain current staff. The first was a one year salary freeze proposed to the Eden Teachers Association union. This proposal was rejected. The participants of the Budget Forum and online survey encouraged the Board to find other unique solutions. A second proposal was made to switch health care coverage for all employees to NY44, a BOCES developed health insurance cooperative that many schools are using. This plan, as we understand it, would lower the cost to employees and the District while providing better coverage for all. None of the Unions accepted this proposal.

So, although our spending plan was approved by the Board and will be submitted to the taxpayers, it was dependent upon the acceptance of one of these proposals. We will need to adjust our plans accordingly, being conscientious about what our students need, while being responsible to our taxpayers.
