

From the Superintendent





It is hard to believe that it is already December of the 2012-2013 school year. We have seen Thanksgiving come and go, as well as several concerts, first quarter report cards, and the fall sports season. Even though the weather has been very good, we all know that winter is just around the corner.

Congratulations to all of our Fall athletic teams for another great year.

The future will continue to bring some of the most challenging times we have ever seen. The State continues to move forward with very aggressive changes to the academic and assessment requirements, while we anticipate continued reductions in State aid with little mandate relief.

In addition, we will again deal with the tax levy cap enacted by the Legislators last year. The present year's budget is extremely tight, allowing for little adjustment or possible reductions in the future without reductions in programs or services.

The academic and assessment reform agenda being put in place by New York State is and will continue creating challenges and a great need for change. Please make every attempt to follow the movement. Even though we face many challenges this year and in the future, please know that all of us – the Administration, Faculty and Staff – are doing our very best for each and every student. four days in NYC and was able to fly home safely and on time despite hurricane Sandy.

The exchange with partner school "Gymnasium an Stenner" in Iserlohn, Germany is facilitated by the German and American governments through the German American Partnership Program (GAPP). The program provides logistical and a little financial support. We Americans hope to visit Iserlohn, Germany in July 2013.

The students were involved in many wonderful activities with their families, and the Eden Jr./Sr. High School organized a great deal of events and excursions, too: A "Welcome" pot luck dinner, a field trip to the Darwin Martin House and

Roosevelt Inaugural Site, a field trip to Niagara Falls, a visit to Zittel's farm, a tour of the Kazoo Factory, and a field trip to German historic sites

in Buffalo.


